What the citizens have secured by the mew legislation may be briefly summarized as follows. The number of avdermen is reduced to two for each ward, and the effort to have the mayor elected by the council: instead of by the people is defeated. The borrowing powers of the city are restricted to 15 per cent on $\$ 160,000,000$, for the next four years, and after thint to 15 per cent on the value of the taxable property only. The elty is permitted to contrinute towards the erection of an east end depot by the Canadian Pracific but is forbidden to ralse the funds necessary to do so by means of a special loan of $\$ 1,000,000$, outside of the borrowing powers already speclifed. The opening of St. Lambert Hill to the wiver and the widening of Guy. street is allowed on condition that the city pay the whole of the costi of the first, and half the cost of the second, and some important alterations in the law of exproprlation are made.
1 These enactments represent a disthuct step in the direction of better and cheaper manicipal Government. The reduction in the number of aldermen will commend litself to every citizen. It means the ellmination of so many more liangers on to the munjepal treasury ; since the first step taken by every alderman after his election is to senure pasitions in the civic employ for nis most prominent friends and supporters. The fate of these suddenly orphaned "heelers" is of course worthy of commiseration. Some of them may even be compelled to work. But the benefit +0 the honest taxpayers more than offsets this, and in dealing with munidpal matters there is no room for sentiment.

The over-riding of the clause, favored iby the Legislative Councll, placing the election of the mayor in the hands of the aldermen instead of in those of the people, is also a step in the right direction. Had the clauso remained as it stood the dominant clique at the Olts Fall would have controlled the mayoralty, and the anomaly would have been presented of the chlef citizen of Montreal Deing chosen by a few municipal pollticians instead of by the suifrages of his lellow citizens over Whose iuterests he is presumed to. watch.

The restrictions upon the borrowing powers of the city will also commend themselves to every taxpayer. For the finst four years the cityl is permit. ted to borrow to the extent of 15 per cent upon $\$ 160,000,000$, which may be taken to repressent the value of the whole of the real estate within its Dorders. After that, it can borrow to the same extent only upon the value of the actually taxable property of Montreal, and not upon that which is exempted from taxation. In addition to this it is refused authorily to raise a special loan of $\$ 1,000,000$ for the purpose of contributing towards the cost of a mew depot to wa builit by the Canadian Pacific at the cast end. It. can contrinute, if it likes-butt it must do so bout of its ordinary loans-for the Quebec Legisigature clearlẏ recognised the fact that the contribution was only intended to make cortain aldermen sure of re-election and to Turnish polltical capital for use in the mayoralty contest.
The amendments to - the law of ex. propriation are also in, the direction of Ereater sconomy. The elty will be permitted in future to tender to proprietors of expropriated properties the amount estimated as ite value. If this be relused, and the resulting award does rot exceed the value offered, the
proprictor contesting must pay the cost of all proceedings. The value of this clause in deterifing Iftigions or graspling proprictors from taking out suits, and the consequent savingi.in law costs to the city, can easily be calculated. Another important clause, too, is that permitting streets to be widened, block by block, on petition of the proprict ors; the city paying half the cost. This will prevent large corporations from blocking the widening of a whole street in order to secure better terms from the city, and will giva those who are ready to pay their share of the cost the civle improvements they need at once.

Altogether, then, the recent amendments to clvic legislation are such as will meet the approval of the taxpaymes. They are in the direction of greater economy and better municipal Government. They have been bltterly. opposed throughout hy what may be. termed the kivic "machine," buit, thanks to the firmmess and vigilance of our bankers and merchants, they have been carried triumphantly. They will strengthen the hands of the honest men in the council and help forward the ambition of all good citizens of Monts: preal to make the moturopolis the best governed, as well as the Iargest, city in the Dominion. We need more legislation of a similar character.

A TYPICAL CASE.
The case with which anj shrewd man, with a falr amount of business thact and the repuitabion of being a "hustler," can secure credit in this city -no matter whether he possesses any financial responsibillty or not-ls striklagly exemplified in the brief career of D. Lepage \& Co, who started in the dry goods and millinery trade on st. Lawerence Main street not quite two years ago, practically without a dol.
lar and who have just falled for $\$ 32,000$.

In the early part of 1802 a wholesalo millinery house became dissatisifed at the slow progress which Mr. W. B. Cralg who was conducting one of their supply accounts in thls city, was making, and as they were his only creditors they of. fered to take over the stock and pay hlm $\$ 250$ in cash to step down and out. They flxed upon Lepage, one of their employes, and a sharp hustiong salesman, to take his place, and turned the stock (which was valued at $\$ 10,000$ ) over to him for $8 t, 000$, payable in two years. Later on they also bought for him the stock of 1 . Harkins for $\$ 12$,000 at 65 cents in the dollar, also, payable in two yours. They had no securnty; and ranked oniy as ordinury creditors, except that two thirds of the amount of the lasurance on the stock was made out in their favor.
Lepage, who reglistered In Marel 180: as L. Lepage \& Co, started in to sell with a will. In fact he sold at isuch low prices that the trade wergan to speculate as to how long he would last. Gradually he ram behind, his liabilitles began to pile up, and his suppllers commenced to feel anxious. But Lepage spoke faibly, flashed his diamonds wefore their eyes, and assured every one that he was doing famously. Last June a fire broke out in hls store, and the loss was adjusted at $\$ 10,000$. Shortly alter this he called his credltors together, and in the following. September offered a composition of 50 cents in the dollar; payable in 2,4 and 6 months, which was accepted; but with the proviso that, if the whole of It was not paid, the agreement was to become vold, and the ereditors wera to rank again for the full amount of their claims. Fad the insurance money been handed over, this composition might have iben met; but it was not. One of the companles interested to the extent of \$4,000 the Phoonix of Hartford-coutested the clam on the ground of gross negligence upon the part of Lepage, and the other companies refused to pay pending $a$ settlement with them. In fuet only one of the others, the Water100 Mutual, could we relled upon to pay at all ; the balance of the insurance beIng placed with American companies across the line. In consequence Lepage was only able to meet one instahment of $\$ 1,800$ of the composition, and as his Iandlord was now commencing to make trouble about the rent, which was about $\$ 700$ behiad, it was thought better that he should mako an assign.
ment and Caldwell, Talt; \& Wilks were put in charge of tho estate. The liaiblitios are placed at $\$ 32,000$, and the principal creditors are:-D. McCall \& Co, $\$ 20,691$, A. Racine \& Co $\$ 1,731$, Llddell Lesperance \& Co, 1,473 and G. Bourgouln \& Co, $\$ 1,338$. The assets are not yet known, but it is hoped that the Lusurance money will eventually
come lnto the estate. An attempt at compromise is belng made with the Phoenilx on the basis, it is sald, of 75 per cent of the claim, and probably the Waterloo Mrutual will be arranged with on similar terms. This will en. able the assigaces to make a better showing to the creditors.

The table subjolmed affords a plain exhliblt of the burden imposed by provisions of the tarifi on a class of goods largely imported to Cunada by our elothing manufacturers, and this notwithstanding the excessive duty upan them. It is questionable if even a. still heavier duty would have the effect of prohbiting the: use of: these goods by the masses of the people; and when we consider that there are only two mills in the Dominion in which they are manufactured and that these mills employ barely two hundred hands in all, it may bo doubted whether the percentages Indicated are consistent with the duties of a paternal Govarn-ment-one having in view-The great-

The columm-"Per cent of duty on cost"-apfords a striking example of what has been urged concerning the class of goods worn by the masses of people. The man who wears the arthele of cloth which costs 20 cents a yard la England pays a duty of 72 per cent on cost, while he who wears the finet articde, costingi $\$ 1.89$ pays a duty of only 28 per cent! In the caso of Naps, the article that costs 28 cents in Eugland pays a duty of 75 per cent on cost while the finer article, costing $\$ 1.84$ pays only 33 per cent I Finally takling the artlcles worn by the female half of our population, it will be seen that Serge Oloaking which costs 41 cents a yard In England (the cheap-
est good to the greatest number. Here surely is room for improvement, a reform which the voice of the people practically as a whole will clamor forwill endorse-areform whichremoves the load from the multitude of consumers or wearers, and lightens the burden by an equitable distribution. The table speaks for itself with unmistakenble emphasis, and we commend it to the consideration of those who owe to the people whom they repre ${ }_{r}$ sent that solicitude for thelr welfare which has always been supposed to be thelr chief gulde. The flgures' in the table are taken from an order placed iny a large importing louse in this elty for the Fall trade of 189.1:

est grade), pays a duty of 58 per cent, while the luxurious article, costing $\$ 1.26$ there pays a duty only of 33 per cent. Surely there is some room for improvement in these premises, aind we commend the matter to the careful consideration of our worthy legislators at Ottawa.

One of the houses which uses the lower grades of cloth so burdensomely. taxed, imports somewhere abouti $\$ 150$,000 to $\$ 200,000$ worth every year. Thla alone, at 70 per cent amounts to about $\$ 122,500$ which the masses of tha people have to continbute toward the support of the 200 employes above-mentloned.

NEWSPAPER INDUSTRY AND ITS EFFECIS ON TRADE.
It is related of the late Lord Reaçopsfleld that he was aecosted one day, durlug a period of warille exctement, by a bighl official who propounded the question, "What is the news from France, this mowing, myl lord?" This was going to the fountain head of knowledge, to the mar who was chlerly lnstrumental at that time In makling the news of Europe. The reply! of the wily old statesman was characterlistic. Said he, "I really don't know, I have not read the papers."
Just eow the insplration that comes to us from the press is more depressing than cheering. Lengthy reports of fallures and flinncial cyclones, have not coutribuied to the genecal stability and to that confidence, one with another, which is the boasis of business operations. This is always a dull season of the year, but there is to be noted an increasing tendency, especially among those of an over actlve disposithon, to fume and frot, instead of talsing that relaxatiou, which properly delougs to midwinter. The eitizen of the United States is an inveterate jewspaper reader, and is widly rideuled on that account by uther nations, by none moreso than by the interesting antives of the Flowery Kingdom. In Canada, likewise, the newspaper is the sole interary dill of fare in many homes and it is mot at all improbable that business is, to-day, looked upon as more uncertain and risky than it really is, wecause of the great industry displayed all over the continent, in gathoring pews. In these days, any man, or any Dusiness, over prosperous, or particularly unsuccessiul, cannot escape notice in the papers, while dusiness men who are making money moderateiy, or not losing it, are not noticed. Still such people constitute the majority of our population, the others are the exceptions. The escapades, trial and conviction of a criminal furnish material for columns of socalled news. Fortunately men who observe the laws are still largely in the majority and they escape notice of any kind. These re ports tend to polson the moral atmos. phere by making the world seem. worse than it is. Certain journals appear to wo in active rivaly as to whell shall publish the most horrilying, misleading and sensational reports about everythlng that happens, without the least regard to the effect on buslness, or family relations. This is particularly true of some Onited States publica-
tions, unfortunately too largely read in Canada. . The neglect of higher literature is a imstake and has long been a subject for regret with men of letters. The incessant reading of the fururiedly gathered news of the day leaves wo tlme, and pexhaps slight inplimation for anything better. .Without time to verify hall what is printed, it is mot difficuit to explain the sudden cloud of depresslon which settled down over the United States, last year, its millions of newspaper readers being daily regaled with columns of gloomy matter detalling fallures and rumors of fallure-particulars which would never have been known, except to the partis immediateiy coucerned, in olden times, pefore the newspaper development of to:day. i The the good ship whiel reaches its: haven In safety; the thousands of solld men; who hold thein own, are scarcely reported, it at all, but an occasional business wreck, and It may be a "plunger" meeting his deserved fate, is given in such detaill as to create a false improssion as to its importance. Following a period of confidence, and business activity, a feeling of anrest, and depression, selzed the public mind which has scarcely had a parallel in modern' times, and the responsibility for this rests to a large extent on the authors of alarmlst and anguaided reports. The natural and industrial resources of North America are, in reallty, unimpaired and things may be expected to speedily right themselves, so soom as the tarlif changes in the United States and Canada are anmounced. Business may ie quiett in the meantime but there is no occasion' ion despondency:

CONSDMPTION OF JAPAN TEA.
The opening up of direct communs. cation with Japan, by means of our trianjcontinental rallway and lines of steamers on the Pacific oceun, has probably had little to do with the large use of Japan tea in Canad.u The taste was acquired beforeliand and would not likely lee aftected by the knowledge of thie fact that the tea came entirely through Camadlan territory, instead of by way of the United States, except so far as the factor of cheapened cost may have acted as some stimulus. "Birds nests" and other Chinese wonders have not yet appeared on our tables, although Canadian enterprise has made Chlma a much closer nelghbior than heretolore. In the United States, coffee 19- thie standard beverage but, int splte of a greater use of black teas in tha
clties, Japan tea promises to retain its hold In the Dominlon, provided always that quallity ls not allowed to deterlorate, as was the case some years ago with regard to certain Chịia : teas. Both Canada and Japan appear to think that reputation for quallty of products is worthl something, in trade, and a large extension of business between the two countries seems likely. Our imports of Japan tea for the sea son 1891.92 were exceptionally large, reachling $10,269,635$ pounds, and have declined "slnce to the more normal level of about 6 1-2 million pounds. On the whole, the figures show a steady growth, We append the figures of the exports from the 1st May, im each ycar, to.a recent date, taking the season of 1887.8 as a comparision. -

## THE EXCISE RETGRNS

If the relative prosperity of the country can be safely judged by the increase or decrease in the inland revenue roturns, the year 1893 was a fairly prosperous one for Canada; for the revenpe from these sources showed an increment of $\$ 443,704$. But, unfortunately, $\$ 419$,790 of this increase was derlved from the enlarged production and consumptlom of spirits and tobacco, which are by no means $\mu c \mathrm{curate}$ standards by which to judge of the advancementy of a country. Such increases olten take place durlng depressions in other lines of manulacture and are as frequently due to the increased consumption by.a number of tdle men rendered desperate by want of worl, as they are to an tmproved condition of the nation's in. dustrleg. But la the present case we may falrly infer that they are due to the latter cause; for the year has been a fairly profitable one from an
many peop'e have so many distractions on hand as to leave little time for wrang ling.
A cursory examination of the list reveals some methods of business to which our readers are probably entire strangers. What shall be said of a case in which the "defendant" has amassed liabilities of several times his actual debts, doubtless for the purpose of a settlement at a small percentage of the dollar? or of another who, in anticipation of trouble, secures as stool-pigeon some one who has managed to open a amall account with a somewhat perverse branch bank manager, and by a series of ehrewd manipulations "works the oracle for him? We may refer to this subject again; but it is not too mach to say that there are at this moment rife in Montreal methods of obtaining money -more or less temporarily successfulthat could not have been dreamt of by the mogt imaginative city lawyer of a quarter of a century ago.
This side-show business must not, however, he. takeu as a general index to the situation. Aithough trade is rather quiet, our merchants and manufacturers, -or rather all those among them who confined their efforts to their legitimate business-who were not carrying heavy loads-seem to have done fairly well during the jear. Certainly the lamentable state of affairs reported as existing in the neighboring republic, finds no parallel in Canada at present. It behuoves every business man however to take heed to his steps, for although we may not witness many serious troubles, the outlook for the next few months is not as bright as we have seen it at corresponding periods of former years.

## THE FRUIT MARKET.

The fruit sales were poorly attendeld this week, most buyers being fully stocked for their holiday requirements. some yearn past, the figure for 1898 being as followa:


This table shows that during the year Bank of Montreal stock fluctuated 82 points, the other banks varying from 7 to 28 points according to the freedom with which they were dealt in; the banks least chosen for speculative purposes showing the steadiest values. But to grasp the full situation, and realize how disastrous the year has been to investors and to those operators who purchase securities to hold for a rise, it is necessarto compare the values at which the several stocks were sold on the 1st January, 1893, with those that ruled on the 80th'December of the same year. This table ahowe that only three atocks, and one of them the most easily mani-
palated in th: market, show higher var lues at the close than at the beginning of the year. Every other is in a worse position to day than it was last January, and some have lost as much as 100 points. Of course in the case of Street Railway, Reyal Electric, and Bell Telephone stocks, the issues of new stock during the year are responsible for a good deal of the decline, but the severe fall in industrial stccks shows that the depression which has rendered capital so timid of investment in the United States has not been without its effect here. Montreal Cotton Co.'s stock has fallen from 138 to 105, Colored Cotton Co.'s stock from 108 to 45, and Dominion Cotton Co.'s stock from 135 3-4 to 98. The one solitary exception is the atock of the Merchants Manufacturing Co., Which closes 5 points higher than a year ago. It is little wonder that oo many. operators have been "wiped out" during the year. The public almost invaeiably operate for a rise. There are very few that venture to sell short in the face of a falling market, except the professional speculators of the "street." Even these did not expect the fall in values to be so severe and continuous as it eventually proved to be. As a result the expert and the tyro alike dropped money, and the year 1893 will be marked with a black stone as an year in which onls an exceptionally fortunate few can congratulate themselves on making money in stocks, or on their investments being worth to day the money they paid for them.

## WAREHOUSE RECEIPTS.

The law lords of the Privy Council have just given an important decision affirming the right of the Canadian parliament to legislate in banking transactions, upholding the validity of warehouse receipts, and deciding that the lending of money by a bank upon the security of documents representing goods, is perifectly legitimate The circumstances of the case which has resulted in this decision are as follows:
In 1888 Christie, Kerr \& Co., Iumber dealers of Brantiord, Ont., entered into an agreement with Mr. Peter Christie, whereby he agreed to advance them money on receiving a lieu upon all the timber manufactured by the firm as security. The firm then granted themselves warehouse receipte, which they endorsed over to himbi Ia return he gave them promissory noted which he diacounted in the Federal Bank endorsing over the warehouse receipts, in his turn, to the bank as security. When the adrances thus made by the Federal Banb had reached $\$ 50,000$, that institution went into liquidation, and in order to meet the demands of the liquidator the senior partner of the firm appealed to the Union Bank for assistance, and they granted him $\$ 52,000$ on the security of notes given and endorsed, with the warehouse receipts as collateral.

In 1889 Christie, Kerr \& Co. failed, and the Union Bank promptiy took possession of the timberr covered by their warehouse receipty This the creditors, in the name of the trustee of the insolvent estate, contested on the ground that the provisions of the Bank Act randered the

Runs upon banke one hae read of only too frequently during the past year; but a run upon a grocery is a novelty that will interest kutiness mon from the curfous circumstancos under which it originated, and the unanticipated nature of its result.
The run 10 queetion was upon tho store belonging to the Washington Red Cedar Shingle Co., of Yuget Sound; and was principally. due to the artfulness of a smart commercial traveller representing a grocery house of Victoria, B. C. ' It wae brought obout in this way. The aaw-filer of the will had a row with the foreman and threw up his job in a passion. He wanted his pay right away. The foreman reitsed to give it him until the regular puy day. Thereupon the iiler obtanded an attachment upon the shingles of the company. This was the traveller's eppcirtunity. He pointer out to the men that pay day was atill fax distant and that the best way that the employes could secure them: selves from tia consequences of $a_{4}$ crasb was to take their pay, out in groceries at the compaus's etore as quickly as they knew how.
Then the run begun, The clerk, who. was dozing behind the counter, was suddenly awakened by a rush of employes demanding grouctics. Soon it became. apparent that he could not tie up packagee fast enough, and he told the men to help themselvec while ho charged up the groceries againat them. When they were through the store looked like the last act of a cyclone, and the clerk was sitting on the counter lughing long and lous.
Then came in the astute traveller and asked mildly if auything was wanted, The clerk pointed to the empty shelves and the tiaveller booked the largest order that he had taken on the trip with a quiet chuckl. Noxt day the filer!'s wages were paid, the mill went on as usual, and the employes realized that the: traveller had been a trifie too smart for them. The eclipany are hoping for another similar run, and tho employes are hoping that they can lay their hands just once on that traveller. In the meantime thes have hired a Chinaman to kick them evers time they realize that instead of their wagee they bave a collar full of dried apples, pickies, and canned goods, that it will take them monthe to get rid of. It will be some time before there is ancther run on that grocery.

## TWO INSURANCE WILD-CATS GONE.

Two wild-cat insurance companies have passed, quietly out of existence, leaving those foolish enough to go to them for cheap indemnity in the lurch. The National Insurance Co. of Weston was one thicm. It pretended to keep ita ameets in raluable mining lands, 30,000 acres of which it claimed tol possess. Early! Last month ite secrotary, G. S. Taylor, absconded, and it was discovered that the title deeds te the lands were forgeries, and that losses toin the extent of $\$ 00,000$ were unpaid. Taylor is eaid to have collected $\$ 5,000$ in premiums during the brief career of the company.
: The second was the Knox Mutual Fire

Insurance Co. rif Indiana: In this case the presidont and treasurer, Geo. A. Scott, and the secretary, Andrews, are both missing, and so are $\$ 20,000$ of the company's funds The books cannot be found either, end the extent of the frauds upon the dupes foolish enough to ingure in it cannot b: ascortained until they are. Of the $\$ 20,092$ in cash, and $\$ 100$,$00 G$ in available notes, which the company claime? to possess, not ono dollar can be found now, and it looks as if the policy holders wuld lose every cent they paid into it.

The value of this iustitution, as a factor in the inculeation of thrift is indicated by the fact that the deposits during 1803 were $\$ 4,900$, and so thoroughly is its success appreciated by the various clurch orgarizations of the cily thent other banks of a kimilar character are projected under Their auspices.

## EUROPE'S WINE PRODUCIION.

A digest of the annual report of the French vintage for 1803 , recently published, shows that the total crop in round figures is $1,125,000,000$ gallons, or nearly double the average yield of the previous fifteen pyears. The quality is said to be unliformly good. The increase in the yleld is common to the whole country. The most notable increase occurred in Glronde, where the production almost equals the phenomenal year of 1875, in Landes, Gers and Charente Infericure, and in the Burgundy and Champagne districts. The total varue of the crop 13 fio 0,261 ? 101, of which $£ 5,900,737$ reptesents digh-class wines of the value of a florin about 40c a gallon. The average production of wine in Europe for the last. decade is as follows: France, 681,181,000 gallons; Italy, $630,000,000$; Spain 563,500,000; Austria-Hungary, 144,200,000; Germany, 83,250,000; Portugal, $78,750,000$; Russia, 72,300000 ; 000 ; Turkey, $45,000,000$; Rumania, 40. Servia, 60,750,000; Bulgaria, 56,250500,000 ; Greece 31,550,000; Switzerland, 22,500,000. It is to be hoped the wine figures for 1803 are more reliable than the statistics of grain sometimes given out.
-The fruit ceuleis of Paris have discovered a method of dyeing their wares. They can color ordinary oranges a deep red, making them look like mandaring, Which fetch moci higher prices. They also tint piandipies to mako them look more attractire, and dye common strawa lovels ron. Mclons are now treated in a simiiar way, and tinted a fine orange.
i -The harrost of ice in Maine is expected to be a smail cne, and it will cost 15 to 20 cents more to cut this year than last. If the agrsiegate cut reaches more thas: 75,000 :one it will be a surprise', While in ordivary years it would bo 200,000 tons. This should give a chance to Canadian lco čzaieza.
-The United States postal authorities hare determined to puta atop to the uso of the mails by investment and benelit ordets of the Irou Hall type. A list of over fifty of these onganizations has been prepared at Washington and sent to the prominent postmasters of the country, withi jostructions to notily the postmasters in
their districts of the fraudulent character of tho compaises named in the list and to forbid delivery to any of them of registered letters or money orders. Directions have also been piven to obtain eridenco agningt their operators and to prosecuta then under the etaitute whichi they have violated.
