WALL-STREET SECURITIES QUIET AND LOWER.

Large Reserves of Bank of England—Higher Prices for Local Stock on Local Market—Wheat Firm and Corn Higher in Chicago—Increase in the World's

Wheat Yield.

Friday Evening, Aug. 31. The speculative markets are quiet and somewhat irregular.

Congress are 1-15 easier, closing to-day at 102 5/8 for money and account.

Canadian Pacific easier, closing in London at 69. St. Paul higher, closing at 67 3/4, and N. Y. C. at 104 3/4.

The clearings of the banks in Montreal the past week were \$9,235,409, an increase of \$6,889,178 on the corresponding week of last year.

Berthoin estimates the world's wheat crop at 2,427 million bushels, as against 2,420 million last year, an increase of 7 million. There are 315 million bushels less than 1893.

The reserve fund of the Bank of England increased \$288,687 during the week and the proportion of reserves to liabilities is causing an impression that the bank is in a position to issue 20 per cent. a year ago.

The amount of gold in the United States treasury is \$55,318,000, a small decrease.

The gross earnings of the Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Co. from the opening of navigation to August 25 were \$492,270.68, against \$365,003.61 for the same period of last year. The net earnings for July, after deducting all expenses, were \$50,920.73.

The steamer Quebec topped the list, with earnings of \$73,081.61, against \$55,369.73 for the same time last year. The company intend building two new boats for its Western lines, to be ready by next season, which will have a sleeping accommodation for 250 people each.
