NINETEENTH ANNUAL SESSION
OF THE
SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF MONTREAL.

FIRST DAY.

The Nineteenth Annual Meeting of the Synod of Montreal was held on Tuesday, the 18th day of June 1878.

Morning Service was celebrated in the Cathedral at half-past ten o'clock.

The Prayers were read by Rev. Canon Norman, Archdeacon Lindsay, and Rev. F. Robinson. The Lessons were read by Rev. G. C. Robinson and Rev. T. A. Young. The Ante-Communion service by the Dean and Archdeacons Leach and Lonsdell. The Sermon was preached by the Rev. J. Rollit. Holy Communion was administered by the Very Reverend the Dean of Montreal, assisted by the above-named clergymen and the Rector.

The Synod assembled at two o'clock in the Synod Hall, for business.

The Session was opened with prayer by the Dean.

It was moved by Canon NORMAN, seconded by Rev. J. C. DAVIDSON:

That Rev. J. Empson be re-elected Clerical Secretary of this Synod.—
Carried.

It was moved by Mr. G. MACRAE, seconded by the CHANCELLOR:

That Dr. Wolfred Nelson be re-elected Lay Secretary of this Synod.—
Carried.

It was moved by the CHANCELLOR, seconded by Canon NORMAN:

That Mr. C. J. Brydges be re-elected Treasurer of this Synod.—*Carried.*

It was moved by Dr. SCOTT, seconded by Mr. F. W. THOMAS:

That Messrs. T. Simpson and M. H. Sanborn be re-appointed auditors.—*Carried.*

The Minutes of last Session, having been printed, and a copy sent to each member of Synod, were considered as read, and were approved.

The Secretary read the names of several parishes whose assessments for expenses of Synod have not yet been paid.

Edward Carter, Esq., Q.C., was named Church Advocate.

The Dean named the Standing Committees. (See page 8.)

The following address from the Bishop was then read by the President:

FAIRCHILDS, May 23, 1878.

MY REV. BRETHREN AND BRETHREN OF THE LAITY,—

Though far away from you at this time, I am with you in spirit, and am able thoroughly to realize your important gathering on the opening day of our Synod, and be assured there is not a single subject which will occupy your thoughts and consideration in which I am not equally interested with yourselves. The Mission Fund with all the different questions connected with it; its present wants and its future prospects; how best to economize our existing income or to enlarge its amount, will assuredly occupy your very serious attention. I can hardly think that the report adopted by the Executive Committee, which was held on the day after my departure from Montreal, will be carried out, inasmuch as it proposes: 1st, a special reduction of grants to some Missions which I feel sure are too weak to bear it, as, for instance, Bolton, Mille Isles, St. Ely, Valleyfield and Warden; 2nd, a 10 per cent. reduction, which would greatly cripple such Missions as Kildare, Lachute and Thorne; and, 3rd, it contemplates the possible amalgamation of existing Missions. The more I think upon the subject the more I am persuaded that, although it may be possible to make slight retrenchments in this or that detail of expenditure, you must not and ought not to take any step which will tend to diminish the salaries of our Clergy, which are already reduced to the lowest standard, and also that it would be positively fatal to the life and growth of the Church to minimize and

I have always felt, and now feel it more than ever, that your thoughts must be turned and your efforts made to devise some better system to call out the undeveloped liberality of our Church members. There is in the Diocese a mine—somewhat exhausted I fear just now—but still a mine which has never been sufficiently worked, but let us try and test its yet further productiveness; let us make an urgent appeal to that self-denying generosity which the love of Christ inspires.

Some preparatory step will, of course, be taken with reference to the approaching election of my successor. I trust that a way will be opened by which that process may be rendered comparatively easy.

You will probably feel that the course recommended by the eminent lawyers to whom the case has been submitted may be safely acted upon and I earnestly trust that, when the time comes for you to make your choice, God Himself may influence you to carry out His wise purposes. I have requested the Chancellor to apprise me as soon as the present session of Synod is over what will be the most convenient date for my actual resignation. I have reckoned upon the 15th of August, when the Lambeth Conference will be fully over, but, as to the exact day, I shall be guided by his advice.

The closing year of my Episcopate has been marked by a much larger number of Confirmations than any which preceded it. At this I rejoice, for I consider it to be a test, and a very reliable one, of the Church's life in our Diocese.

The number of Confirmations held in the last twelve months amounts to 62, and 813 persons have partaken of the rite. I am thankful, too, that all our missions are satisfactorily filled up, so that, on my departure for England, I was enabled to leave every flock in the Diocese with its appointed shepherd. In the past year I have ordained eleven clergymen.

And now, dear brethren, I commend you, the members of this Synod, to Him who is the Great Master of Assemblies. May He take you under His special guidance, that everything may be done discreetly, advisedly, and in the fear and love of God; may he who occupies my place as presiding over you in this present Synod be filled with the spirit of wisdom; and may the same spirit direct your counsels so that they may result in the furtherance of the Church's welfare.

In conclusion I cannot refrain from expressing once again my thankfulness to you and, through you, to the members of this Diocese for the words of kindness and affection which so deeply touched my heart on taking leave of those whom God had committed to my care. They will ever refresh my spirit, and I shall revert to them with constant gratification. I am your loving friend and brother,

The Dean then read the following address from himself:

In the absence of our chief pastor, a few words in addition to the address it has been my duty to read to you may be permitted. You will have

observed that the Bishop adverts to the recommendation of the Executive Committee in the matter of the stipends of the Clergy, but the action of the Committee was not sufficiently matured when the Bishop left to enable him to give his final judgment on the matter. It will be plain to you, the representative men of the Church, how grave a thing it is even to propose such a reduction of salaries as that now contemplated. If it were carried into effect our Missionary Clergy would be in danger of suffering actual want, and the Diocese would gradually but surely be deprived of its most efficient men; and still worse, an act of injustice would be perpetrated. Have you, as a body of business men dealing with the temporalities of the Church, any right to make contracts with individuals and then break them without sufficient cause? Are you prepared, in the face of the Church and the world, to proclaim that you are unable to pay your just debts? Is it not in accord with the general usage of business men that they do not discard faithful servants, but enable them to provide for the future? Clergymen have the strongest claims. Clergymen are "called" to their office, Clergymen are not to "seek" from place to place for employment. A clergyman is expected to remain in his appointed cure until summoned to leave by competent authority. He must hold his commission, anxious and troubled about "daily bread," yet obliged to minister in things spiritual, to preach, to pray, to administer the sacraments to the living, and bury the dead, until the Church which "called" him to his exhausting and laborious service, comes to his relief.

I respectfully submit to you, therefore, that this Synod guarantee now one year's full grant to those who are receiving aid from the Mission Fund, and that the Synod proceed forthwith to place our financial system on a sound basis.

Closely connected with the financial question is that of the constitution of the Executive Committee. It is plain, from the various efforts made to effect changes in the mode of election, that there is much dissatisfaction with the present law, and it will be admitted by every one that it is most desirable that, if possible, this dissatisfaction should be removed.

Would it not, therefore, be well to appoint a Committee whose duty it should be to consider the whole subject, and report (at this session of Synod) a plan of election or appointment calculated to restore the general confidence in the working of this important part of our synodical machinery, and to establish that harmonious co-operation so necessary for efficient action?

The laymen of the Church of this Diocese are adequately represented in this Synod. If they would take the matter in hand, beyond question, with the aid and counsel of the Clergy, they might mature a plan which would effect both objects—a guarantee of the grants from the Mission Fund, and an Executive Committee commanding the general confidence.

Moved by Mr. MACRAE, Q.C., seconded by the Rev. Canon NORMAN :

That in view of the differences of opinion with regard to the position and office of Metropolitan, and the divergent positions taken by the Provincial Synod and the Synod of the Diocese of Montreal respectively, and for the guidance of this Synod in future action, the whole case be submitted to eminent legal Counsel in England, in order to obtain an opinion as to whether, by the recent action of the Provincial Synod with regard to the election and office of the Metropolitan, the Letters Patent from the Crown appointing the Metropolitan and constituting Montreal the Metropolitan See of Canada, have ceased to have force and effect. And that the Chancellor, and Messrs. Edward Carter, Q.C., and L. H. Davidson, be a Committee to prepare the case to be submitted to Counsel, through the Chairman of this Synod.

The Committee on Expenses, (see page 23) were requested to procure the required information.

Rev. Canon ANDERSON moved, seconded by Canon BALDWIN:

That this Synod desires to place on record, and to convey to the widow and family of the late Rev. Robert Phelps, recently deceased in England, and formerly for some years employed in the ministry in this Diocese, its expression of deepest sympathy and regret at the loss to the Church of God, and to his own family, of a brother beloved for his faithfulness, devotedness and zeal.

The motion was supported by Rev. F. H. CLAYTON, and *carried unanimously.*

Votes of thanks were passed to the "Witness" and "Star" newspapers, for gratuitous distribution of their papers to members of Synod during this Session.

A vote of thanks was also passed to those Railways and Steamboat Companies on whose lines reduced rates of travelling were granted.

Rev. F. ROBINSON moved, seconded by Mr. C. J. BRYDGES:

That the thanks of the Synod are due and are hereby tendered to the Very Rev. the Dean for the able and impartial manner in which he has discharged his functions as the Bishop's Commissary in presiding at this Session.—*Carried.*

Mr. MACRAE moved, seconded by Rev. Canon BALDWIN:

That the thanks of this House be given to the Secretaries for their able discharge of the duties of their office.—*Carried.*

The Dean called upon Ven. Archdeacon Lonsdell to pronounce the Benediction. The Session then came to a close.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE TO THE NINETEENTH SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF MONTREAL.

The Executive Committee of the Synod of the Diocese of Montreal beg to submit to the Synod, at its annual meeting in 1878, the following report of its proceedings during the past year.

MEETINGS.

The stated meetings were held in August, November and May; an adjourned meeting was held on the 11th instant; and there were special meetings on 19th February and 2nd April.

There was also a meeting held on the last day of the Synod, at which the several sub-committees were named by the Bishop.

GRANTS.

Chelsea, Templeton & Portland.—The grant to this Mission was increased from \$300 to \$400.

Lacolle. The grant at the rate of \$200 was renewed.

Rev. R. Ker, (Chelsea).—\$100 granted for an outfit.

Rev. C. Lummis, (Mille Isles).—\$100 granted for an outfit.

Rev. F. H. Clayton.—A special grant of \$200 was made in order to enable him to take rest, rendered necessary by ill-health, and to provide for the services in his Mission during his absence from it.

Rev. E. Benedict, (Bristol).—\$100 granted for an outfit.

Rev. Canon Bancroft.—A grant of \$400 for a year was made under clause 5 of Superannuation Committee Report, (see page 966 Journal xviii.)

Only one-quarter of this grant was drawn, in consequence of the death of Canon Bancroft.

Rev. H. J. Evans, (Lachute).—\$100 granted for an outfit.

Rev. E. J. Houghton, (Brome).—\$100 granted for an outfit.

Rev. J. Ball, (Warden).—\$100 granted for an outfit.

A balance of \$31.31 due to the Treasurer of the Provincial Synod, and also \$125, amount of assessment on this diocese by last Provincial Synod, were ordered to be paid.

At the February meeting, the Treasurer's statement showing a deficit of \$5,583.19 in the Mission Fund, it was resolved:—"That until the funds at the disposal of the Synod are in a more satisfactory position the Committee cannot entertain the consideration of any new or enlarged grant."

The following resolution was also adopted:—"That the rule (p. 388 Journal xiv.) in regard to granting outfits in the case of new missionaries or in the case of removals, be held in abeyance until the funds are in a more satisfactory condition."

At the meeting in May an application for a retiring pension was made by a clergyman, but it had to be declined for the present, owing to the embarrassed state of the Mission Fund, from which it would have to be paid.

MISSIONARIES' STIPENDS.

At the meeting in August the following resolutions were adopted;—"That the Bishop be requested to depute the Archdeacons or Rural Deans to proceed at once to carry out the suggestion No. 1 in the 'Report on Missionaries' Stipends' (page 960 Journal xviii), as regards all Missions which are now receiving aid from the Mission Fund."

And "that with the view of carrying out suggestion No. 2 in the 'Report on Missionaries' stipends,' the supplemental grants be discontinued at the end of this synodical year, and the whole revenue from the Sustentation Fund be then devoted to the general support of missionaries."

The following report, presented by the Treasurer at the April meeting, was adopted; and, having been printed by the direction of the Committee, two copies were mailed to every clergyman in the Diocese:—

'I think it better to put before the Committee at its special meeting to-day a statement in writing, in addition to the unsatisfactory balance sheet which it is my duty to submit.

'I beg to report that I have issued cheques for the salaries due on the 1st April, to the amount of \$4,666, which is an increase over the previous quarter. This is at the rate of \$18,664 a year without the supplementary allowances, which average \$400 a quarter or \$1,600 a year.

'The present outlay therefore for Missionary salaries is at the rate of about \$20,300, in addition to the general expenses of about \$2,700 a year, making a total of about \$23,000 a year at the present rates authorized by the Committee.

'The actual receipts for last year, ending 31st May 1877, were as follows:—

'If the general receipts for the current year are as much as last year, there will be a deficiency at the present rate of payment of about \$2,600 on the year's operations;—but the S. P. G. grant now amounts to only \$6,720, or a reduction of \$770,—the interest account will be less, owing to the overdraft in the bank,—and it is by no means certain that the collections will be equal to those of last year. There is now, on the whole, great reason to fear a deficiency on the year ending 31st May 1878, of not much less than \$4,000.

'The result of those five years was to show a deficiency on the whole period of \$2,968.

'In 1876 a balance of interest account was brought in, largely swelling that year's receipts, and special efforts were also made to increase collections, which were successful to the amount of about \$1,400 extra for that year.

'The amount received from the S. P. G. in 1873, was \$8,696; for the present year it is at the rate of \$6,736, or a reduction of \$1,960.

'The condition of the Mission Fund on the 1st April 1878, shews it to be in debt the sum of \$7,384.64.

The amount required to pay salaries on 1st July next, less the draft from the S. P. G., will be the sum of about \$3,000, irrespective of the supplemental grants—and a quarter of the general expenses, say about \$700, or \$3,700 in all.

There will be about \$2,220 to be received for interest on investments.

It is therefore clear that the account will be so overdrawn on the 30th June next that it will be impossible to pay full salaries due on 1st July 1878.

Every effort has been made to press this question of finances upon the Diocese. Meetings were held throughout the city early in January, when the whole question was thoroughly discussed, and the financial statements then made were freely circulated amongst the clergy.

Finding that money was coming in very slowly, I addressed the following circular to the clergy on the 1st March :—

The quarterly salaries of the clergymen ranking on the Mission Fund of this Diocese will fall due on the 1st April next, amounting in the aggregate to upwards of \$5,000. The Mission Fund is now overdrawn very nearly \$5,200, and I have no receipts that I can depend upon up to the 1st April, except the draft on the S. P. G., which will produce about \$1,680 only. As the account stands to-day, therefore, if I am able to pay the salaries on the 1st April next, the account will be overdrawn by no less than \$8,500. The only relief will be from contributions from the different churches in the Diocese; and these are coming in, I regret to say, very slowly indeed, and in small sums.

I call your attention to this matter, as it is quite clear that, unless I receive considerable sums during next month from the several churches in the city and in the country, it will not be possible to pay the salaries at the time they are due,—a position which I need not say would be a very painful and embarrassing one.

The efforts made to endeavour to equalize receipts and payments having been productive of so little response, there is no option but at once to revise the scale of expenditure, it appearing to be impossible to raise the revenue to the amount necessary to carry out the present authorized payments.

Under these circumstances, I asked the Bishop to call a special meeting of the Executive Committee, to consider the present position, and to take such steps as may be deemed necessary.

I cannot feel it to be my duty to sign the cheques for the salaries due on the 1st July next, with the account in its present state.

It is with very great regret that I feel compelled to come to that decision, but it must be considered as final and imperative.

It seems clear that the income for next year cannot be more than from \$19,000 to \$19,500, made up as follows :—

That will leave \$16,500 to \$17,000 a year available for salaries in place of the present scale of \$20,300. Stopping the supplemental grants will save about \$1,500—reducing the actual salaries to \$18,800. A reduction of 10 per cent. will bring the total to about \$17,000, which is all that the present receipts will permit to be paid.

"This will of course leave untouched the present over-draft of \$7,384.64.

"I have been compelled to decline to sign any more cheques for the supplemental grants—having no funds to meet them.

"In view of the present condition of the Mission Fund, I recommend the Executive Committee to pass the following resolutions.

1st. That the principle be laid down that the payments in each year can only be to the amount of the aggregate receipts for the year.

2nd. That at the end of the present quarter the supplemental grants be stopped, owing to the want of funds.

3rd. That a Committee be appointed to consider what Missions can either be joined together or closed entirely, and that this Committee consider what reductions, if any, can be made in the general expenses of the Diocese.

4th. That if necessary a general reduction of all grants be made, so that the yearly expenditure be brought within the yearly income.

5th. That an earnest appeal be made to the Parishes and Missions aided from the Mission Fund to make up to their clergymen such reductions in the present grants as may be rendered inevitable; and that the whole list of grants from the Mission Fund be revised, with the view of gradually reducing as many as possible, so as to make the Missions self-supporting.

The Bishop named the following Committee in accordance with the 3rd resolution.

At a meeting of the Executive Committee held on the 8th May, the following Report was adopted, and ordered to be printed for circulation, with a view to its discussion at the Rural Deanery meetings:—

The Committee appointed at the special meeting of the Executive Committee on the 2nd April, 1878, beg to make the following report:

The printed report of the proceedings of the special meeting was laid before the Committee, including the statement then made by the Treasurer.

The Committee first discussed the question of the general expenses of carrying on Church work in the Diocese, and after full consideration adopted the following resolution, viz.:

"Resolved:—

"As regards the annual expenses, that no practical reduction can be made unless it be in the printing, and that it would be desirable to appoint a

"Committee at each meeting of Synod to regulate and control the printing of the Synod Journal and Proceedings."

The question of the mode of carrying out the resolutions of the Executive Committee in regard to Missions was then taken up.

A letter from the Bishop, who was unable to be present, was then read.

The Treasurer submitted the following statement, shewing the name of each Mission, the name of the present Incumbent, and three columns shewing the grants from the Mission Fund authorized by the Executive Committee at the present date, the amounts authorized five years ago, and the amounts authorized ten years ago, viz.:—(The last statement was obtained from the records of the Church Society.)

All the foregoing statements are exclusive of the grants from the S. P. G. and the Clergy Trust Fund.

The Treasurer then stated that the deficiency in the accounts for the year ending 31st May, to be submitted to the Synod in June, would be certainly not less than \$4,000, and would probably be between that and \$5,000.

He also stated that, basing his calculations upon the receipts of the last two years, his total receipts for next year from all sources would not exceed..... \$19,000

Out of this must be paid the general expenses, which at a very moderate estimate would be..... 2,500

Out of this the privileged S. P. G. grants and pensions would absorb..... 5,650

Leaving available for Mission grants.....\$10,850

The Treasurer then stated, as he had already done at the Executive Committee, that whilst the debt on the 31st May might be left to be dealt with hereafter at a favorable opportunity, he could not in future pay more than the actual income of the whole year, and that the payments must be regulated on that basis.

The present grants, irrespective of the supplementals as now authorized, are, \$13,225

The available income is..... 10,850

Deficiency.....\$2,375

That amount will, therefore, have to be deducted from the present scale of payments.

Attention was directed to the reports of the Executive Committee of May, 1871, and adopted by the Synod, directing that certain Missions therein named can no longer receive aid from the Mission Fund, but must be made self-supporting.

Also to the report of 1872, where certain grants were reduced, and a general reduction of 10 per cent. per annum ordered to be made in respect of those grants, which was adopted by the Synod.

Again in June, 1873, the report of the Executive Committee pointed out:

that, although the reduction of 10 per cent. was postponed for one year, it must then be carried into effect.

Also, in June, 1875, the new system of making self-supporting, and for reducing many of the grants, to make income and expenditure balance, was again strongly insisted upon.

These various reports, although adopted by Synod, have not been carried into effect; and now, in consequence of the reductions in the grant from the S. P. G., from diminishing contributions to the Mission Fund, and the pressure of increasing grants to so many old Missions, and the opening of new ones, the Fund has got into the unfortunate condition in which it now is.*

The list of the existing grants was then carefully gone over.

The majority of the committee were of opinion that none of the Missions should be closed, if it could possibly be avoided, but that such reductions should be made in the existing grants as would equalize the annual outlay with the income.

After very full discussion it was decided that, from the 1st April 1878, the following reductions should be made, viz.:

This reduction will very nearly balance the account between income and expenditure.

Of course if the receipts during the year should prove to be more than can now be relied upon, the amount, whatever it may be, will be paid away by adding a percentage to each payment during the last quarter. Appended to this report is a statement of the grants as now settled from 1st April 1878.

It will be necessary in future to make an estimate of the receipts at the end of each financial year, and base the payments for the following year upon the ascertained actual income of the past year.

It was considered that Chelsea might be closed as a separate mission, provided Hull would undertake to attend to both Chelsea and Portland, in which case \$200 might be granted to Hull.

The grant to Chelsea under the revised scale will be \$350.

The committee earnestly recommend that this question of the Mission Fund be thoroughly discussed at the Rural Decanal meetings, with the view of increasing the contributions to the Mission Fund, and of endeavoring to form as many Missions as possible into self-sustaining parishes.

It is also hoped that they will carefully consider if it is not possible to join together some of the present Missions.

It is greatly to be regretted that want of funds renders these reductions absolutely unavoidable, but it must now be kept steadily in view, as a principle not to be departed from, that the payments can only be to the amount of the annual income, whatever that may be.

The Dean of Montreal wished it to be understood that he dissented from the conclusions at which the Committee had arrived.

S. P. G. GRANT.

The grant to this diocese for the past year has been £1,400 stg., equal to \$6,736.94, and the balance, \$2,311.54, remaining after payment of the privileged claims and pensions, was transferred to the Mission Fund.

The Committee has not yet received notice of the amount which the Society will grant for the year 1879.

The following resolution was adopted:—"That the attention of the Clergy receiving grants from the S. P. G., and of their parishes, be drawn to the present state of the Mission Fund, in the hope that some means may be by them devised, whereby the amount received from the said Fund may be relinquished, and be applied to the Mission Fund.

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

The total amount of this Fund is \$2,723.86, being an addition of \$808.30 during the past year. The number of clergymen, who have subscribed to this fund, is still very small.

WIDOWS AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The revenue of the Fund for last year was \$3,806.10, against \$3,672.82 the previous year. The annuities amounted to \$1,575.00, an increase over the former term, owing to the widow of the late Canon Bancroft being added to the number of annuitants. The invested capital amounts to \$44,686, and there is a balance of cash on hand of \$2,350.19.

The following Report was adopted:—

The Widows and Orphans' Fund Committee beg to report that application has been received from Mrs. Dixon in the absence of her husband, requesting that the Rev. J. H. Dixon's name be placed on the list of names of those who have complied with the By-law of the Widows and Orphans' Fund; also from the Rev. F. H. Clayton, with the same request. The Committee have to state that Mr. Dixon has failed to make collection on behalf of the Fund in the years '76, '77, and '78, and has failed to pay his subscription for '73, '75, '76, '77, and '78; also that Mr. Clayton has failed to make collections since 1873, and has failed to pay his subscription since 1875.

The Committee would recommend that their request be complied with, on payment of all back subscriptions, and a collection being made on behalf of the Fund for the present year.

And the Committee would draw attention to the unfairness toward those clergymen who have complied with the By-law, in permitting the collections to fail.

The Committee beg also to draw attention to the wording of the 3rd clause of the By-law, and would suggest that it should be altered to comprehend those clergymen who, though having no cure of souls, are admitted to have a claim on the Fund.

EXPENSES OF SYNOD.

The following report was adopted :

In accordance with the resolution of last Synod, that the clause in the Executive Committee's report "be not now adopted, but be referred back to the Committee to reconsider the whole question and report fully to the next Synod," the Committee now beg to report that they have carefully considered the question.

They find that the total expenses charged in the accounts of last year against the Mission Fund, without deducting the amount received on account of the assessment for the expenses of Synod, amounted to a total sum of about \$2,300.

After carefully analysing the details of that sum, the Committee are of opinion that about \$1,550 is fairly chargeable for purposes connected with the Mission Fund, and that about \$750 therefore represents the outlay in connection with the work of the Synod itself.

It is difficult to divide the cost of printing and other items, but the above is believed to be a fair division.

Last year the Synod assessment amounted to \$460.38, of which \$116.49 was paid away for mileage and the balance of \$343.89 credited to the Mission Fund.

From these facts it would appear that the proper amount chargeable to the Synod for all expenses connected with it is about \$750.00 a year.

If that sum was provided separately it would require the present assessment on the different parishes to be nearly doubled.

TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE DIOCESE OF MONTREAL.

I beg to hand you herewith the accounts of the Diocese of Montreal for the year ending 31st May, 1878.

These accounts are six in number and are as follows:—

- No. 1. Clergy Trust Fund account.
2. Widows and Orphans' Fund account.
3. Sustentation Fund Capital account.
4. Superannuation Fund account.
5. Mission Fund account.
6. Sustentation Fund Interest account.

No. 1 (Clergy Trust fund) account shows that the sum of \$3,981.02 has been received for interest, and \$2,092.68 paid to five clergymen ranking on this fund leaving a balance of \$1,888.34 which has been carried to the credit of the Mission fund. A sum of \$2,400 lent on mortgage has been repaid and this will be again invested as soon as possible.

No. 2 (Widows and Orphans' fund) account had a balance to its credit last year of \$1,119.09. There has been received during the year from clergymen the sum of \$265, from church collections \$391.27, and for interest \$3,149.83, making a total receipt for the year of \$3,806.10. The payments to widows and orphans' have amounted to \$1,575.00. The sum of \$1,000 has been invested on mortgage and there is now an available balance of \$2,350.19 on hand for investment.

No. 3 (Sustentation fund capital) account shows a balance on hand of \$397.94 available for investment.

No. 4 (Superannuation fund) account had a balance to its credit of \$615.56 last year. Subscriptions during the year amounted to \$470, collections to \$190.38 and interest to \$147.92, making a total receipt for the year of \$808.30. The sum of \$750 has been invested on mortgage leaving a balance on hand of \$673.86. Eighteen clergymen appear now to be paying \$5 yearly to this fund.

No. 5 or the Mission and account had a balance to its credit of 211.91 last year.

This leave of the fiscal year amounted to \$211.91 at the expenditure of \$3,556.60. The sum of \$750 has been invested on mortgage leaving a balance on hand of \$673.86. Eighteen clergymen appear now to be paying \$5 yearly to this fund.

The grand total for the year was \$7,493.11 to \$756.17.

The interest on the mortgage amounted to \$5,357.60.

The interest on the mortgage for the last year, being \$5,357.60, was paid out of the hall fund.

The general expenses for repairs, taxes, water, fuel and incidental expenses amounted to \$2,782.06.

The amount of the pensions was \$1,888.34, which amounted to \$1,888.34.

The salaries of the clergymen and for support of the hall fund amounted to a total of \$12,092.45 for the year.

The amount of the expenses for printing, advertising, stationery and post-ages was \$756.18.

This leaves a debit against the mission fund at the close of the fiscal year of \$3,344.74, and as it had a sum of \$211.91 at its credit at the beginning of the year, the expenditure of the year has exceeded the receipts by the sum of \$3,556.65. The receipts from the city churches have increased from \$4,176.51 to \$4,642.48 and the country churches from \$2,615.07 to \$2,703.42, making a total increase from church collections during the year of \$554.32.

The grant from the S. P. G. has been reduced from \$7,493.11 to the sum of \$6,736.94 or a reduction of \$756.17.

The interest received, less what has been paid, amounted to \$5,357.61 against \$4,823.82 or an increase of \$533.79.

The interest paid on the Synod building is the same as last year, being \$596. The amount received for the use of the hall was \$560 against \$410 the previous year.

The general expenses for salaries, printing, advertising, repairs, taxes and all incidental charges amounted to \$2,782.06 against \$2,706.37 for the previous year.

The amounts paid for S. P. G. special grants and pensions were the same as for the previous year and amounted together to the sum of \$5,648.76.

The salaries paid to clergymen amounted to \$12,098.45 and for supplemental and special grants to \$2,850, making a total of \$14,923.45 against \$12,754.81 in the previous year.

The amounts paid for outfits and catechists was considerably in excess of the previous year.

No. 6, or Sustentation Fund Interest account, shows that a total of \$4,536.76 has been received during the year \$698.05 has been paid for interest on local endowments and the balance of \$3,838.71 has been carried to the credit of the Mission fund.

Several mortgages have been paid off during the last year and I have received notice of others which will be shortly paid off.

There is great difficulty at present in obtaining good mortgages, and the rate of interest is clearly declining for good investments. This will tend to reduce the income of the diocese in future.

In pursuance of the decision of the Committee I now proceed to give a statement of the amount probably available for the current year, and which is all that I shall be able to pay away.

We start on the 1st June with a debit against the Mission fund of \$3,344.74 which must be paid off at the first available opportunity. This unfortunate result has been arrived at although every possible effort has been made to collect funds and after the widest publicity has been given to the urgent wants of the church in this diocese.

The Mission fund during the last six years has run in debt a total sum of \$6,312.

The Committee appointed at the 18th Session of Synod, on the subject of the proposed erection of a new Diocese out of the Dioceses of Montreal and Ontario, beg to report that they have found it impossible to form any opinion as to the desirableness or otherwise, of the proposed formation of a new Diocese, inasmuch as the resolutions on the subject passed by the House of Bishops have never been submitted to the Synod, and the Committee are, consequently, ignorant of the precise character of these resolutions.

REPORT OF THE FOREIGN MISSION COMMITTEE.

As stated in the Report of this Committee last year the Bishop of Madras asked this Diocese to support Samuel Johns, whose work was among the more educated natives at Madras. The Committee agreed to support the work for one year. The Bishop of Montreal wrote to that effect, sending \$122 balance of Foreign Mission collections then on hand. The Bishop of Montreal received a report of Samuel Johns' work in Madras, which has been circulated among the Clergy for the information of the Diocese. Since the collections taken up for Foreign Missions a further remittance of \$250 can be sent, which will complete the payment of the year's salary of Samuel Johns. The Committee are thankful to record so much accomplished, and hope that the Clergy will not omit to preach the annual sermon for Foreign Missions appointed by the Synod.

The Committee has issued one leaflet with an account of its proposed work. It purposes to issue a second with a brief account of our Missions in India, and to follow with others about the Mission field in other parts of the world. The pleasing intelligence from the Diocese of Madras has been received, that over 16,000 of the native population have applied for Christian instruction. An appeal has been made to the Church of England for additional help, both in money and men, to gather in what is regarded as the first-fruits of a great harvest. In Southern India a large number of most earnest labourers have been engaged for many years. It has been the most successful work of the Church in India. Madras Diocese has at present over 70 native Clergy. The Committee hope to be able, above supporting Samuel Johns another year, to take part in this work.

The mission field of the world is being more earnestly entered into by our Church than for many years before, and the Committee hopes that the interest awakened by this effort in the great mission field of the world will awaken increased interest in our Home Missions.

RURAL DEANERY OF HOCHELAGA.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1877-78.

My LORD,—The Deanery met in the Synod Hall, on Monday the 17th June, at four o'clock.

Sixteen Clergymen were present and thirteen laymen, representing eighteen incumbencies.

The following questions were submitted to the Deanery:—

1. Have you received the full amount of your stipend for the past year?

Ans. Mascouche and St. Luke's (Laprairie) are in arrears.

2. Is the property of the Church in your incumbency insured?

Ans. Coteau du Lac, insufficiently; Kildare, two churches uninsured; Laprairie, insufficiently; Lacadie, not at all. Other property in the Deanery uninsured.

3. What is the condition of the Church property?

Ans. Parsonage at Coteau du Lac needing repair.

4. Have you any suggestion to offer concerning the Mission Fund?

Ans. That in the opinion of this Ruri-Decanal meeting, any measure for remedying the present very unsatisfactory condition of the Mission Fund which would curtail the existing stipends of the Missionary Clergy is objectionable in principle, injurious to the work of the Church in the Diocese, and unjust to the Missionary Clergy themselves. That the expenses of the Mission Fund should be brought within the revenue by closing, as a temporary measure, a sufficient number of Missions, without grave detriment to the work of the Church.

There are 29 cures within the Deanery, all of which are supplied with Clergymen. Of these 11 are self-supporting, 1 maintained by the S. P. G., 2 by the Clergy Trust Fund, 1 by the Colonial Church and School Society, 1 by a special fund, and 13 by the Mission Fund.

ENDOWMENTS.

16 cures have endowments, which range from \$100.00 to \$7000.00.

MISSION FUND.

As far as it can be ascertained from the accompanying returns of 19 cures, in some of which, owing to recent changes in the Incumbencies, the amounts are uncertain, it is found that the sum raised is less than the sum assigned by \$100.00.

Nine cures have exceeded, two have equalled, and five are under their apportioned amounts. Three appear to have done nothing.

CHANGES.

There have been a number of changes among the Clergy during the year.

Rev. E. Archibald has removed to North Shefford; Rev. Canon Henderson has been appointed to the Principalship of the Theological College, Montreal, the Rev. R. D. Mills replacing him in the Rectory of Dunham; Rev. H. J. Evans has resigned the Rectory of Christievillie, and is succeeded by Rev. J. Schulte, D.D.; Rev. H. W. Nye has removed to West Shefford; Rev. J. Ball has been appointed to the newly-opened Mission of Warden; Rev. E. J. Houghton has been placed in charge of the Mission of Bromes Corners, and the Rev. O. J. Booth in that of Iron Hill.

ABSENCES.

Rev. F. H. Clayton has been absent from his Mission on sick leave.

Rev. J. Ker is absent collecting funds for the erection of another church in his Mission.

Rev. R. W. B. Webster is absent from the Rectory of Bedford.

DEATHS.

It is our melancholy duty to have to record the death of the late Canon Bancroft, D.D., D.C.L., who, although holding no appointment in the Deanery, has been for some time resident within it. The Diocese at large loses in Dr. Bancroft one of its most distinguished and experienced Clergymen, and one whose chaste eloquence, high talents, deep piety, and excellence of character, secured for him universal respect and esteem.

We have also to record the deaths of the late Dr. Seaton of Abercorn, and of the late John M. Standish, Esq., of Rougemont, laymen, who, in various capacities, contributed largely to the maintenance and success of the Church in their respective localities.

CHURCHES CONSECRATED.

The church at St. Hyacinthe, rebuilt to replace the previous edifice destroyed by fire, has been consecrated. It is very creditable to the congregation that they have completed the building without incurring debt. In fact a balance still remains in the hands of the Committee, a fact largely owing to the praiseworthy exertions of Mrs. Joshua Henshaw.

The church at Glen Sutton has also been consecrated. A considerable number of the Clergy of the Deanery were assembled on the occasion to manifest their sympathy in the work, which has been so successfully inaugurated in this new and hopeful Mission.

The church at Fulford almost destroyed by a tornado has been thoroughly repaired and transformed into a more perfect and ecclesiastical edifice.

DUNHAM LADIES' COLLEGE.

We regret that we are not able to report greater progress on the part of the Dunham Ladies' College. Were it in the power of the Corporation to open it for the reception of pupils, its prospects of patronage seem sufficiently encouraging. The building proper may be said to be completed, and to be ready for occupation. The sum of \$8000.00 has been expended. But it will require about \$5000.00 additional to pay a debt of about \$1000.00, to erect suitable out-buildings and to furnish. The institution is intended to supply an urgent want; and, when in operation, it will prove one of the most important and beneficial agencies of the Church in the Deanery.

MISSIONARY WORK.

The embarrassed condition of the Mission Fund paralyzes any attempt to extend our Missionary work. Simple existence is all that at present is to be thought of, yet there are many vacant spots in which the Church could find a foothold, many a place in which her ministrations would secure a welcome, and prove an inestimable boon. The Clergy are not wanting in zeal, but their parishes are large, and demand all their labour. Until a brighter day dawns, and the lowering clouds that now beset the

horizon rise, we can only regret that the liberality of our people fails to keep pace with the glorious and promising opportunities which open before the Church for the exercise of her divine commission, "Go ye into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature."

REPORT OF THE DEANERY OF IBERVILLE FOR 1878.

TO THE VERY REV. DEAN BOND, LL.D.

MR. DEAN,—The Annual Meeting of this Deanery took place on the 5th inst., and was attended by the Reverends Messrs. Davidson, Sutton, Boyd, Allen, and Fulton, and Messrs. Robert Fulton and Robert Wood.

Missionary Meetings were held in all the Parishes except Edwardstown, and Valleyfield, which had to be given up on account of storms.

We are much indebted to the Rev. Dr. Clarke, the Deputation, for his eloquent and lucid addresses at Havelock, Hinchinbrooke, Huntingdon and Ormstown; and also to the Rev. W. L. Mills, and Archdeacon Pennel of the Diocese of Albany, who took Lacolle; and to the Revs. A. A. Allen, and C. Boyd, who acted as Deputation for Hemmingford and Boyton.

Changes—None have been made, and none proposed, except the temporary withdrawal from Valleyfield.

The Report of the Executive Committee having been read, it was moved by the Rev. Mr. Davidson, and seconded by Mr. Robert Fulton that the Meeting proceed to discuss what measures can be taken to increase the revenue of the Mission Fund, and to consider the other points recommended by the Executive Committee.—*Carried.*

I. After mature consideration the recommendation was made by the meeting that a house to house collection be made, the collectors to secure annual subscriptions in amounts to be collected as often as the contributors feel that they can pay the same.

The Deanery were of opinion that,

II. Instead of uniting any of the Missions together a most pressing necessity exists for a division of several of the Missions at present occupied,—whether the question be considered with reference to distances or to numbers.

III. Instead of endorsing the reductions suggested by the Executive Committee, the Deanery consider that faith ought to be kept with the older Missions, and that the opening out of new Missions, in the face of their annual protest, for years past, that the funds were deficient, has been injudicious.

DEANERY OF ST. ANDREWS.

REPORT FOR JUNE, 1878.

THE VERY REV. THE BISHOP'S COMMISSARY.

MR. DEAN,—The annual meeting of the Deanery was held in St. James' Parish, Hull, on Tuesday, May 21st. Owing to the large extent of the Deanery, and consequent heavy travelling expenses, the attendance was small, only ten of the Clergy and six Laymen being present.

Attention was directed to the Report of the Sub-Committee appointed at a special meeting of the Executive Committee, held on the 2nd of April 1878.

The proposed relief to the Mission Fund (1) by joining together some of the weaker Missions, or (2) closing them entirely, or (3) by reducing present grants was felt to be a great hardship. The poorer Missions in this Deanery are too far apart to admit of their being united.

In most cases it would be impracticable to annex them to any of the adjoining Missions, which are already so large as to tax the strength of the Clergy to the utmost.

To abandon any of the ground now occupied (and there are yet large districts without the ministrations of the Church) would be by so much a denial of the declaration "to the poor the Gospel is preached."

A reduction of present grants would press with crushing weight upon the Clergy, as in most cases their congregations could not make up the loss to their present meagre stipends. Such reduction is practically to throw the whole burden of the support of the new Missions opened within the past five years, upon the Clergy dependent on the Mission Fund.—

Will their brethren of the Clergy allow them to bear this burden alone? Will the Laity forget their part in the Church's work, and allow this burden to rest solely upon the Clergy?

Shall we not, one and all, manfully face our duty, and unitedly work together for Christ and His Church?

The following Resolutions were passed unanimously, viz:—

I. Resolved, That this Deanery is convinced that the reduction proposed by the special Committee of the Executive Committee would certainly involve the closing of nine of the Missions of this Deanery. Further, that this Deanery feels that proper efforts have not been made in the past in wealthier portions of the Diocese, and suggests that greater efforts and more thorough organization be adopted to increase the Mission Fund of the Diocese.

II. Resolved, That the present Mission grants being now at starvation point, it would be fatal to make any reduction at present; but if this, and the consequent closing of the nine Missions aforementioned, be found inevitable, this meeting recommends that a grant be made to each Missionary concerned to enable him to seek another field of labour.

III. Resolved, That in the opinion of this meeting the Deanery of St. Andrew's may reasonably be expected to raise the sum of eleven hundred dollars (\$1100) for the Mission Fund, provided that no further reduction be made beyond that of the "supplemental" grants.

The following was thought to be a fair adjustment of the "amount proposed to be raised," as per the foregoing Resolution, and the utmost that could be expected from each Parish or Mission, after due effort in each several case.

An informal discussion took place upon the present state of the Mission Fund and the appointment of the Executive Committee. It was thought a remedy might be found in the revival of the old "Church Society" and its mode of management.

The following changes have taken place during the past year: The Rev. R. Ker was appointed to Chelsea, Templeton and Portland in July, 1877, and was recently removed to Buckingham, vacant by the retirement of Dr. Clarke to accept an appointment in the Diocese of Ontario. The Rev. H. J. Evans was appointed to Lachute, a Mission recently opened. The Rev. E. Benedict was appointed to the Mission of Bristol in September, 1877.

Chelsea is being served the present year by the Rev. F. R. Smith. Templeton will have fortnightly services on week days, conducted by the Rev. R. Ker. No provision has yet been made for Portland, an important station connected with Chelsea, but at a distance of 30 miles from that place. A resident Missionary should be placed there at the earliest possible moment, who should serve adjacent settlements, at present without the ministrations of the Church.
