IDENTIFIED THE BODY.
Man Found Drowned at Windsor Was Hiram McCarthy, a Machinist of Toronto.

A body in the morgue of Trinity Medical College was identified as Hiram McCarthy by Mrs. McCarthy of 8 Regent-avenue, 40 years of age. The body was found in the St. Clair River at Windsor two weeks ago and was placed in the morgue there and mentioned in the discovery made in the Toronto papers. Mrs. McCarthy thought the man might be her husband and wrote the Windsor authorities, but they did not think the deceased answered the description and the body was sent on to Trinity College.

Friends of the deceased yesterday endeavored to secure the body for burial, but they met with opposition in the shape of \$50.00 charges when they saw Mr. Milford, inspector of anatomy for the college. The inspector stated that the body was made up of a fee of \$20 for the trouble taken by the Inspector of Anatomy, and \$30.00 for express charges, Windsor to Toronto; cartage from station to Medical College, \$4, and expenses of the Medical College for taking care of the body, \$10.

These friends of the deceased went up to see Deputy Attorney-General Cartwright last evening, with the result that the body will be handed over as the anatomy act provides. The department will see that no improper charges are made, but Mr. Cartwright, when spoken to last night, would express no opinion as to whether the charges were excessive or not, having only heard one side of the story.

HOT TIME AT THE COUNCIL.

This Time It is the Mayor and Ald. Lamb Who Get into a Wrangle Over the Mayor's Rights

TO CALL DIFFERENT MEETINGS

Things Got So Bad That Several Aldermen Left the Chamber and Broke Up the Quorum.

The first meeting of the City Council within the holiday season was held yesterday afternoon. It marked the high water record of disorderliness of the year. When Council had been called to order, Ald. Graham referred to the letters which had passed between himself and the City Engineer in connection with the Dovers-court-road pavement. He had examined the blocks and the posts himself, and found a considerable number of the former bad and some of the latter short. Every word of his letter, already published, was true, and every statement correct. He blamed the Engineer's Department, which, he said, did not exercise sufficient care over works of this kind. He then continued: "Of my own self, but only in the case of this street, but others also, I have late complaints before the Engineer's Department, and little improvement was made after the complaints had been laid. I may instance one case, that of Elm-grove-ave. But I think that when the Engineer has taken money out of the treasury fund that I cannot say whether this was charged against the local improvements or not, the policy of the Engineer's Department is not right."

No Use in Complaining.

There is little use of making complaints, and all I can do is to continue endeavoring to find a proper remedy by exposing them and showing them up. I have taken this ground in the present case and will continue until a remedy is brought about.

Read When Out.

Ald. Graham said Ald. Graham had asked him to examine the pavement. The blocks were, many of them, too small, and the road dead, that is to say dead before it had been cut.

Official Estimate of Present and Future Production of Rossland Camp.

TWELVE HUNDRED MEN AT WORK

Population of 8000 Now - Brief Statement Regarding Each Mine

War Eagle, Centre Star, Etc.

The mines of Rossland, at the present time, are giving employment to about 1200 men (night-hour shifts) at an average wage of nearly \$100 per month, and the shipments of ore are averaging over 5000 tons per week, of an average price of \$15.00 per ton, at an average profit, clear of all expenses, including development, of \$5.00 per ton.

By Dec. 31 it is conservatively estimated that about 2500 men will be employed in the mines of Rossland, and the average shipments will be close to, if they do not exceed, 14,000 tons per week, which at the rate of over 700,000 tons per year, worth about \$10,000,000—more than the total mineral production of the whole province for 1899.

The present population of Rossland is about 8000, and is rapidly increasing. Building is moving at this year than at any time since 1887.

The above paragraphs are from a statement issued by the Rossland Board of Trade in answer to enquiries from outside.

The output of the Rossland camp by months since Jan. 1, 1900, has been as follows:

Of this total the Le Roi contributed 28,225 tons, which 22,000 tons were shipped in May and June. The War Eagle and Centre Star have shipped no ore since the second week in February, when their total shipments were 40,000 and 70,000 tons respectively.

The mine suspended shipments early in March, having 1455 tons in its credit. The Le Roi has shipped regularly each month, its output to June 20 being 27,000 tons.

The output for the six months of 1900 would have been very much larger but for the threatened labor troubles which, however, amicably adjusted after a shutdown extending from the second week of February into April.

The War Eagle and Centre Star have been unable to resume shipments owing to the non-arrival of machinery needed for the proper development of these mines and the economical handling of the ore from the workings to the cars on the railway.

What the outlook for the remaining six months of 1900 is can best be told in the following brief statements, obtained from the managers of the principal mines:

Le Roi mine.—It is believed that by October 20 the new plant will be in full working and all mine shipments will be resumed. The production from the mine will then approximate 1000 tons per day.

This mine has already paid its shareholders dividends of \$1,125,000.

Le Roi No. 2.—Will shortly be producing 800 tons of ore a day. Includes Great Western mine.

Le Roi No. 3.—Will shortly produce 150 tons of ore a day. Includes Great Western mine.

Le Roi No. 4.—Will shortly produce from 250 to 750 tons a day. Includes Columbia mine.

War Eagle.—Work on the War Eagle, which is at present confined to sinking the main working shaft, and raising the levels, is progressing most satisfactorily. The shaft has reached a depth of approximately 300 feet, or 175 feet below the shaft level, the lowest level so far worked.

At the 375-foot point a station has been cut out for the seventh level, and cross-cutting north and south is being proceeded with to reach the ore bodies. The vein and open them up by levels. Within a short time the shaft will have reached a depth of 1000 feet when the shaft will be cut out for the eighth level and a like plan of development pursued.

The output to be shipped from this mine has not yet been definitely fixed, but it will probably be at the rate of 100,000 tons per year, which together with the shipments from her sister property, the War Eagle, will make an estimated aggregate of about 150,000 tons per year.

The Iron Mask.—The Iron Mask has been closed down for the present, for an examination by the expert by the Rossland Board of Trade. Their examination only lasted a few days. The work which they then advise will be proceeded with at once, and as soon as that is finished, or as soon as the trial is concluded, will be some time in September, the mine will resume shipments. The output will be from 60 to 100 tons per day.

Evening Star.—The Evening Star mine recently passed into the control of George B. McLean of the Cariboo mine at Camp McKinnon. Since then the work of opening it up in a thorough workmanlike manner is being proceeded with, and one bunkers with a capacity of 200 tons are being erected. The mine is expected to be a steady producer from now on.
