ECLIPSES IN 1882.

In the year 1882 there will be two Eclipses, both of the Sun.

1. A total Eclipse of the Sun, May 17, 1882, invisible at St. John. Begins on the Earth generally, May 17, 0h. 23m. M, mean time at St. John in longitude 14° 35' E, and latitude 4° 6' N.

Central Eclipse begins generally May 17, 1h. 30m. M, mean time at St. John in longitude 3° 7' W, and latitude 10° 39' N.

Central Eclipse at noon, May 17, 3h. 17m. M, mean time at St. John, longitude 63° 46' E, and latitude 38° 48' N.

Central Eclipse ends generally May 17, 4h. 55m. M., mean time at St. John, longitude 138° 56' E, and latitude 25° 30' N.

Ends on the Earth generally May 17, 5h. 56m. M., mean time at St. John, longitude 120° 53' E, and latitude 19° 1' N.

2. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, Nov. 10, 1882, invisible at St. John. Begins on the Earth generally Nov. 10, 3h 58m A, mean time at St. John in longitude 141° 15' E, and latitude 2° 38' N.

Central Eclipse begins generally Nov. 10, 5h 4m A, mean time at St. John, longitude 123° 18' E, and latitude 1° 33' S.

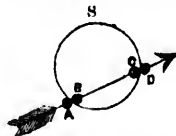

EXPLANATORY.

Apogon—The point of a Planet's orbit farthest from the Sun.
 Anomalous—That part of the Moon's orbit farthest from the Earth.
 Astronomical Day is reckoned from noon to noon through the 24 hours. Thus
 July 21, 9h, is 9th A of July 21, and July 21, 15h, is 3h M of July 22.
 Opposition—A Planet directly between the Earth and the Sun is said to be
 Inferior Conjunction with the Sun. A Planet with the Sun directly
 between it and the Earth is said to be in Superior Conjunction with the
 Sun. Planets are said to be in conjunction with each other, or with the
 Sun, when they are in the same sign and degree.
 Zenith—The distance of a heavenly body from the Equinoctial, measured
 north or south, in degrees or minutes, on a Meridian.
 Ecliptic—The plane of the Earth's orbit, so called because Eclipses can take
 place only when the Moon is on or near it.
 Zenith—The distance of a Planet from the Sun as seen from the Earth.
 Equinoctial—The circle in the heavens traced by the Earth's Equator.
 Node—That part of the orbit of a heavenly body which intersects the Ecliptic.

 Sometimes it is found that when a Constant is added to the time of
 High Water at the Port of reference the sum exceeds 12 hours; in this case
 12 hours from the sum and the remainder will be the time of High

Water at the required Port on the succeeding afternoon or morning, as the Tide at Port of reference was a Morning or Afternoon Tide.

It will sometimes be found that a Constant to be subtracted, is greater than the time of High Water at the Port of reference: in this case add 12 hours to the Time at the Port, subtract the Constant and the remainder will be the Time of High Water at the required place, for the previous Morning or Afternoon according as the Tide at the Port of reference was an Afternoon or Morning Tide.

FORECASTING THE WEATHER.

Men have, from a very early period, studied the weather, on account of its great influence on their pursuits, in order if possible to predict its nature and prevent those losses to the Farmer and the Sailor which result from storms.

The earlier students based their predictions on the phases of the moon; but an examination of the Greenwich observations for more than half a century has shown that this theory is entirely unfounded. Weather prognosticators Moore, Zadkiel and Vennor claim in their Almanacs to be able to forecast the weather day by day for a whole year; but meteorological science in the British Isles, and the Signal Service of the United States, with the Weather Service of the Dominion, does not claim to forecast, with any certainty, the weather for more than three or four days at the most.

If an observer could obtain, at regular and repeated intervals, readings of the Barometer at stations distributed over a large area, he would be able to trace the march of the storm, for it has been found that the wind always blows towards the place of the lowest barometer reading; and so, by means of the telegraph, he may warn those places the storm is approaching. Still, such forecasts are often made, and the forecasts are not always infallible, so that the time remains to be done before meteorology can be ranked among the exact sciences.

Whale's Head Shoals; latitude 42° 58m 0s N; longitude 70° 37m 25s W; white tower; fixed light, flashing, red and white, visible 15 miles, flashing every 20 secs; on the north side of the entrance to the harbor of Matineus. Bearings—Boon Island light bears N E $\frac{1}{2}$ N, 12 miles; Whale's Head light bears N W $\frac{1}{2}$ N, 12 miles; Newburyport Bar bears W by S, 13 miles; Cape Ann lights bear S, 17 miles.

Back Light; latitude 43° 3m 30s N; longitude 70° 41m 48s W; old tower; new tower natural granite color; fixed light, varied by white flashes, visible 13 miles; flashes once in $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes. Fog trumpet giving

blasts at intervals of 22 seconds. Also, a bell, struck by hand, both located the old tower; loth to be left on starboard hand going into Portsmouth.

Portsmouth Harbor Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 14 miles on left side of inner entrance to Portsmouth harbor.

Newburyport Harbor Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 12 miles. Also, a beacon, range of light, 336 feet in front of main light; black tower, fixed white light, visible 8 miles. Those lights, in range, guide across bar, in best water; bar constantly changes; outer bar buoy is in range of inner bar buoy and both lights; the beacon is moved as the channel changes. This station is on the north end of Plum Island, and on the south side of entrance to the Merrimac River, Mass. (Strangers should not attempt to enter.)

Newburyport Upper Harbor; two lights (beacons); outer beacon, black tower, fixed red light, visible 10 miles; inner beacon, red tower, fixed green light, visible 12 miles; both on Bailey's wharf, and to be left on port side passing up the harbor.

Ipswich Lights; a main light, with a range light in front; main light varied by white flashes, visible 11 miles, flashing once in $1\frac{1}{2}$ minutes, shown from a white tower; range light, fixed, white, visible 8 miles, shown from black tower; the lights are 625 feet apart, N E $\frac{1}{2}$ E and S W $\frac{1}{2}$ W; in range they guide to entrance of channel across Ipswich Bar in the best water. Castle Neck, south side of entrance to Ipswich River.

Annisquam Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 13 miles; a buoy of refuge for small vessels; on Wigwam Point, east side of entrance to Annisquam harbor; 6 feet of water on Squam Bar at low tide. To cross bar, bring the light to bear south and run for it, leaving it on the port side; then run for the Lobster Rock Beacon, and leave it on the port side also.

Straitmouth Island; on south side of Sandy Bay, entrance to Rockport harbor; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles; to be left on port side in going to Rockport. Bad ledges lie off this light. Strangers should anchor on the north shore of Sandy Bay best aboard on entering Rockport; shelter for a few small vessels.

Cape Ann Lights; latitude $42^{\circ} 38' 15''$; longitude $70^{\circ} 34' 30''$ W. Two grey granite towers, 165 feet above sea level; fixed white light, visible 12 miles; the lights are 900 feet apart, in range at S S W and N N E; located on Thatcher's Island off Cape Ann, and the northern limit of Massachusetts Bay; to be left on the starboard hand in going towards Boston. Beacon on Isle of Shoals bears N, 17 miles; Boon Island N N E, 30 miles; Gloucester Light S W by W $\frac{1}{4}$ W, 6 miles; Long Island Light S W by W, 24 miles; Cape Cod Highland Light S by E $\frac{3}{4}$ E, 43 miles; London Ledge S E by E $\frac{1}{2}$ E, 1 mile; Salvage Ledge N N E, $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles. Also, a 10 inch steam whistle, blowing each minute a blast of 8 seconds and a blast of 4 seconds, with an interval of 4 seconds between them.

Gloucester Harbor Light, on Eastern Point; on east side of entrance to Gloucester harbor; white tower; fixed red light, visible 9 miles. When entering from the Eastward, bound into Gloucester harbor, give the light a good look, to clear Eastern Point Ledge (spar buoy); then, when the light bears N, run N W $\frac{1}{2}$ N until the upper harbor light bears N E by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N, then anchor $\frac{1}{2}$ mile S by W from the light. Also, a bell on Eastern Point rung by machinery, striking two blows each half minute.

Gloucester Upper Harbor Light, on Ten Pound Island, east side of

inner harbor; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles; to enter harbor, bring this light to bear N E by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N, and run for it until Eastern Point Light bears S $\frac{1}{4}$ W, then run N $\frac{1}{4}$ E till Ten Pound Island light bears S E, (anchor), or run N E by E $\frac{3}{4}$ E to the inner harbor.

Baker's Island Lights; latitude 42° 32m 10s N; longitude 70° 47m 10s W; white towers, ranging S E and N W; fixed white light, visible 15 miles; located on the north end of Baker's Island, south side of entrance to Salem and Beverly harbors. In coming from the southward and bound to Salem, the lowest light open to the east of the high light, and run for it; this leads to the eastward of the South-east Breakers and Searl's Rock. Give Baker's Island a wide berth, leaving it on the port hand, then run for Hospital Point Light, bearing W by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N; now, Salem harbor is to the W S W of Hospital Point and Beverly harbor W by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N. Also, on Baker's Island a bell which gives two quick blows each half minute. For better information, a lens light has been placed in "Hospital Point" Light, which makes a more brilliant light in the line of the ships' channel from Baker's Island, then on either side and serves to keep vessels from danger on either side.

Hospital Point; grey tower; fixed white light, visible 13 miles; on Hospital Point, north side of entrance to Salem and Beverly harbor.

Derby Wharf Light; red tower; fixed white light, visible 10 miles; on Derby Wharf, north side of entrance to Salem harbor. On entering Salem harbor from near Hospital Point, get Derby Wharf light in range with Fort Pickering light to clear the Haste Shoal; good anchorage half a mile S W by S from this light, with Derby Wharf light bearing W by S.

Derby Wharf Light; on the end of Derby Wharf, Salem upper harbor; red tower; fixed red light, visible 9 miles.

Marblehead Light, on Marblehead Neck, south side of entrance to Marblehead Harbor, north side of entrance to Salem South Channel; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles; good anchorage half a mile W by S from this light. To enter harbor, pass Half-Way Rock, bring this light to bear W by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N and run until the light bears S W half a mile, then run N W until the light bears W by W, then run S W $\frac{1}{2}$ W into the harbor.

Half-Way Rock Light; white tower; fixed red light, visible 12 miles; guide to good anchorage and to Broad Sound. Leave it $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles on the starboard side when entering Broad Sound.

Davis' Ledge Light; latitude 42° 16m 9s N; longitude 70° 45m 34s W; granite tower, natural color, 100 feet high; fixed white light, visible 17 miles. Davis' Ledge Buoy bears E by S; Boston light bears W $\frac{1}{2}$ W, 7 miles. This course must be kept good, northerly, to pass off the north side of the Hardings Ledge (about 4 $\frac{3}{4}$ miles from Davis' Ledge Light). A good mark to clear the Hardings Bell Boat, after Minot's light, is to keep Long Island Head light (fixed white) just north of the Narrows light, which is a red light.

Long Island Head Light; latitude 24° 19m 39s N; longitude 70° 53m 25s W; on Little Long Island, north side of entrance to main ship channel to Boston; white tower; white flash light, flashing once every half minute, visible 17 miles. The light bears north one half mile, run west until Long Island Light bears out south of the Narrows light, then run for it leaving the Narrows light on the starboard hand. Also, an air trumpet, giving blasts of 7 seconds, by intervals of 43 seconds.

Narrows Light; brown house; fixed red light, on the right hand side of Narrows, in ship channel entrance to Boston harbor. When this light bears north, run N W $\frac{1}{2}$ W until the east side of Galloup's Island bears S by W then run N W by N until Long Island light bears W by S $\frac{1}{2}$ S.

Long Island Light; on the N E end of Long Island and southern side of entrance to Boston inner harbor: white tower; fixed white light, visible 12 miles. In coming up ship channel, and after leaving Nix Mate buoy on the port hand, and Long Island Light bears W by S $\frac{1}{2}$ S, run W by N $\frac{1}{4}$ N for the south end of the Castle until the Castle North Wharf bears N W by W $\frac{1}{4}$ W or abreast of the State Ledge Buoy (red, No. 3), then N W $\frac{1}{2}$ N to the Upper Middle Buoy (black, No. 9), which leave on port hand, then the course to Long Wharf is N W $\frac{1}{2}$ W. But if approaching Boston from Cape Ann, via Broad Sound, bring Long Island Light to bear S W by W, and run for it until Deer Island Point Beacon bears N W by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N, three-eighths of a mile distant, then W by N $\frac{1}{4}$ N up the harbor. Strangers should bear in mind that in the middle of Broad Sound there is but 8 feet of water at low tide; but by keeping on the southern side of the Sound, leaving the Graves Automatic Buoy half a mile on the port hand and the Devil's Limb Buoy (1 black can buoy No. 1) a mile on port hand, and running straight to Ram's Head Buoy (black can No. 5) about W S W, passing Aldrich's Ledge Buoy (black can No. 3) on port), then leaving Ram's Head Buoy 50 yards distant on port, and about W $\frac{1}{2}$ S to clear Deer Island Point Beacon, you can carry 14 feet safe

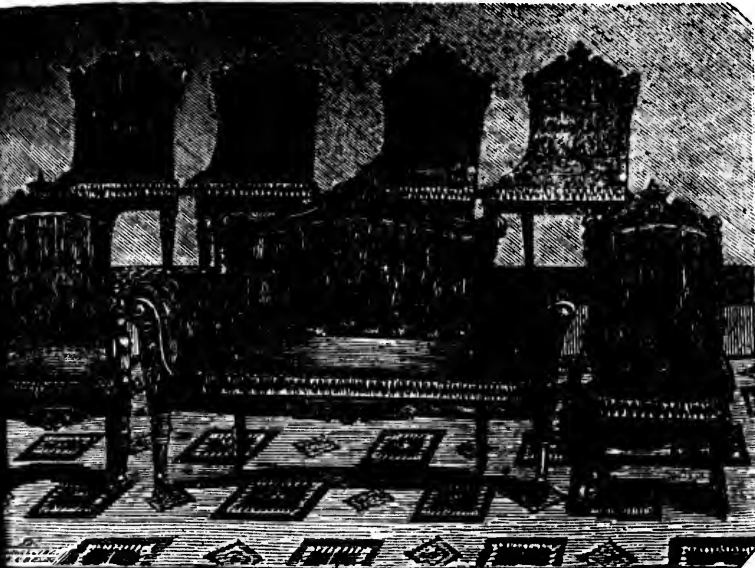

2nd. In which the validity of any devise, bequest, or limitation is disputed except as hereinafter mentioned; or

Subject to the above, the County Courts have jurisdiction, and may hold in all personal actions of debt, covenant, and assumpsit, when the damages do not exceed the sum of two hundred dollars; and in actions on bonds given to a Sheriff in any case in a County Court, whatever may be the penalty or amount sought to be recovered.

Sittings of the County Courts.

The Courts hold Terms every year in each County, which Terms commence as follows:

Charlotte County—On the second Tuesday in the month of June; and on the fourth Tuesday in March and October.

Carleton County—On the second Tuesday in March and December, and on the second Tuesday in July.

Victoria County—On the fourth Wednesday in June, and the third Wednesday in November; and on the first Tuesday in December for return of writs and executions only.

York County—On the second Tuesday in January, third Tuesday in April, and first Tuesday in June and October.

Sunbury County—On the third Tuesday in the months of January and April, and on the Wednesday next after the second Tuesday in October.

Queen's County—On the fourth Tuesday in January and June, and on the third Tuesday in October.

King's County—On the first Tuesday in January, April, July and October.

St. John County—On the fourth Tuesday in the months of January, April, July and October.

Albert County—On the third Tuesday in June, and on the second Tuesday in November.

Westmorland County—On the first Tuesday in June, and the second Tuesday in September and December, and on the first Tuesday in March and September Term only for return of executions.

Kent County—On the third Tuesday in January, on the last Tuesday in April, and on the first Tuesday in July, and fourth Tuesday in October.

Northumberland County—On the fourth Tuesday in January, the first Tuesday in April, the fourth Tuesday in July, and the third Tuesday in October.

Gloucester County—On the third Tuesday in March, and second Tuesday in July, and the first Tuesday in November.

Restigouche County—On the fourth Tuesday in March, the third Tuesday in July, and the second Tuesday in November.

Newspapers and Periodicals.

Newspapers and Periodicals addressed to places in Canada, Newfoundland, Great Britain, or the United States.

Printed and published in Canada, and posted from the office of a Post Office or News Agency, to actual subscribers or News Agents (including those in Great Britain) are subject to a rate of one cent per pound, gross weight, which must be paid by publisher at the time of posting. Such newspapers and periodicals must be issued not less frequently than once per month.

Newspapers posted for city delivery will not be delivered by letter unless prepaid by stamp.

Transient Newspapers and Periodicals addressed to places in Canada, Newfoundland and United States.

Of all Newspapers and Periodicals other than those specified above, the postage rate will be one cent per 4 ounces in weight, which must be prepaid by postage stamp.

Newspapers and periodicals published not less frequently than once per month and weighing less than one ounce, may be posted singly if prepaid by postage stamp one half cent each.

Miscellaneous Postal Matter.

Leaflets, Occasional Publications, Printed Circulars, Prices Current, Bills, Book and Newspaper Manuscript, Printers' Proofs, Maps and Engravings, Sheet Music, Photographs, Documents, wholly or partly written, such as Deeds, Insurance Policies, Militia and School Registers or other documents of like nature, wholly or partly printed or written, posted addressed to any place in Canada or the United States, and not exceeding 4 pounds in weight, 24 inches in length, and 12 inches in breadth, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of one cent per 4 ounces weight, and must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Such books, pamphlets, must not be accompanied by any instructions or directions. Bank advices of goods in transit, and personal notices, are liable to letter rate of postage on Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs and Roots is one cent per four ounces weight, and must not exceed four pounds.

Books, Papers and Commercial Papers are liable to letter rate of postage, unless sent by Registered Post, and the exceptions above given to matter of that class are not applicable to documents specified, such as Deeds and Insurance Policies.

Book Packets,

Books, sent between places in the Dominion of Canada, or to and from Newfoundland, and not exceeding 5 lbs in weight, two feet in length and one foot in breadth, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of one cent per 4 ozs. weight. Book Packets posted for delivery in the Dominion cannot be registered. The maximum weight of Book Packets to the United Kingdom is 5 lbs; newspapers, 4 lbs 6 oz. Book Packets for France, Germany, Italy, Belgium, Netherlands, Portugal, the Azores, Madeira, Denmark and Switzerland, must not exceed 2 lbs 6 oz in weight, and 24 inches in length or 12 in breadth.

Pattern and Sample Post.

CANADA.—Patterns and samples of merchandise, not exceeding 24 ounces weight, when posted in Canada for places in Canada or Newfoundland, must be prepaid by postage stamps at the rate of ONE CENT per 4 ozs weight, in such a manner as to admit inspection. Goods sent in execution of a court order, however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private person to another, which are not actually Trade Patterns or Samples, are not liable. Registration fee 5 cents.

UNITED STATES.—Patterns and samples of merchandise, posted for places in the United States, will continue to be subject to the special rate of 10 cents per pound, and must be prepaid by postage stamp, and must not exceed 8 ounces in weight.

Parcels cannot be transmitted by Post to any place beyond the limits of the Dominion of Canada.

Parcels for British Columbia and Manitoba, (except Winnipeg,) and the United States, will not be forwarded if over 2 lbs 3 oz each in weight. For Winnipeg they must not exceed 4 lbs each.

The time shown by a Chronometer, is its true error on Greenwich time at the moment. At the moment of one o'clock when the Ball drops, represents 5h 24m 15s at Greenwich. The error of a Chronometer may be ascertained, no matter where the ship is, by comparing the time shown by the Chronometer with the time shown by the Time Ball, as it will enable them to get the sea rate, which varies from harbor rates. Latitude 45° 16' 42" North. Longitude 64° 4h 24m 15s West of Greenwich.

IMPORTANT TO FARMERS.

The Beet-Sugar Industry.

The following valuable Article is taken from a Connecticut Almanac, and as the climate of that State does not vary much from our own, it is hoped that our Farmers will find themselves of its information.

When it was ascertained that we were producing only about one-sixth possibly a fifth of the amount of Sugar required for home consumption, that we were importing something like six hundred thousand tons and a year to supply our own wants, the question naturally came up, Why can we do something to meet this demand, and thus free ourselves from a dependence upon importations? If the Sugar-cane, the Sugar-maple, and Sorghum yield us only one-sixth part of what we consume to sweeten existence, is there not some other source of supply?

It was found on inquiry that Europe, with climatic conditions not so favorable to our own, produced from seven to eight hundred thousand tons of Sugar each year, or about one half the amount required for consumption there, from the Sugar-beet, and it was the most natural thing in the world to ask why we did not do the same. It was found, also, that the establishment of this industry there had stimulated the rapid introduction of sound principles into agricultural practice, and had exerted a vast influence in developing the agriculture of every country where it had been introduced, so that improved farming was the result of successful attempts to build up the manufacture. Then could we not repeat the results which had proved so important in Europe, and thus build up a new commercial industry, and at the same time introduce a new life into American agriculture.

It is well known that we could raise the Sugar-beet in most of our northern latitudes, and many farmers had been in the habit of raising it for feed

knowing well that it contains a higher percentage of saccharine matter, greater nutritive qualities, bushel for bushel, than the mangold. They that its yield was much less, and so the question constantly recurred, whether, as a matter of economy, it was to be preferred to the mangold for sugar purposes? It could be made to produce from twenty to thirty tons per acre under exceptionally favorable circumstances, but under equally favorable circumstances the mangold would yield forty to fifty tons, and so the general conclusion was in favor of the latter, though some stoutly maintained the superior economy of the Sugar-beet, and it was gaining ground, though very slowly, against its competitor.

Recently, numerous experiments have been made, and large amounts of beets have been raised to prosecute this industry, and to demonstrate the fact that we can produce our own sugar, without taking advantage, it seems to us, of the experience and the knowledge which has been gained in Europe, of the conditions requisite to success. The experience of many years there has pointed out important problems which it will not do for us to ignore. These relate to the kind and quantity of fertilizers to be used, the size of the beets, the economical for the manufacture of sugar, the necessity for a long rotation, the intelligent selection of seed, some varieties containing a very much greater amount of saccharine matter than others, and to many other points, all of which have an important bearing on the final results. We have not sufficiently recognized the fact, that to raise the Sugar-beet for stock is one thing, and to raise it for the economical manufacture of Sugar is quite another.

For instance, the matter of the size of the beet. The sugar-maker will have a small beet, while the farmer, who is growing the beet to feed to his stock, naturally seeks to produce a large one. Now just see the difference in the composition. Accurate investigation of beets raised in precisely similar conditions, on the same land, and with the same manure, showed that beets weighing from a pound to a pound and a half, contained 15.10 per cent. of cane-sugar, while those weighing from ten to fourteen pounds each, contained only 10.75 per cent. The former contained 2.90 per cent. of foreign substances in the juice, while the latter contained 4.30 per cent. The difference is so marked, that it is quite apparent that success or failure would be likely to turn upon the point alone, if there were no others.

We see the difference in saccharine matter, as modified by the manure used, and especially the condition in which it is applied. Beets manured with horse-manure yielded only 9.73 per cent. of cane-sugar, while beets from the same seed, and on the same land, manured with sulphate of potash, contained 13.87 per cent. of cane-sugar. The result is very striking. When fresh manure of any kind is used, the saccharine matter, in the form of cane-sugar, will be very low compared with beets properly fertilized. A large-sized beet, grown with rank, stimulating manure, will contain a large percentage of foreign substances, either saline, nitrogenous, or non-nitrogenous, and experience has clearly shown that for every percentage of foreign substances in the juice, about one and a half per cent. of sugar in the juice will become unavailable. In other words, success will depend on minute and careful attention to details, many of which appear to have been ignored in procuring the beet for the extraction of sugar.

It is evident, therefore, that if we are to expect the beet-sugar industry to succeed, the farmer must co-operate, and work in harmony with the man-

manufacturer, and be willing to comply with the conditions which experience has demonstrated to be essential to success.

The Cultivation of Turnips, Mangolds, etc.

The following Letter has been kindly furnished by an eminent practical Farmer of *Ter Township*. It has been read in a Nova Scotia grange and elsewhere, and has proved very useful. The information given is entirely reliable.

It is essentially requisite to have the land dry. If wet and springy, a crop will never thrive to any advantage to the grower in a pecuniary point of view. If the ground is suitable, plough well in the Fall, say six inches deep, so that the furrows will be well laid up to give the winter frost a good chance to mellow the soil. In the Spring, cross plough and harrow well so as to break all lumps of earth and to form a good seed bed: this is very essential. This will give the plants a good chance to feed their roots into the soil. This is the great secret of the market gardeners, and shows how they are so successful in raising large crops.

When your land is in good order, raise your drills 30 inches apart; care to have them straight. This will give the horse-hoe no trouble in turning the turnips. When the drills are raised put in from 15 to 20 double horse loads of barn manure to the acre in the drills. It would pay you to purchase 300 lbs. phosphate of *reliable quality*, or 500 lbs. bone dust. Put one bushel of the above in addition to the manure. Put this on the top of the manure in the drill before you close them in. This will bring the phosphate or bone near the surface, and will commence to feed the plants at once and bring them out of the reach of the fly. It will also drive the young plants down to the soil. When the drills are formed sow from 4 to 5 lbs. of seed to the acre 1 inch deep. Press the earth well on the seed to make a firm seed-bed. Five lbs. of seed is ten-fold more than would be required for growing, but by sowing plenty of seed you give the flies something to eat and will leave plenty for the plants to grow. My experience is that young plants will grow better for the first year by being thickly sown. Thin out your plants before they get too large. In a good season they will be ready to thin in about three or four weeks from the time of sowing. Some have an idea that seed must be sown at a certain phase of the moon; never mind the *moon or the man in the moon*. When your ground is ready—say from the 10th to the 20th of June is a good time—thin out your plants about twelve inches apart; keep your horse-hoe going between the rows, even if you should not be troubled with weeds. By constantly stirring the soil the crop is benefited, but by all means keep down the weeds. Let the crop have the full benefit of the soil; do not let the weeds have a share. It may seem to be very laborious, but if you want a good profitable crop you must have to work for it. The days of throwing in seed and allowing it to take care of itself has passed. Farming, like everything else, must be done right to make it a success. The minister, to preach a good sermon, must study it before he gets to his hand. The lawyer who wishes to do justice to his client must prepare a brief and look well to the merits of the case. The mechanic must be diligent in his trade to be successful. The doctor cannot afford to remain idle, he must study up new cases. It is just as imperative on the farmer to get all the information he can to be successful as in any of the above professions or trades. It would be an excellent plan for farmers to club together and purchase books and periodicals on farming. They could be loaned out to the members.

Merits of each might be discussed at their meetings to great advantage.—
 A deal of fault is found with the climate of New Brunswick, especially
 in winter, but the frost is much more benefit to the ploughed ground in
 winter than it gets credit for. Let your farming be equal to the climate
 you will do well.

Practical Farm Hints.

Buying plants for the orchard or garden, make it an inflexible rule never
 buy a second-rate tree, shrub, vine, or seed of any kind, at any price, no
 matter how cheap, when you can get a first-rate article at a fair price. If you
 buy goods of this kind because they are low-priced, you'll be sure to get what
 you bargain for. If you buy them below the real value of the best of their
 kind, you may be sure there is some "out" about them that you do not see.

As a general rule, for all hoed crops, plant in such a way that you can reach
 the hill, plant, or vine with the cultivator, and use this tool early and often.
 If any crop needs clean culture, it will cost less to cultivate or hoe it
 every eight days than it will to hoe it once in fifteen days.

Seeds can be raised cheaper than most other crops, because they will bear
 neglect. But they don't pay in the end. They are the little vices that
 shorten plant-life, and are to be got rid of the best way we know how. The first
 thing is to avoid getting their seeds into manure. It is almost as important to
 clean the manure, as to keep the land, clean. The next is to take them early.
 It is cheaper to nip them in the bud than to pull them up, root and branch,
 when they get ahead. Here is where brain work comes in. It is work that
 must be done, and the problem is to keep down the cost.

The best time to cut grass is when the field shows the greatest number of blos-
 soms. Nature fixes no particular day. Seasons vary several days, and some
 reach this stage of growth earlier than others. So judgment and skill
 are always required to decide the question when it is best to begin. Let it
 be when the grass contains the most sugar, gum, starch, or other elements of
 nutriment, and cure it so as to preserve these constituents, and not drive them
 off by too much exposure to the sun.

Do not fail to have a good tool-house, and a place for a set of carpenter's
 tools—saws, chisels, hatchets, hammers, an assortment of nails, spikes, and
 of every kind that may be needed in an emergency to replace any break-
 ed duplicates of the parts of ploughs, mowing-machines, tedders, horse-
 shoes, &c. A liberal investment in these things will pay the highest per cent.
 of any investment you have.

Make it a rule to plough in the Fall on level land. It is about equal to a
 ploughing of manure. The exposure to freezing and thawing not only mel-
 lows the soil, but owing to the absorbent quality of newly-turned soil, it gets a
 great advantage from the atmosphere, and is in better condition than if it
 were ploughed in Spring, while a well-fed ox can put more strength into the
 plough in September than he can in May. Besides, it costs less to plough in the
 Fall than in the Spring.
