POLES HOLDING OUT BUT CANNOT AVERT FALL OF WARSAW
Poles Admit Aiming at Russo-German Alliance to Rule World

CROWD ATTEMPTED TO RUSH THE GATES OF DUBLIN CASTLE

Troops Fired Over Heads of Mob and No One Was Injured. SOLDIERS WERE CHASED

Dublin, Aug. 15.—Dublin was aroused at nine o'clock last night by heavy firing in the vicinity of Dublin Castle, the result of a crowd attempting to rush the castle gates.

A short time after the firing at the castle an armored car with light troops toured the principal streets. The crowds pulled some of the soldiers from the lorry. Other lorries were then sent out to pick up straggling soldiers.

The troops fired a volley over a crowd at the O'Connell bridge. Many persons took refuge in buildings.

Will be Tried for Sedition. Dublin, Aug. 15.—The Lord Mayor of Cork, Terence MacSwiney, who was arrested Thursday night, and other members of the corporation will be tried on the charge of sedition according to a statement made here today.

Belief is expressed by the military that in Thursday's riot on the Cork main house they secured the arrest of leaders of the Republican brotherhood.

STREET FIGHTING IN LIMERICK. Limerick, Aug. 15.—There was serious street fighting and other disorder here from midday until this evening.

APFRAY AT TRALEE. Dublin, Aug. 15.—Four constables were fired upon at Tralee last night and two of them were slightly wounded.

BATTLE IN IRELAND OVER ARMY PLANE One Soldier and Four Raiders Killed and Several Injured.

Belfast, Aug. 15.—There was a renewal of disorders over the week-end, the most serious of them being a desperate fight early Saturday morning for possession of a military airplane.

Another outbreak is reported from Londonderry, where serious results were prevented only by prompt police intervention.

Soviet Policy is Unchanged, Despite Hostility of France

London, Aug. 15.—M. Kameneff, one of the Bolshevik commissioners here today, wrote Mr. Lloyd George, notifying him that notwithstanding the hostile acts of the French government, which are calculated to prevent the holding of a peace conference, the Soviet government does not consider it necessary to alter its conditions for armistice and peace preliminaries already communicated to your government.

ALLIED WITH GERMANY BOLSHIEVSKI PROPOSE TO CONQUER WORLD

France First, Then England and Eventually United States—Red Officials Outline Program—Correspondents Visit to Kolno.

Kolno, Poland, Aug. 15.—(By courier to Detroit, East Prussia).—Soviet Russia intends to seek an alliance with Germany to make war on France, and if this is successful, to undertake a conquest of England, and eventually the United States, officials of the Bolshevik regime told the Associated Press here yesterday.

As soon as the Polish war, which is considered purely a Russian business, has been finished, a note will be sent to Berlin, they declared, demanding permission to transport troops across Germany for the French campaign.

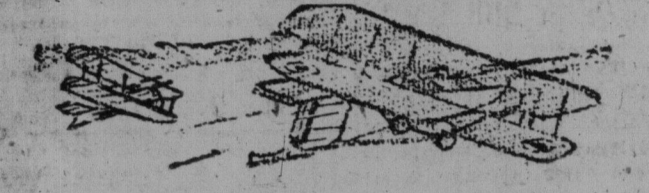

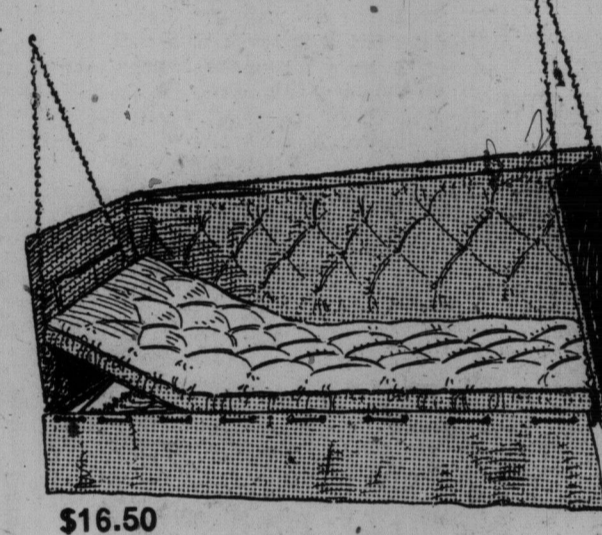

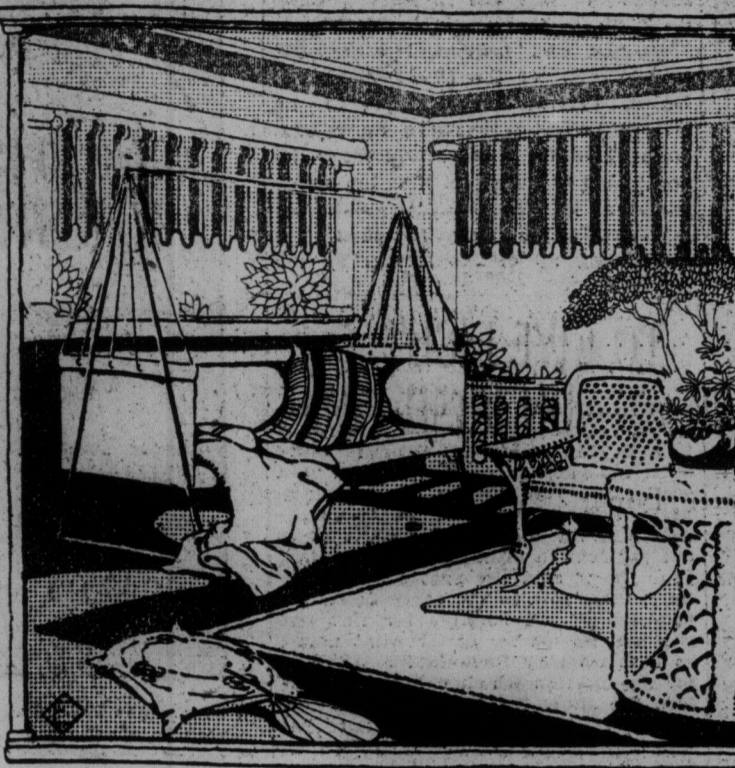
