CHURCH SOCIETY OF THE ARCHDEACONRY OF NEW BRUSSWICK.

In conformity with the provisions of the Constitution, the "Church Society of the Archdeaconry of New Brunswick," held its general Committee Meeting on Thursday, February 8th: and its Anniversary Meeting on Friday, the 9th, in the Parish Church of Frederiscon.

On Thursday, prayers were read by the Rev. H.
Jarvis, and a Sermon preached by the Rev. Dr. Somerville. After Divine Service, the General Committee proceeded to make the annual appropriation of the funds of the Society. On Friday, prayers were read by the Rev. S. D. Lee Street, after which, the Venerable the Archdeacon delivered an Address to the Society, which will be printed in the Report. The Archdeacon, as first Vice President, took the Chair; when the Report of the appropriations of the General Committee having been read, the same were confirmed, and the following Resolutions passed:—

That an application be made to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in foreign parts, on behalf of this Society, to aid in the maintenance of one or more visiting Missionaries; and that they be made acquainted with the exertions of this Society, to provide for the wants of neglected places.

That each Local Committee of the Society be requested to firmish a list of such Sunday Schools as are now, or may be within the next three months, set on foot within their respective districts, and which they may deem worthy of assistance from the Society; and that on or about the 1st of June next, the Executive Committee of the society in their hands, and divide among them the sum appropriated to this object—alloting to each School as Share of the amount, either in money or books, as the Local Committee may desire.
