

Kirk=Session Report.

The Kirk-Session respectfully report as follows to the congregation: The Sabbath services have been regularly conducted and increasingly well attended during the year.

The Prayer Meeting on Wednesday evening has also been regularly held, and the attendance has been very encouraging. There is still, however, many households which are not represented at it.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was celebrated four times during the year and the attendance at each celebration was very gratifying.

The Sacrament of Baptism was administered to 28 children and 1 adult.

In the Church records 9 marriages have been registered and 23 deaths.

During the year 56 persons have been enrolled as communicants; 25 on profession of faith and 31 on presentation of disjunction certificate. Death and removal, however, have taken from the roll 22 names; 9 by death and 13 by certificate. The total number of communicants is now 513. Those who died were Mrs. Tweed, Mrs. Clark, Mrs. Fisher, Mrs. Beatty, Miss Henrietta Macpherson, Mrs. J. R. Smeaton, Mrs. Mary Murray, and Dr. Williamson—all most devoted members—and Mrs. Bushel who was for years a great invalid.

The Kirk-Session have placed on record the following tribute to Dr. Williamson:---

The Kirk-Session desires to place on record their profound grief and sense of bereavement occasioned by the death of the Rev. Dr. Williamson, for over fifty years a member of St Andrew's. They recall with thankfulness the signal services which he rendered to the Church at critical times in its history by his stedfastness of purpose, wise counsel, and christian bearing; his outstanding generosity in every season of financial depression, and in every undertaking necessitating large expenditure, and notably in the erection of the present Church, and his liberality at all times in support of the public ordinances and the various departments of congregational work. Above all, they return thanks to God for a life so useful, esteemed, beloved, so beautifully christian, spared to them for so many years, to be a

tower of strength and an example to old and young, of all that is true and honest and just and pure and lovely and of good report, and for a fragrant memory that will never die in St. Andrew's Church.

The Session have received intimation that by the will of the late Dr. Williamson \$100 has been left to the Church, and that the late Mrs. Murray has bequeathed \$600 and made St. Andrew's her residuary legatee. The estate, however, is not so large as was anticipated and the whole amount to come to St. Andrew's will probably not be much over \$500.

The report of the Poor Fund, which consists of the collections at Communion, and is administered by the Women's Home Association, has been examined, and the Session is satisfied that these monies are carefully and wisely expended.

The Session gratefully recognizes the voluntary services of the choir. It was with much regret that they found themselves in spring deprived of Mr. Charles Harvey's much appreciated voice, and now they are sorry to learn that Mr. Galloway, who has been a strength to the choir for two years, is also soon to leave. Both these gentlemen, who all along gave their valuable services gratuitously, a kindness of which the Session is very conscious, were appointed to salaried positions in other churches. May prosperity attend them.

Thankful to God for all His goodness continually passing before us, and ascribing to His holy name all praise and glory, the Kirk-Session would earnestly pray Him to bless abundantly the people of His pasture and the sheep of His land.

Again we take pleasure in presenting the annual report of the school. The year 1895, like its predecessors, was full of changes, disapointments and encouragement. It has been, however, a year of faithfulness on the part of all members, and we trust good seed has been sown in the youthful minds of our church. The are 39 teachers and officers on the roll; 187 scholars in the main room, 33 in the Bible Class and 72 in the Infant Class, making a total of 331.

We have pleasure in stating that the following scholars have been successful in obtaining the session prizes:—Annie M. Hiscock, Marjory S. Lowe, Nelly Allen, Eleanor Mercer, May Hiscock, for repeating the Mothers' Cathechism. Constance M. Lowe, Amy Spankie, Annie McLeod, Louisa Thompson, Bel Craig, Alice Linton, Gertie Haffner, Emily Lowe, William Hiscock, Stewart Dobbs, Bella Lowe, Flora King, the shorter Cathechism, and Edith Lowe, the Paraphrases.

Three scholars have joined the church during the year.

Average number of scholars attending Divine Worship 57.

On Jan. 27th, the Rev. Fraser Campbell of Central India addressed the school on his very interesting work as a missionary, and on March 10th, Mr. Potter, the Welland Canal or Sailor's Missionary, gave a very interesting account of his work amongst the sailors of our great lakes during the year which had just closed. The special collections taken up by the school realized for the Building Fund \$27.24, and for Home Missions \$14.44, in addition to this the sum of \$10.00 was granted Mr. Potter in aid of the Sailor's Mission.

It is to be regretted that the special collection asked from the congregation on the first Sabbath in May was not responded to, in consequence of which there are no additions to the library to report this year.

Since our last report was presented Mr. T. R. Taylor, librarian, has left the city to reside in Minneapolis, and Messrs. Mason, Fisher, and Bannister have retired from the teaching staff, and we add to our list of teachers Misses Fraser, Clark, M. Minnes, Connors, and Massie.

Miss Cameron having completed her studies at Toronto has returned and been welcomed to her old class as teacher.

We are indebted to Mr. D. Volume and others who have given their valuable assistance as teachers during the temporary absence of the regular teachers. We keep in kindly remembrance also the faithful and hearty assistance extended to our school by Mrs. Darby, who from the 10th Feb. till the summer holidays was an earnest teacher and took a deep interest in the school generally.

We regret the absence through illness of Miss J. Gibson, Mrs. Parker, and Mrs. Thompson, the latter having been laid aside since April. We pray that they may soon be permitted to unite with us again in the good work.

We have to record the loss of the services of one of our most earnest teachers, Miss A. Minnes, whose marriage necessitated her removal from the city, Her services were very valuable to the school and we unite in wishing her every success in her new home.

The annual Pic-Nic and Christmas entertainment were held as usual. At the latter the faithful services of Mr. S. Shannon as organist of the school for the past eight years were in a pleasing way acknowledged, by presenting him with a purse of gold coin.

The past year, as usual, has been one of mingled shade and sunshine, yet, on the whole, we have much cause for thankfulness for numerous mercies. The average attendance has been larger, number of members and contributions increased, while the value of clothing sent to the North-West was double that of last year. Early in the year we were cheered by the presence of Mrs. Fraser Campbell, who gave an address at a union meeting in St. Andrew's Hall, on Mission work in Central India.

In the spring of the year our beloved Secretary, Mrs. Fisher, was called to eternal rest. Her absence is deeply felt by those who were always encouraged by her christian example of cheerfulness, patience, and zeal, in all departments of Church work in which she engaged.

We regret that hitherto no provision has been made for our missionaries who have returned invalided and unable to engage in other work. To this end, a Resolution was sent to the Presbyterial Society, with a request that it be transmitted to the W. F. M. Board, asking that some plan be adopted whereby adequate provision may be made for such cases.

A resolution was brought before the Auxiliary and passed, to the effect that the additional salary which is given to a married missionary be defrayed by the W. F. M. S. instead of the Foreign Mission Board, when the wife of a missionary engages actively in mission work, thus realizing a large sum for the use of the Foreign Mission Board, on the express condition that it is to be used in extending the work by opening up new stations. The resolution was forwarded to the Presbyterial Society for discussion.

Miss M. Minnes, returned missionary from Alberni, lately gave much interesting information of her work at the mission school and among the parents of the children.

Eleven meetings have been held during the year, with an average attendance of 14. 63 leaflets are taken. There are 45 members, 38 of whom are members of the general society.

A large bale valued at \$116.10 was sent to the North-West.

The collection at the monthly meetings has been discontinued. Three "Scattered Helpers" in Matawatchan collected fifteen dollars for the Society.

With the hope that greater interest would be awakened, our Annual Thankoffering Service was held in the Church on the last Sabbath of the year, instead of November as usual, when our Minister kindly gave an address and conducted the service. Four essentials of a successful missionary were given, namely: consecration, good health, adaptation, and efficient training. There were about sixty present, and the offerings amounted to \$50.

This Association respectfully reports that during the year the monthly meetings have been statedly held, and that the attendance has been on the whole satisfactory. The care of the poor entrusted by the Kirk-Session to this Association, has been faithfully attended to by Mrs. Mackie and Miss Gray. The accounts with vouchers, have been submitted to the Association and examined by auditors appointed by them, and found correct. They have further been inspected by the Kirk-Session and met their approval. They are also appended to this report. and it will be seen that after making all provision for the poor and after sustaining a loss of \$49.21 through the Bank failure there was at the close of the year a balance in bank of \$55.40.

District visitors to the number of 22 have paid monthly visits to all households belonging to the congregation, giving information about church life and work, and increasing an interest in all that is going on. They have also distributed 225 copies of the Record, giving them away freely among those who cannot purchase literature, and receiving contributions in ways most convenient for the giver, to the mission work of the church, both at home and abroad. During the year the work of the Guild has been vigorously thougn very quietly carried on. Macpherson, Miss Connor and Mr. Whinton; fifty cents from Mrs. Hickey and Mrs. Donnelly, Sr., and twenty-five cents from Miss Clark, making in all a total revenue of \$28. We have also gratefully to acknowledge gifts of clothing from the following:--Mrs. Mackie, Mrs. Minnes, Mrs. Campbell Strange, Miss Christina Harold, Miss Loui Fowler, Miss Pollie, Miss Durie, Miss Connor, Miss McIver; also pins and thread from Miss Durie; case for patterns from Mrs. T. Robinson, and needles from the Rev. J. Mackie. The Hospital Section, under the excellent Convener, Miss Hudgins, has carried on the very sacred work entrusted to it, with unwearied devotion. For eight months they had the cheerful and regular service of Mrs. Darby for the Rockwood hospital. The convener and section feel that it is only right that they should specially recognize Mrs. Darby's assistance, as she threw herself into the work so heartily, was so successful in it, and gained such a hold of the affections of the They all miss her much and hope to see her again. Mrs. inmates. Marshall of Elmhurst, has also continued to take a most lively interest in this work, often conducting the weekly meetings unaided for a long stretch of time, and with marked success to encourage her. Another most earnest visitor to Rockwood is Mrs. Mason, who often at great inconvenience, but always with great readiness, has undertaken the work, and so discharged it as to be most acceptable and helpful. The average attendance at the Bible Class is 18, but there are very many who receive a share of attention who cannot attend the class. Mrs. Marshall in writing of her work there says: "It is a quiet hour for one's self, and any one beginning would gradually find her own soul much benefited by the Lord's own word read, and the feeling of sympathy awakened, and gratitude for one's own health. At least I humbly think this would be the result. A good singer, a patient recovered most wonderfully. I was amazed and could only say what hath God wrought? We miss her very much at our meetings, and Mrs. Mason had no organ accompaniment for the hymns."

The General Hospital has also been regularly visited for the purpose of reading the Scriptures with the sick and ministering to them, both to body and soul, as the visitors feel able. The House of Industry also receives attention. The Convener has herself looked after the Hotel Dieu and the House of Providence, confining her attention of course to Protestants. She has been able to do some good work there which the Day will declare.

The Visiting Section has mainly, so far as work goes, consisted of Miss Gray. She has been indefatigable, is always warmly welcomed wherever she goes, and the work could be in no better hands.
