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UNIVERSITY OF TRINITY COLLEGE.

THE UNIVERSITY OF TRINITY COLLEGE was constituted by a Royal Charter, bearing date 16th July, 1852, and was empowered to confer Degrees in Divinity, Arts, Law, and Medicine.

THE CONVOCATION of the University consists of the Chancellor, the Provost, the Professors of Trinity College, and all persons admitted to the Degree of Master of Arts, or to any Degree in Divinity, Law, or Medicine in the University.

THE CHANCELLOR of the University is elected for a term of five years by such members of Convocation as are members of the Church of England, and such Masters of Arts, Bachelors of Medicine having previously taken the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Doctors of Medicine, and graduates in Civil Law or Divinity as are members of the Church of England, and shall have made an annual payment of one dollar to the University. A graduate may at any time compound for all future payments by a payment of ten dollars.

No Degree can be granted by the University, unless a Supplicat for that Degree shall have passed the Convocation, having been previously approved by the Caput.

THE CAPUT consists of the Vice-Chancellor and four members of Convocation, to be elected annually by

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Convocation at the first meeting in the Michaelmas Term.

The University confers no Degree whatever, unless the candidate, being a British subject, has previously signed a declaration of allegiance* to Her Majesty the Queen.

Subscription to the following declaration is also required from members of the Church of England :

"I, A. B., do willingly and heartily declare that I am truly and sincerely a member of the Church of England."

This declaration is dispensed with in the case of Degrees in Arts, Law, and Medicine, if the candidate is not a member of the Church of England.

Proceedings in Arts.

BACHELOR OF ARTS.

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All candidates for this Degree must be Matriculated Students of Trinity College, and have kept nine complete Terms. They will be required by the University to pass the Primary, Previous, and Final Examinations.

Residence and attendance at Lectures may, however, be dispensed with in individual cases, in which application to that effect shall have been made to the Corporation, and the grounds assigned by the applicant unanimously approved by the Corporation. In such cases the applicant must not be less than twenty-five years of age, and will be required to pass the Matriculation Examination, the Primary, the Previous, and the Final Examinations at intervals not less than those which are prescribed in the case of resident students, and to pay for each Examination which he undergoes, in addition to the fees for Matriculation and Degree, the sum of \$5 to the University Chest. The permission to proceed to a degree in this manner by Examinations only, must be given by the Corporation before the candidate presents himself for the Matriculation Examination.

Students attending any Divinity School in connection with the Church of England, will be admitted to the Degree of B.A., on condition of passing the usual

Examinations, viz., the Matriculation, the Primary, the Previous and Final Examinations, at the accustomed times, the Candidate producing on each occasion the necessary certificate from the authorities of his Divinity School, viz., at the Matriculation Examination that he has been admitted as a Student of the School, and at the Primary, Previous, and Final Examinations, that he has kept at least the requisite number of Terms, an l that he is in good standing. Students who do not reside for so long a period as three years may be admitted to the Degree of B.A., on condition of keeping at Trinity College the rest of the Terms required, and of passing the necessary Examinations. Or they may make, severally, application to the Corporation of Trinity College to be allowed to avail themselves of the Statute under which applications are admitted to the Degree of B.A., by Examination only.

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/Undergraduates of other Universities may, at the discretion of the Provost, be admitted *ad eundem* statum, up to the end of the Second Year, provided they have kept their terms by attending Lectures and passing Examinations.

I. THE PRIMARY EXAMINATION.

This Examination will take place at the end of the first year. The subjects for this Examination will be: DIVINITY.—One of the Historical Books of the New Testament in Greek. Church Catechism. CLASSICS. –Portions of two Greek and two Latin Authors. Greek and Latin Grammar. Latin Prose Composition.

MATHEMATICS. —Euclid, I., II., 11I., IV., VI. Algebra to the end of Progressions. Trigonometry, to Solution of Triangles inclusive.

PHYSICAL SCIENCE. - Elementary Natural Philosophy.

FRENCH.—Grammar to Syntax, and a portion or portions of some Standard French Author or Authors.

The particular Authors will be announced at the beginning of the Lent Term of the preceding year.

The names of Students who pass this Examination will be arranged in three classes, in alphabetical order; the first class consisting of those who shall have obtained at least sixty per cent. of the total marks of the examination, the second, of those who shall have obtained forty-five per cent., the third, of those who have satisfied the examiners, but have obtained less than forty-five per cent.

A Student who shall obtain a First Class in the Primary Examination, and shall pass a satisfactory examination in the Classical or Mathematical Honour subjects of the first year, shall be allowed to declare for Honours, and may claim exemption from attendance at lectures during the second year in all other departments except Divinity, and that for which he has declared for Honours, and shall not be required to pass in the Previous Examination in those departments from which he has been thus exempted. sec be

II. THE PREVIOUS EXAMINATION.

This Examination will take place at the end of the second year. The subjects for this Examination will be:---

DIVINITY.—One of the Historical Books of the New Testament in Greek. Evidences of Christianity. Church Catechism.

CLASSICS.—Portions of two Greek and two Latin Authors. Greek and Latin Grammar. Latin Prose Composition.

MATHEMATICS.—Euclid, Books I., II., III., IV., VI. Algebra, to the end of Progression. Trigonometry, to Solution of Triangles inclusive. Elementary Statics.

PHYSICAL SCIENCE.—Chemistry of the non-metallic elements and of the Metals.

FRENCH.—Grammar, and portions of some Standard French Authors.

The particular Authors will be announced at the beginning of the Lent Term of the preceding year.

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The names of Students who pass this Examination will be arranged in the same manner as in the case of the First Year Examination.

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A Student who has been entitled to claim exemption from certain lectures during his second year, and from part of the Previous Examination, may claim similar exemption from lectures during his third year and in the Final Examination, provided that he has passed a satisfactory examination in his Honour subjects at the end of his second year and has satisfied the Examiner in Divinity in the Previous Examination.

A Student who has not been entitled to exemption from any lectures in the second year, and from a portion of the Previous Examination will be entitled to claim such exemption during his third year and in the Final Examination, if he obtain a First Class in the Previous Examination, and pass a satisfactory examination in Honours, either in Classics or Mathematics, at the end of his second year.

FRENCH.-Grammar, and portions of some Standard French Authors.

The particular Authors will be announced at the beginning of the Lent Term of the Second Year.

The Authors appointed for this Examination in 1883, are -

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Acts of the Apostles. Sophocles, Antigone. Demosthenes, Meidias. Tacitus, Histories, Book I. Juvenal, Satires, I.-XIV., omitting II., VI. IX. Madame de Stael, L'Allemagne 2nd part, to end of Chap. XVIII. Corneille, Cinna.

Students will be required to take French in two only of the three Examinations, one of which must be the Previous Examination.

Those Students who shall have been rejected at the regular Examination of their own year, or who shall have been absent from such Examination, may present themselves at a Supplementary Examination which will be held in the beginning of the Michaelmas Term, and those who then fail to pass will be required to attend the same Examination of the succeeding year.

Students who have failed at their annual regular examination in not more than three departments, or their equivalent (Classics and Mathematics each being reckoned as two for this purpose), may be permitted, if the Examiners think fit, to present themselves for examination in those departments at the following Supplementary Examination.

Students proposing to attend the Supplementary Examination are required to pay a fee of five dollars, which fee, together with a notice of his intention to present himself for examination, the Candidate must transmit to the Registrar on or before September 10th.

HONOUR EXAMINATION AT B.A.

Candidates who shall have been approved in the required part of the Pass Examination of B.A. may present themselves for further Examination for Honours in Classics or Mathematics. The result of such examination will be published in the College Hall, in three classes; the order of merit in each department ma ma SU

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being determined by the number of marks obtained in this Examination, together with those obtained in that department in the Pass Examination.

The Examiners in Classics or Mathematics may, at their discretion, add a fourth Honorary Class to their Honour List, consisting of those who, not being candidates for Honours, have highly distinguished themselves in the Classical or Mathematical parts of the Pass Examination respectively.

Candidates for honours who shall have claimed exemption from any part of the Final Examination though they have failed to obtain a Class in Honours, may be granted the Degree of B.A., on the recommendation of the Examiners.

He will be required to write a Thesis on some Scriptural subject, to be appointed by the Examiners, and to preach a Sermon before the University. He will be required to pass an Examination in some Latin or Greek Treatise or Treatises to be appointed by the Examiners.

The subjects for 1882 are the following :---

Thesis—The significance of the Pentecostal signs in Acts, ch. II.

Eusebius, Ecclesiastical History, Book V.

St. Cyril of Jerusalem, Catecheses III., IV., and V.

St. Augustine, Enchiridion.

The Thesis is to be sent in to the Provost on or before the 1st of September, 1882, and the Candidates will be notified of the time at which the Examination will be held, which will not be earlier than the 1st of October.

DOCTOR OF DIVINITY.

The Candidate for this Degree must be a Bachelor of Divinity of five years' standing.

He will be required to write a Thesis, as in the case of a Bachelor of Divinity, and to preach a Sermon before the University.

The subject of the Thesis for 1882 is :

The Progress and Development of the Struggle of the Church with Judaism in the Apostolic Age.

Proceedings in Medicine.

BACHELOR OF MEDICINE.

The Candidate for this Degree must have passed the Matriculation Examination of Trinity College, or of some other recognized University, or that accepted by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.

He must be of the full age of twenty-one years and produce a satisfactory certificate of good conduct.

He must produce certificates of having pursued his Medical studies for a period of four years, and of having attended the following courses of Lectures :—

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PRIMARY EXAMINATION IN MEDICINE.

This Examination shall take place at the end of the Second Year.

The subjects of this Examination are, Descriptive Anatomy, Physiology and Histology, Chemical Physics and General Chemistry, Practical Chemistry, Botany, Sanitary Science, Materia Medica, and Toxicology.

FINAL EXAMINATION IN MEDICINE.

This Examination shall take place at the end of the Fourth Year.

The subjects of this Examination are, Theory and Practice of Medicine including Medical Pathology, Principles and Practice of Surgery, Midwifery and Diseases of Women and Children, Medical Jurisprudence, Sanitary Science.

The Primary and Final Examinations may be taken together at the end of the Fourth Year.

DOCTOR OF MEDICINE.

The Candidate for this Degree must have been admitted to the Degree of M.B. at least six months previously.

He must send in a Thesis on some Medical subject, which must be approved of by the Medical Examiners,

MASTER OF SURGERY.

The Candidate for this Degree must have been admitted to the Degree of M.B., at least six month. previously.

He must send in a Thesis on some Surgical subjects which must be approved of by the Medical Examiners.

Proceedings in Law.

BACHELOR OF CIVIL LAW.

The Candidate for this Degree must have passed the Matriculation Examination of Trivity College, or the Examination required by the Law Society of Upper Canada for the admission of a Student-at-Law. He must be of the standing of three years from the date of Matriculation.

Except in the cases hereinafter mentioned, he must pass three Examinations, to be called the First, Second, and Final Examinations in Law.

He must be of the full age of twenty-three years.

If the Candidate produce a certificate of his having been called to the Degree of Barrister-at-Law by any Law Society in Her Majesty's Dominions, and be a Graduate in Arts of the University of Trinity College, or of any recognized University, (or not being such Graduate, if three years have elapsed from the date of such call), the first two Examinations may be dispensed with, and the Degree of B.C.L. may be conferred after the Candidate has passed the Final Examination only.

The Examinations in Law will be held at the same time as the Examinations in Arts in June, and Candidates for any Examination must give notice to the Registrar at least four weeks before the first day of June.

FIRST EXAMINATION IN LAW.

The subjects of this Examination are, Constitutional History (Stubbs and the British North America Act), Equity (Snell), Contracts (Pollock), Real Property (Williams), Hallam's Middle Ages, Chapter II., Roman Law (Gibbon, Chap. XLIV.; Arnold, Chaps. XIII., XIV., XVI., and XXVI.)

SECOND EXAMINATION IN LAW.

The subjects of this Examination are, Political Economy (Jevons), Law of Evidence (Powell), Law of Torts (Underhill), Criminal Law (Harris's Blackstone, Vol. IV.), Common Law (Broom, Smith's Mercantile Law), Roman Law (Tompkins and Jenckens's Compendium.)

FINAL EXAMINATION IN LAW.

The subjects of this Examination are, Constitutional History (Taswell and Langmead; British North America Act and cases thereunder), Real Property, (Leith's Blackstone; Flood on Wills or Theobald on Wills), Law of Evidence (Best, Stephen), Roman Law (Tompkins and Jenckens's Compendium; Justinian, Sandar's Edition; Mackenzie), International Law (Von Savigny; Phillimore), Jurisprudence (Maine's Ancient Law), Equity (Lewin on Trusts.)

DOCTOR OF CIVIL LAW.

The Candidate for this Degree must be a Bachelor of Civil Law of five years' standing complete.

He must have composed a Thesis on some Legal subject to be appointed by the Chancellor.
Proceedings in Music.

BACHELOR OF MUSIC.

The Candidate for this degree must have employed five years in the study and practice of the Faculty of Music, and at the end of that term he must produce a testimonial under the hands of credible witnesses of his having done so.

He must compose a song or anthem in four parts, and perform the same publicly in the Convocation Hall, and must also pass such an Examination as shall satisfy the Examiner in Music that he has sufficient acquaintance with the theory of music to compose such an exercise.

DOCTOR OF MUSIC.

The Candidate for this degree must produce a testimonial under the hands of credible witnesses of his having studied in this faculty for three years subsequently to his admission to the degree of Bachelor of Music.

He must compose a song or anthem in six or eight parts, with orchestral accompaniments, and perform the same publicly in the Convocation Hall.

Trinity College.

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TRINITY COLLEGE was, by an Act of the Legislature of the Province of Canada, passed in the year of our Lord, 1851, constituted a body corporate, consisting of the Lord Bishop of Toronto (or, in case of the division of the Diocese of Toronto, of the Bishops of the several Dioceses into which the Diocese of Toronto shall be divided), the Trustees of the College and the College Council.

On the 1st of January, 1850, an Act of the Provincial Legislature came into operation, constituting the University of Toronto; and, under the provisions of this Act, the Faculty of Divinity was suppressed, and other changes made in King's College, now known as University College.

These important changes in the Constitution of a foundation, which owed its origin mainly to the longcontinued and persevering efforts of the Bishop of Toronto, appeared to his Lordship, and to the great body of the Churchmen of this Province, to render indispensable the erection of a College under the control of the Church of England, but open to members of other religious bodies, in which secular instruction should not be disociated from religious teaching.

The Bishop, consequently, on the 7th of February, 1850, issued a Pastoral Letter to the Clergy and Laity of the Diocese inviting their co-operation in the good work. This appeal was nobly responded to, and about \$10 in b Iı whe out of th thou dred a h Tore ledg vers scrip pour 0 ston 15th and com \mathbf{I} Arc Eng D.I in t scrip whe of t mor V sam by t 3 \$100,000 was subscribed in money, lands, and stock in building societies.

In the same year his Lordship proceeded to England, where he received very liberal assistance in carrying out his great design. The Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, made a vote of two thousand pounds, payable by instalments of four hundred pounds per annum; and also gave seven acres and a half of land within the precincts of the City of Toronto. The Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge granted three thousand pounds; and the University of Oxford five hundred pounds. The subscriptions of individuals exceeded four thousand pounds.

On Wednesday, April 30th, 1851, the foundation stone of the College was laid, and on Thursday, the 15th of January, 1852, the Inauguration took place, and from that day the regular course of instruction commenced.

In the year 1852, the Ven. A. N. Bethune, D.D., Archdeacon of York, raised further subscriptions in England: and in 1852-3, the Rev. Wm. McMurray, D. D., by the appointment of the Bishop, made a tour in the United States, for the purpose of soliciting subscriptions on behalf of the College. He met everywhere with a most cordial reception from the members of the sister Church; and obtained, in books and money, little short of \$10,000.

Within the Diocese successful efforts were at the same time made by the Rev. T. B. Fuller, D.D., and by the Rev. Saltern Givins ; the former, by the Bishop's

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appointment, undertaking the canvas of the Western —the latter, that of the Eastern section of the Diocese.

In April, 1853, Dr. Burnside placed at the disposal of the College the munificent sum of \$24,000, in lands and money—a portion of which has been devoted to the foundation of two Burnside Scholarships for Students in Arts, in order permanently to associate with the College the name of this noble benefactor.

In the year 1864, the Rev. William McMurray, D.D., D.C.L., Rector of Niagara, was deputed by the Corporation of Trinity College, to visit England for the purpose of seeking aid towards the endowment of the College. The result of his laborious and successful endeavours was the realizing of an amount in money, and in books of about \$20,000. The books are mentioned in detail in the account given of the Library of the College. Dr. McMurray's mission having been interrupted by the necessity of returning to Canada, the Rev. W. S. Darling, in the following year, took up the unfinished work, and succeeded in collecting \$2,526.

The Hon. James Gordon, bequeathed to the College in 1865, the sum of \$2,000.

In the year 1866, Enoch Turner, Esq., of Toronto, bequeathed to the College \$8,000, "to be applied towards carrying on the charitable and holy purposes for which the College was incorporated."

Thomas Clark Street, Esq., bequeathed to the College, in the year 1871, the sum of \$4,000.

In the year 1876, the family of the late James Henderson, Esq., of Yorkville, desirous of carrying into ef

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Heninto effect the intention of their father, for which he had made no provision in his will, gave the College \$4,000. This sum, together with Mr. Street's legacy of \$4,000, has been applied towards the erection of a Convocation Hall, which was formally opened on November 15th, 1877, the occasion of the installation of the Hon. G. W. Allan, D.C.L., as Chancellor of the University.

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Other benefactors to the College will be found mentioned in connection with the Library, or under the head of Scholarships.

The Corporation of Trinity College.

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The Corporation, by an Act of the Legislature of the Province of Canada (15 Vic. ch. 32), is composed of the Bishops of the five Dioceses into which the original Diocese of Toronto has been divided, of the Trustees of Trinity College, and of the members of the Council of Trinity College. The College Council consists of three classes of members :- ex officio, nominated, and elected members. The ex officio members are the Chancellor of the University of Trinity College, the ex-Chancellors, the Provost of Trinity College, and the Senior Professors of Classics and Mathematics. Sixteen members are nominated, four by each of the Bishops of Toronto. Huron, Ontario, and Niagara. Fifteen members are elected; eight by the same electors as the Chancellor, (See page 17), to hold office for four years, two being elected in each year, and the remaining seven by the whole Corporation.

Library.

The College Library contains about 5,000 volumes. 600 of which were a gift from the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge. About the same number were sent from England by private benefactors before the College was opened. Valuable additions have been made to the library by the Government of the State of New York, by the Smithsonian Institute, and by Columbia College. The first Bishop of Toronto also presented upwards of 300 volumes, including many valuable works in Theological, Classical, and General Literature, and at his death bequeathed to the College the remainder of his extensive and valuable Library. The University of Oxford made a munificent grant of books, published at the University Press, of the value of £150 sterling; and Trinity College, Dublin, kindly presented copies of the works published by the University, amounting to upwards of 80 volumes.

In the year 1853, Captain (now Major General Sir Henry) Lefroy sent from England 169 volumes as a gift to the College Library.

In 1867, the Rev. John Smithurst bequeathed his Library to the College;
In 1870, T. H. Rivingston, Esq., presented 35 volumes;

In 1880, the Rev. C. J. S. Bethune, M.A., presented 100 volumes selected from the Library of the late Bishop of Toronto.

The Fees for Degrees and the annual payments of Members of Convocation are applied to the purchase of Books for the Library.

Museum.

The vestibule of the present building has been fitted up for the temporary reception of a Museum of Natural History, towards which many Mineralogical, Geological, and other specimens have been contributed.

Two SCHOLARSHIPS, founded by the late ALEXANDER BURNSIDE, Esq., of the value of \$160, awarded at the end of the first year, one for Classics and the other for Mathematics.

THREE SCHOLARSHIPS of the value of \$40 each, awarded at the end of the first year, for Divinity, Physical Science and French.

Two SCHOLARSHIPS, founded by the late Duke of WELLINGTON, of the value of \$160, tenable for one year, awarded at the end of the second year, one for Classics and the other for Mathematics.

THREE SCHOLARSHIPS, of the value of \$40 each, awarded at the end of the second year, for Divinity, Physical Science and French.

Two SCHOLARSHIRS, founded by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, from the Jubilee Fund of the year 1851, of the annual value of \$160, tenable for two years One of these scholarships is awarded yearly to the most deserving Bachelor of the year, who, has obtained at least second class Honours in Classics or Mathematics. On admission to the Scholarship, a declaration must be signed by the holder that it is his purpose to complete the Divinity Course of two years in Trinity College, and to present himself as a Candidate for Holy Orders, and should he fail to do so, he will be held bound to refund to the College such proceeds of the Scholarship as he shall have received.

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THE SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF TORONTO provides Exhibitions, tenable by Students of Trinity College.

Exhibitioners are also nominated by the DIOCESE OF ONTARIO.

C. W. Cooper, Esq., of Mount Pleasant, left by will in 1866, the sum of \$4,000 in City of Hamilton debentures, for the purpose of endowing an Exhibition to be held in Trinity College, the Exhibitioner to be nominated by the Executors of Mr. Cooper's will during their lives, and afterwards by the Bishop of Toronto. The present value of the Exhibition is \$200, it is tenable for one year, and any matriculated Student of the College, not holding a Scholarship, is eligible, with a preference in all cases to the sons of Clergymen.

The Corporation has also provided that four Bur-

saries shall be open every year, tenable from year to year, for a period not exceeding three years, of the value of \$62 per annum. Any student who shall have passed the Matriculation Examination, and shall have satisfied the Corporation that he cannot, without the aid thus afforded, avail himself of the advantages of a University Education, shall be eligibile for a Bursary, provided that he is not the holder of a Scholarship or Exhibition. *Ceteris paribus*, the sons of Clergymen will be preferred.

These Scholarships, Exhibitions, and Bursaries are held during good behaviour, with the further condition in the case of Scholarships, that the holder thereof shall attend Honour lectures, and satisfy the Professors in such lectures.

DIVINITY CLASS.

The following persons may be admitted to the Divinity Class: (1) Graduates in Arts of Trinity College, or of other Universities in which Classics form a part of the course required for the B.A. Degree. (2) Undergraduates of Trinity College and of such other Universities aforesaid, being of the full age of twenty-one years, who have attended the lectures of the Arts Course for one year, and have passed the Examination at the end of the first year of such Course.

Graduates of Universities, other than Trinity College, must pass an Examination in all the Divinity subjects required in the Final Examination for the Degree of B.A. in Trinity College.

Previously to admission each Student must subscribe to the Thirty-nine Articles.

The period of study will in all cases be two years; and no certificate in the Theological Department can be granted within this time, and unless the Student has attended Chapels and Lectures as required by the Statutes.

FEES FOR TUITION AND BOARD.

The tuition fees for resident Students are \$55 per annum, and for non-resident Students \$65 per annum.

The charge for rent of rooms and board of resident Students is \$165 per annum.

These fees are payable in three instalments, terminally, in advance, and on payment being made during

the first fortnight of term, a discount of 10 per cent. is allowed, thus reducing the annual charges to \$198 and \$58.50 for resident and non-resident Students respectively.

Annual Prizes.

HAMILTON MEMORIAL PRIZE.

The family of the late MRS. JOHN HAMILTON, of Hawkesbury, have founded, in her memory, an annual prize of \$30 in books, under the following regulations:

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I. The Prize to be called 'the HAMILTON MEMORIAL PRIZE, is to be awarded according to the result of an annual Examination in Scripture History, including such books, illustrative of Scripture History, Antiquities and Interpretation, as may from time to time be selected.

II. All Students belonging to the Divinity Class, as well as all others who have passed through their Theological course, and have not attained M.A. standing, shall be eligible as candidates.

III. The Examination shall take place at the end of the Lept Term in each year.

IV. All Students belonging to the Theological Class at the time shall be required to attend the Examination.

V. The Examiners shall be empowered to withhold the prize, if no Candidate be found worthy.

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Trinity College School.

"Beati mundo corde."

The School was first established in the village of Weston, near Toronto, and was opened on the first of May, 1865, under the Head-Mastership of the Rev. C. H. Badgley, M.A. During the summer of 1868, the School was removed to Port Hope. In January, 1872, the first portion of the new buildings was completed and occupied. The School premises now consist of over twenty acres of land, affording ample space for large Cricket and Foot-ball grounds, situated on high land outside the town of Port Hope; the large and handsome building, including a beautiful Chapel, presents a south front of about three hundred feet in length, and a west front of eighty feet, it is capable of containing a School of upwards of 150 boys.

Trinity College School was, by an Act of the Legis lature of the Province of Ontario, passed during the Session of 1871-2, constituted a corporate body, consisting of the Lord Bishop of Toronto, the Chancellor of the University of Trinity College, the Provost, and

the Professors in Arts of Trinity College, the Head Master of the School, and such other persons as may from time to time be appointed by the Governing Body.

The Course of Instruction includes all the usual branches of a sound education in Classics, Mathematics, English, German, French, Natural Sciences, Bookkeeping, Drawing, Vocal Music, and Military Drill. Pupils are prepared for the Matriculation Examination of the Universities, and the Entrance Examinations of the Law and Medical Schools, the Royal Military College, the Army, Navy, &c. In the Modern Department special attention is directed to preparation for commercial pursuits. The discipline and general management of the School are based upon the English Public School System.
