The floods occurred on Sunday last. The temperature had been unusually high for the time of year. The winds were blowing from the south at early morning. Towards noon they changed to the north-east, and the temperature fell suddenly. The streams on the mountain side rapidly became torrents, converging into a gully, the foot of Mount Misery, they rose from their narrow channels and poured down upon the arable land in a resistless stream.
