Directions for Halifax Harbour, taken from the printed Directions in the Custom-House at Halifax.

SAMBRO island and light house is in latitude 44 deg. 30 min. N. and longitude 63 deg. 32 min. W.

From the westward, bring the light to bear N. E. ; if it bears more easterly, stretch to the southward till it bears N. E. and as much more northerly as you please, there being no shoal or ledge to the southward ; then keep it open on your larboard bow ; give it more than a mile and a half birth, as much more as you please.

Note.—The western ledges lie from the light S. W. distant two mile, the other W. S. W. about one league ; the eastern ledges lie in a range nearly, some above water ; the outermost one mile and a half from the light, bearing from it E. N. E.

When the light bears north, distant about 2 miles, run N. E. 4 miles, then north will carry you to Chedabucto Head, at a proper distance clear of all danger.

When a-breast of Chedabucto Head, run N. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. for the south point of George's island.

When within $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile of George's island, you may enter the harbour west of it in 12 fathoms, or east of it in 15.

In passing between Sandwich point and Meager's beach, run nearest the point, to shun a shoal which runs off S. W. from the beach.

There is also a shoal lying one mile south of Sandwich point.

Coming from the eastward, run for the light, and you cannot fail seeing Chedabucto Head as you open Halifax harbour ; the light being 6 miles distant from the Head to the S. W.

Signals made at Fort George when Vessels are coming into Harbour.

One ball close for one square-rigged vessel

One ball half hoisted, for two do.

Two balls close, for three do.

Two balls separated, for four do.

A pendant of any colour, for five do.

A do under a ball, for six do.

A do over a do half hoisted for 7 do.

A do under 2 do close, for 8 do.

A do between 2 do separated, for 9 do.

A flag of any colour, for 10 or more do.

[The above are hoisted at the east or west yard-arm, according to the quarter the vessel first appears in, with the addition of a ball at the centre of the yard until the vessels can be seen, when one or more of the following descriptive colours will be hoisted at the mast head.]

An Union for a Flag-Ship, with or without a Squadron.

Do. with a Red Pendant over it, for a Two-decker.

Do. with a blue Pendant over it for a Frigate.

Do. with a white Pendant over it, for a small armed Vessel.

A red Flag pierced white for a Packet.

A blue Pendant for a Merchant Ship.

A red Pendant for a Merchant Brig.

A white Pendant for a Topsail Schooner or Stoop.

A blue and white Flag horizontally divided Neutral Fleet

White-and-blue Pendant, Neutral Man of War

Blue Flag, Neutral Merchant Ship

A red, white and blue Flag, an Enemy's Fleet

A red, white and blue Pendant, an Enemy's Man of War

A red Flag, an Enemy's Merchantman

An Union Jack over Neutral or Enemy's Signals, Vessel is detained or prize

- A white Flag over any Signal, Vessel bears a Flag of Truce.

The above signals are worn at the main. Upon a vessel arriving in sight from the Light House so wearing her signal, a similar one is hoisted on the Telegraph Staff, or at the yard arm of the Signal Staff at Fort George, with a Pendant under it, descriptive of the class of vessels she belongs to.

TO TRAVELLERS;

For the information of Travellers between Windsor and Parrsborough, &c.

THE Parrsborough Packet sails regularly between Windsor and Parrsborough every week, from the 1st April to Christmas, viz. leaves Parrsborough on Monday, wind and weather permitting so as to be at Windsor on Tuesday; and will sail from thence the first high water that happens at or after eight o'clock in the morning of that day: the Packet frequently goes twice or three times a week, when business requires it.

Time of going t'rough the Falls.

THE Falls are level (or still water) about three hours and a half on the Flood, and about two hours and an half on the ebb, which makes it passable four times in 24 hours, about 10 or 15 minutes each time.—No other rule can be given, as much depends on the floods in the River St. John, and the time of high water of full sea, which is often hastened by winds, and in the proportion to the height of them.

ECLIPSES FOR THE YEAR 1819.

There will be four Eclipses of the Luminaries in the Year 1819,—viz. two of the Sun,—and two of the Moon, in the following order: The first will be of the MOON, April 10th, 8h. 51m. in the morning, invisible. 2d,—The second of the SUN, April 24th, in the morning, partial and visible, as follows: Beginning at 5 hours 55 minutes; greatest Observation 6h. 45m.; End 7h. 26m.—Digits eclipsed 5 2-10 from the Sun's Northern limb. 3d,—The third will be of the Sun, Sept. 19th, at 8h. 38m. in the morning, invisible. 4th,—The fourth and last, will be of the Moon, October 3d, at 11h. 8m. in the morning invisible, ☉ will be morning Star until October 9th, thence Evening Star throughout the Year.

☉ Conjunction, or planets situate in the same longitude. When a planet is in conjunction with the sun, or any other planet, they pass the meridian at nearly the same instant ☐ signifies planets situate quarter of a circle, or 90 deg. distant; when a planet is ☐, or 90 deg. distant from the sun; if East from the sun, it will pass the meridian at 6 o'clk. in the evening, if West, at 6 o'clk. in the morning. ☉ This mark denotes Opposition of planets, or when they are half a circle distant; when the Moon is full orb'd she is in ☉ to the sun, and all planets when in ☉ to the sun, pass the meridian at midnight. Perigee signifies, when the moon or any planet is in that part of their orbit which is nearest to the Earth. Apogee, denotes a planet to be in that part of its orbit which is most remote from the Earth—N. B. the ☽ when in her Perigee and Apogee, has a most visible influence on the Tides, the former having a tendency to elevate, the latter to depress them more than their usual height.
