ANOTHER DEATH RECALLS ABEL LINCOLN'S MURDER

William Withers, Who Led Orchestra of Ford's Theatre the Fatal Night, Passes Away.

New York, Aug. 2.—William S. Withers of Wakefield, N.Y., who led the orchestra of Ford's Theatre in Washington the night of April 14, 1865, when President Lincoln was shot, is dead at the age of seventy. Withers Booth stabbed him after leaping from the president's box to the stage and a detective arrested him. In the confusion of the moment many in the theatre believed Withers fired the shot that killed Lincoln. Hundreds screamed "Kill him, shoot him," and he was dragged out of the angry mob to the stage just in time to save him from being badly hurt.

IRON AND STEEL IN CANADA.

The American Iron and Steel Association has for some years collected statistics of iron and steel manufacture in Canada, as well as in the United States. The figures for the production of pig iron have been published heretofore; those for steel in castings and finished products are now given.

The total production of steel ingots and castings in Canada in 1904 was 148,784 tons, against 138,141 tons in 1903, a decrease of 7,643 tons. Bessemer and open-hearth steel ingots and castings were made in each year. Altogether the open-hearth steel reported in 1904 and 1903 was 12,000 tons, against 12,000 tons in 1903. The figures for 1904 are subject to revision, but are substantially correct.
