MATHEMATICS.

JUNIORS.—Euclid, first six Books; Plane Trigonometry, Hind's and Wood's Algebra, Daily and Weekly Exercises.

SENIORS.—Euclid, XI. Book, 1—21, 33; XII. Book, 1—2; Algebra and Algebraic Geometry: Plane and Spherical Trigonometry, (Snowball) with application to Geodetical and Astronomical problems; Conic Sections, (Whewell); Differential and Integral Calculus. Daily and numerous exercises on the different subjects of the course.

NATURAL PHILOSOPHY.

JUNIORS.—Statics, (Earnshaw); Dynamics, (Earnshaw); Examinations on Draper's Natural Philosophy. Numerous exercises in Statics and Dynamics. Essays on different subjects in Natural Philosophy.

SENIORS.—Lectures on Properties of Matter, Statics, Dynamics, Hydrostatics, Hydrodynamics, Pneumatics, Steam and the Steam Engine.—Optics, (Griffin).—II. and III. Sections of Newton's Principia, (Whewell), Differential and Integral Calculus. Numerous Exercises, Essays and Examinations on the subjects of the course.

MORAL PHILOSOPHY AND LOGIC.

One hour for Lecture; the other hour of the day was devoted to examination on the Lecture previously heard, and to the reading of Essays. The Students were required to write

an Essay each week, which was read and criticised in the class.

FACULTY OF THEOLOGY.

A daily Lecture each morning; an hour in the afternoon for Examination and Essays.

ORIENTAL LANGUAGES.

HEBREW—Junior Class.—Grammar. Read from Genesis, Exodus and Psalms. Written translations from English into Hebrew.

Senior Class—Revised the Grammar. Read from Pentateuch, Psalms, Job, Isaiah, and Haggai. Written translations from English into Hebrew.

CHALDEE.

Rigg's Manual. Read from Daniel and Ezra.

BIBLICAL CRITICISM.

Read from Gospel according to John, and First Epistle of Peter, in the original. Lectures, Examinations in Horne's Jewish Antiquities; Essays from the Students.

CHURCH HISTORY.

First six centuries; Lectures; Examinations on Mosheim's Ecclesiastical History. Essays from the Students.

MATHEMATICS AND NATURAL PHILOSOPHY.

First Year, as in College Announcement.

Second Year—Studies of last Session, with Euclid XI, Definitions; Propositions 1—21; 33, Arithmetical, Geometrical and Harmonical Progressions in Algebra, (Wood or Hind.)

Third Year—Hyperbola, (Whewell's Conic Sections). First six chapters of Herschell's Astronomy; with the subjects generally of previous years.

THEOLOGY.

SENIOR STUDENTS.—Hebrew—Psalms, 58—62; Hebrew

Grammar, first 88 pages. Horne's Jewish Antiquities, Part III, Chap. I. Epistle of Jude in the original.

JUNIOR STUDENTS.—1, Warburton's Divine Legation of Moses; 2, Howe's Living Temple; or 3, Edwards' History of Redemption and Edwards' God's last end in the creation of the world; or 4, Boston's Fourfold State and Boston in the Covenants.

THE Nineteenth Session of Queen's College will begin on the first Wednesday of October (3rd October), 1860, at which date all Intrans and regular Students in the Faculty of Arts are required to be present.

The Divinity Classes will be opened on the first Wednesday in November. Candidates for matriculation as regular Students of the first year will undergo an examination before the College Senate in the first three books of the *Aeneid* of Virgil; the first three books of Caesar's Commentaries; Mair's Introduction; the Greek Grammar; the first book of Euclid; and Arithmetic, as far as Vulgar and Decimal Fractions, and the Extraction of Roots, inclusive.

The only charges are £1 for Matriculation Fee; £2 for each class per session, to be paid on admission to the classes; and £1 additional in the Natural Philosophy Class, for Expenses of Apparatus.

Each Student on entering must produce a certificate of Moral and Religious Character from the Minister of the Congregation to which he belongs.

Intrans becoming candidates for Scholarships, will be required, in addition to the ordinary Matriculation Examinations, to undergo an examination on the Greek Grammar and the first ten chapters of the Gospel of John. For Students of previous years the subjects of examinations for Scholarships will be those prescribed at the close of the session.

THE PREPARATORY DEPARTMENT, or College School, will be conducted as usual, under the charge of competent Masters.

All Fees payable quarterly in advance. A reduction of 25 per cent. is made on the tuition fees of parents sending more than one scholar.
