




ECLIPSES IN 1882.

In the year 1882 there will be two Eclipses, both of the Sun. 1. A total Eclipse of the Sun, May 17, 1882, invisible at St. John. Begins on the Earth generally, May 17, 0h. 28m. M, mean time at & in longitude 14° 35' E, and latitude 4° 6' N. Central Eclipse begins generally May 17, 1h. 30m. M, mean time at N

in longitude 3° 7′ W, and latitude 10° 39′ N.

Central Eclipse at noon, May 17, 3h. 17m. M, mean time at St. John gitude 63° 46' E, and latitude 38° 48' N.

Central Eclipse ends generally May 17, 4h. 55m. M., mean time at St. longitude 138° 56' E, and latitude 25° 30' N.

Ends on the Earth generally May 17, 5h. 56m. M., mean time at & in longitude 120° 53' E, and latitude 19° 1' N.

2. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, Nov. 10, 1882, invisible at St. J. Begins on the Earth generally Nov. 10, 3h 58m A, mean time at & in longitude 141° 15' E, and latitude 2° 38' N.

Central Eclipse begins generally Nov. 10, 5h 4m A, mean time at in longitude 123° 18' E, and latitude 1° 33' S.

Central Eclipse at noon, Nov. 10, 7h 2m A, mean time at St. John tude 175° 33' E, and latitude 29° 36' S.

Central Eclipse ends generally Nov. 10, 8h 51m A, in longitude 16 and latitude 20° 15′ S.

IMPORTANT TO FARMERS.

The Beet-Sugar Industry.

The following valuable Article is taken from a Connecticut Almanac, and as the din that State does not vary much from our own, it is hoped that our Farmers will themselves of its information.

When it was ascertained that we were producing only about one-sin possibly a fifth of the amount of Sugar required for home consumption that we were importing something like six hundred thousand tons and year to supply our own wants, the question naturally came up, Why or do something to meet this demand, and thus free ourselves from a depend upon importations? If the Sugar-cane, the Sugar-maple, and Sorghan vield us only one-sixth part of what we consume to sweeten existence, is

not some other source of supply?

It was found on inquiry that Europe, with climatic conditions not our own, produced from seven to eight hundred thousand tons of Sugaryear, or about one half the amount required for consumption there, to Sugar-beet, and it was the most natural thing in the world to ask why we not do the same. It was found, also, that the establishment of this intere had stimulated the rapid introduction of sound principles into practice, and had exerted a vast influence in developing the agricult every country where it had been introduced, so that improved farm ment was the result of successful attempts to build up the manufacture, then could we not repeat the results which had proved so important in hand thus build up a new commercial industry, and at the same time new life into American agriculture.

It is well known that we could raise the Sugar-beet in most of our malatitudes, and many farmers had been in the habit of raising it for feel

The Cultivation of Turnips, Mangolds, etc.

The following Letter has been kindly furnished by an eminent practical Farmer of Leter Township. It has been read in a Nova Scotia grange and elsewhere, and has very useful. The information given is entirely reliable.

It is essentially requisite to have the land dry. If wet and springy, a crop will never thrive to any advantage to the grower in a pecuniary power. If the ground is suitable, plough well in the Fall, say six inches that the furrows will be well laid up to give the winter frost a good to mellow the soil. In the Spring, cross plough and harrow well so as to all lumps of earth and to form a good seed bed: this is very essential will give the plants a good chance to feed their roots into the soil. 



