

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

MINUTES

OF THE

SYNOD OF HAMILTON AND LONDON,

OF THE

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CANADA.

At London, and within the First Presbyterian Church there, the twentieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, at half past seven o'clock, p. m, which day and place the Synod of Hamilton and London, of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, met, and after sermon by the Rev. Archibald McLean, the retiring Moderator, from Matthew's gospel, chap. 13, v. 5_{1} - 5_{2} , was duly constituted by prayer.

CONGREGATIONAL CHANGES.

PRESBYTERY OF HAMILTON,-

Southampton and West Arran were disjoined, and formed into separate pastoral charges, on April 3rd, 1891.

ELECTION OF MODERATOR.

The Roll having been called, and the attendance marked, the Moderator briefly addressed the court, thanking the Synod for the honor they con ferred upon him last year, and intimating that the first business was the election of a new Moderator.

On motion of Mr. W. S. Ball, seconded by Dr. McMullen, Mr. Andrew Tolmie of Southampton, was unanimously elected Moderator, and took the chair accordingly.

VOTE OF THANKS TO THE RETIRING MODERATOR.

On motion of Mr. A. D. McDonald, seconded by Mr. Robert Hamilton, a cordial voie of thanks was tendered the retiring Moderator for his excellent simon at the opening of the Synod, and the discharge of his duties during the year.

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COMMITTEE TO STRIKE STANDING COMMITTEES.

On motion duly seconded, the Moderator was requested to nominate a committee to strike the Standing Committees for the year.

SEDERUNTS OF THE SYNOD.

It was agreed that the Sederunts of the Synod should be from 9 a. m.te 12 noon; from 2 p. m. to 5.30 p. m.; and from 7.30 p. m. to 10 p. m.; and that the first hour of the next Sederunt should be spent in devotional exercises, the Synod to meet for business to-morrow morning at to a. m.

The Ex-Moderator stated that he had at the request of the Dominion alliance appointed the Hon. Senator Vidal, Mr. Ramsay and Mr. Jas. Scott to the last meeting of this body at Montreal. His conduct was approved.

The Synod then adjourned, to meet to-morrow morning for devotional exercises at 9 a. m., and for business at 10 a. m., and was closed by the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

SECOND SEDERUNT.

At London, and within the First Presbyterian Church there, the twenty first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety one years at 9 a. m.

The Synod met again, persuant to adjournment, when devotional exercises were engaged in from 9 to 10 a.m., in which the Moderator and Messrs. Ball, Little, Ratcliffe, McQuarrie and McLean took part, after which the Synod was duly constituted.

The minutes of former sederunt were read and sustained.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON BILLS AND OVERTURES.

Mr. Jas. Gourlay, Clerk of the Committee on Bills and Overtures,

gave in the first report, as to the business to come before the Synod at the morning and evening Sederunts. On motion the report was adopted.

COMMITTEE TO NOMINATE STANDING COMMITTEES.

The Moderator nominated the following, to be a Committee to strike the Standing Committees for the ensuing year : Dr. Fletcher, convener ; Dr McMullen, Messrs John L. Murray, Geo. Cuthbertson, A. F. Tully, Jas. Gourlay, ministers ; and Messrs. David Wylie, Hugh McQuarrie, and I. Dickson.

KNOX CHURCH, STRATFORD,—MR. MACPHERSON'S RETIRING ALLOWANCE.

A minute of the Stratford Presbytery was read, to the effect that Knox Church, Stratford, had obeyed the recommendation of Synod as to paying Mr. MacPherson the amount agreed upon at the former meeting-The Synod expressed its satisfaction at the fact, and discharged the com. mittee in charge of this matter.

BUXTON FUND.

The Clerk read the report of the Committee on the Buxton Fund, showing that the sum of \$231.45 had been received during the year and paid over to Mr. King. On motion of Dr. Cochrane, duly seconded, the report was received and adopted, thanks tendered to the convener and the committee, and the committee re-appointed for the following year. The committee is as follows : Dr. J. R. Battisby, convener, and Messrs. A. McColl and W. Walker, ministers ; and Messrs. J. A. Taylor and K, Urquhart, elders.

DIVISION OF MISSION FIELD IN THE BRUCE PRESBYTERY.

At the request of the representatives of the Maitland and Bruce Presbytery, this matter was laid over for consideration until next meeting of the Synod.

OVERTURE IN RE POSTURE IN WORSHIP.

An overture transmitted by the Presbytery of Huron, anent position in public prayer was read, and on motion, was transmitted simpliciter to the General Assembly.

BRANTFORD YOUNG LADIES COLLEGE.

Dr. Cochrane presented the report of the Brantford Young Ladies College, giving details of the highly satisfactory condition of every depart ment, and the largely increased attendance during the year. Remarks by

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Messrs. Ball, Hamilton and McKibbin followed, testifying to the excellent work being done, and commending it to the members of Synod and their congregations. After which on motion of Mr. J. C. Tibb, the following resolution was unanimously adopted. "The Synod expresses its satisfaction at the thorough efficiency of the college, and gladly recognize the excellent work done during the past year. The Synod also records its satisfaction that the college has still the advantage of Dr. Cochrane's oversight and direction, and that the staff of teachers is so complete and thorough. Further, the Synod commends the institution to friends and guardians, as one wherein young ladies may not only have a thorough christain training, but also a religious home, and appoints the Rev. E. Cochburn, M. A., of Paris, as visiting Director for the ensuing year.

The business for the forenoon sederunt having been finished, the Synod agreed to adjourn at 1: a. m., to enable Presbyteries and Committees to meet for the transaction of business.

The Synod then adjourned to meet again at 2 p. m., and the Moderator pronounced the benediction.

THIRD SEDERUNT.

First Presbyterian Church, London, the twenty-first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, 2 p. m.

The Synod again met, pursuant to adjournment, and was duly constituted after devotional exercises, and prayer by the Moderator.

The minutes of former sederunt were read and sustained.

COMMITTEE ON BILLS AND OVERTURES.

Mr. Gourlay presented a second report of the Committee on Bills and Overtures, which was adopted, as the business of the afternoon.

NORTH WEST MISSIONS.

Dr. Robertson. superintendent of missions for the N. W., being present was asked to address the court, which he did, giving interesting details of our work there. On motion of Mr. Robert Hamilton, a cordial vote of thanks was tendered Dr. Robertson for his address. The Synod also

pledged itself to take a still deeper interest in the great claims of the North West and British Columbia.

DEPUTATION FROM THE LONDON MINISTERIAL ASSOCIATION.

On motion of Dr. Proudfoot, seconded by Mr. J. A. Murray, a deputation from the London Ministerial Alliance, was invited to the platform and asked to address the Synod. The deputation consisted of Rev. Messrs. Carr, (Congregationalist), McDonagh, (Methodist), and Smith (Baptist.)

After the Moderator had tendered them the cordial greetings of the Synod, Mr. Carr presented the fraternal greetings of the Association to the Synod in eloquent and appropriate terms. The Moderator responded to the greetings of Mr. Carr in fitting words.

JURISDICTION OF THE EAST WILLIAMS CONGREGATION.

The Synod proceeded to take up the matter of the placing of the congregation of East Williams under the jurisdiction of the Presbytery of London or that of Sarnia, which was laid over from last meeting of Synod.

The papers in the case having been read, Messrs. Ballantyne, Currie, and Henderson were heard on behalf of the Presbytery of London, Messrs. Cuthbertson and Currie on behalf of the Presbytery of Sarnia, and Mr. Ross on behalf of the congregation of East Williams.

After the representatives had been fully heard, and questions asked by the members of Court, the Synod proceeded to deliberate.

It was moved by Mr. W. J. Dey, seconded by Mr. Martin, that the petition of the memorial be granted, and the congregation of East Williams be placed under the care of the Presbytery of Sarnia.

It was moved in amendment by Mr. George Sutherland, seconded by Dr. Fletcher, that the petition of the memorial be granted, and the congregation of East Williams placed under the care of the Presbytery of London.

On the vote being taken 67 voted for the amendment, and 60 for the motion, and the Synod discerned accordingly, that the congregation of East Williams be placed under the jurisdiction of the London Presbytery.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned to meet again at 7.30 p. m., and the Moderator pronounced the benediction.

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FOURTH SEDERUNT.

First Presbyterian Church, London, the twenty-first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, 7.30 p. m.

The Synod again met pursuant to adjournment, and was duly constituted by the Moderator, Mr. John Eadie leading the Synod in prayer.

The minutes of former sederunt were read and sustained.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES.

Reports from the various Standing Committees were called for, and presented as follows: That on the state of religion by Mr. Farquaharson, that on Temperance by Mr. Cockburn, that on Sabbath observance by Mr. Musgrave, and that on Sabbath schools by Mr. Dey, in the absence of Mr. Nisbet, the convener.

After the reports had been read, devotional exercises were engaged in, Mr. A. I. MacKenzie leading the Synod in prayer.

Thereafter on motion of Mr. R. Hamilton, the reports were receivedand thanks tendered the various conveners. It was also agreed to consider the recommendation of the several reports.

The recommendations of the committee on the state of religion were adopted.

1. That sessions be commended to hold fast in their efforts to have the prayer meeting attendance increased.

2. That sessions meet as often as possible for prayer or conference, touching the spiritual condition of their congregations.

3. That attention be called to the recommendation of last Assembly, "that as a means of developing the gifts and graces of the young, a Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor, or similar associations be organized in congregations, the constitution of such societies in all cases to be approved by the session of the congregation in which the society is organized."

The recommendations of the Committee on Temperance, were adopted, as follows:

1. That since Christ alone can save men, purify society, and make us a temperance people, we give ourselves in promoting the cause of temperance, with renewed diligence, to hold up Christ in our pulpits, prayer meetings, Sabbath schools and families, and in the community, as the only Saviour from sin.

2. That members and officebearers of the church, be urged to

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inculcate and practice total abstinance, as the only safe and consistent course.

3. That the attention of sessions be called, to the almost complete absence of temperance organizations within the congregations, encourage their formation, especially Bands of Hope, so that the young may be saved from the ravages of strong drink.

4. That all available means be used to secure in our public and high schools instruction in temperance, and that pupils be examined on this as in other branches of learning.

5. That as the Synod regards the general traffic in intoxicating liquors, to be contrary to the word of God, and the spirit of the Christian religion, and that total prohibition would be the most effective form of legislation, urges upon the officebearers, members and addreants of the church, the necessity of using all legitimate means to secure this end.

The recommendation of the Committee on Sabbath observance was adopted as follows: That the different Presbyteries in the Synod take order to deal therewith in any way, which to themselves may seem wise, so that a more satisfactory presentation may be made of the state of the church, on this very important subject, at the subsequent meetings of this Synod.

The recommendations of the committee on Sabbath schools, were adopted as follows.

I. That sessions direct the attention of our Sabbath schools to the fact, that less than one half of their pupils are reported as preparing the lessons at home, as committing scripture, and the shorter catechism to memory, or as attending church.

2. That this Sýnod, warmly commend the scheme for higher religious education, to the careful attention of the schools within its bounds.

It was also agreed that the conveners of the committees of the various Presbyteries, be *ax-officio* members of the Synodical committees on these several questions.

COMMITTEE ON LICENSING OF STUDENTS.

Dr. McMullen from the committee on the licensing of students, gave in their report, recommending that leave be given to the Presbytery of Hamilton to take on trial for license Messrs. J. S. Comming, T. H. Rodgers, H. T. Percival, T. Elliott, and P. M. McEachern, and to the Presbytery of Bruce, Mr. John K. MacGillivray.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned to meet again at 9 a. m. to-morrow morning, and the Moderator pronounced the benediction.

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FIFTH SEDERUNT.

First Presbyterian Church, London, the twenty second day of April. one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, 9 a. m.

The Synod again met pursuant to adjournment, and was duly constituted, the Moderator and Mr. John Thomson conducting the devotional exercises.

The-minutes of last sederunt were read and sustained.

DOMINION ALLIANCE.

A communication from Mr. F. S. Spence, Secretary of the Dominion Alliance was read, asking the Synod to appoint delegates to the next meeting of the Alliance to be held in Toronto on Sept. 10th.

Consideration of the matter was deferred till a later sederunt.

PRESBYTERY RECORDS.

The committee appointed to examine the Records of the Presbyteries of Hamilton, Paris, London, Sarnia, Chatham, Huron, Stratford, Maitland, and Bruce, having reported the same as carefully and correctly kept, the Records were ordered to be attested accordingly.

STANDING COMMITTEES.

Dr. Fletcher convener of the committee, to nominate standing committees reported, the recommendations of the committee were adopted, and the Standing Committees appointed as follows :

State of Religion.—Mr. W. Farquharson, convener; Messrs. H. McQuarrie, S. Lyle, J. A. Murray, ministers; James Rowand, M.P., D.D., Wilson and J. Dixon, eld rs; with the conveners of the Presbyterial committees on the state of religion.

Temperance.—Mr. E. Cockburn, M. A., convener; Messrs. A. Beamer, and Alex. Sutherland, ministers; Hon. A. Vidal, John Charlton, M. P., Duncan Stewart, John M. Marten, and James Bell, elders; with the conveners of the Presbyterial committee on temperance.

Sabbath Schools.—Mr. T. W. Nesbit, convener; Messrs. J. W. Dey, J. C. Tibb, Andrew Henderson, ministers; and Messrs. A. Campbell, J. P. S., Andrew Thompson, Geo. Rutherford and W. N. Hossie, elders; with the conveners of the Presbyterial committees on Sabbath schools.

Sabbath Observance.—Mr. P. Musgrave, convener; Dr. Thompson, Dr. Laidlaw, J. W. Mitchell, and Mr. John Gray, ministers; and Messrs. D. K. MacKenzie, Alex. Barlett, Peter Marshall, and Thomas Gordon, elders; with the conveners of the Presbyterial committees on Sabbath observance.

NEXT MEETING OF SYNOD.

It was agreed to hold the next meeting of Synod at Stratford, and within Knox church there, on the third Monday of April 1892.

PROTEST AND COMPLAINT OF MR. JAMES WATSON, AGAINST HAMILTON PRESBYTERY, ETC.

The Synod proceeded to consider the protest and complaint of Mr. James Watson, against the Presbytery of Hamilton in re the petition and memorial from the session of St. Pauls church, Hamilton.

Parties were called to the bar, when there appeared Mr. James Watson, for himself, and Messrs. Ratcliffe, McCuaig, and Dr. Laing, for the Presbytery. The papers in re the protest and complaint of Mr. Watson, were then read. At this stage the question was raised, whether all the parties in the case were before the court. The parties were then removed from the bar, and on motion, consideration of the case was postponed. The memorial and petition from the session of St. Pauls church, Hamilton, were then read, together with the minutes of the Presbytery of Hamilton, and Mr. Henderson's petition to said Presbytery, in reference to the action of St. Pauls kirk session in his case.

Dr. Laidlaw was then heard on behalf of the memorial and petition from the session of St. Pauls church, Hamilton, asking the Synod to review all the proceedings of the session and Presbytery, and that they also be heard in defence of the action of session, complained against by Mr. Henderson.

It was then moved by Mr. Hector McQuarrie, seconded by Mr. John Gray. that the memorial and petition be received and the prayer of the memorial be granted.

Pending the discussion of this motion the hour of adjournment. arrived, and the Synod accordingly adjourned, the moderator pronouncing the benediction.

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SIXTH SEDERUNT.

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First Presbyterian Church, London, the twenty-second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, 2 p. m.

The Synod met again pursuant to adjournment, and was duly constituted by the Moderator, Mr. Beamer leading the Synod in prayer.

Minutes of last sederunt were read, and after being amended, were susiained.

MEMORIAL AND PETITION OF ST. PAULS CHURCH, HAMILTON.

The Synod resumed discussion of Mr. McQuarrie's motion in this case. After prolonged deliberation the Synod proceeded to vote, when 80 voted for Mr. McQuarrie's motion, and 12 against. The Synod accordingly decided, that the memorial and petition of St. Paul's kirk session be received, and the prayer of their memorial be granted.

Dr. Laing dissented and protested for leave to complain to the General Assembly. Mr. McCuaig asked leave to join in the dissent.

The Synod then proceeded to consider the protest and complaint of Mr. James Watson against the Presbytery of Hamilton, in re the petition and memorial of Mr. George Henderson.

Parties were then called to the bar, when there appeared the Presbytery of Hamilton, Mr. George Henderson, Mr. James Watson, and the Kirk Session of St. Pauls church, Hamilton. The protest and complaint having been read, Mr. Watson was first heard in support of the same, followed by Dr. Laidlaw on behalf of the session of St. Pauls church, Hamilton. Mr. Henderson was then heard in reply for himself, followed by Mr. Ratcliffe on behalf of the Presbytery.

During the address of Mr. Ratcliffe the hour of adjournment arrived, and the Synod adjourned to meet again at 7.30 p. m., the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

SEVENTH SEDERUNT.

First Presbyterian Church, London, the twenty-second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, 7.30 p. m.

The Synod again met pursuant to adjournment, and was duly constituted, the Moderator and Mr. Straith conducting the devotional exercises.

The minutes of former sederunt were read and sustained.

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MR. WATSON'S PROTEST AND COMPLAINT.

The Synod resumed consideration of Mr. Watson's protest and complaint.

Mr. Ratcliffe having closed his remarks, he was followed by Dr. Laing. Mr. Watson the complainant was then heard in reply.

Questions having been asked and answered, parties were removed from the bar.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod agreed to sit until all the business was finished.

Dr. McMullen then moved as follows, seconded by Mr. H. Mc-Quarrie.

"Sustain the dissent and appeal of Mr. Watson, and find that the Presbytery of Hamilton acted irregularly (1) in taking action on the memorial of Mr. Henderson complaining of the action of St. Paul's session affecting himself, without recognizing the right of said session to be heard at the bar of Presbytery in reference of the action complained of ; and (2) in setting aside the action of the session, by giving Mr. Henderson a certificate of full standing from date, while professing to not interfere with the session's action. The Synod accordingly remits the case to the Presbytery, with instructions to cancel the certificate given by the Presbytery, and refer the memorialist to the session of St. Paul's, directing said session to hear and consider the professions of penitence made by him before the Presbytery and also before the Synod, that the session may decide whether the evidence of penitence is satisfactory, and if so, give him a certificate accordingly."

Mr. W. S. Ball moved in amendment, seconded by Rev. C. Fletcher, that the appeal be dismissed and that the action of the Presbytery be sustained.

Mr. W. M. Roger moved in amendment to the amendment as follows, seconded by E. W. Panton.

"That the Synod, having already decided that there were parties in the case not formerly recognized as such by the Presbytery, feels constrained to sustain the appeal as far as the form of procedure is concerned, believing that no substantial injustice has been done the session of St. Paul's church, whose conduct in the case we recognize as in harmony with Christian law and kindness; and that as George Henderson has already undergone a course of practical discipline, the Synod agrees to confirm the certificate given by the Presbytery, and that the Synod commends the

brother who holds it to the kind and faithful care of any congregation with which it is lodged,"

The amendment of Mr. Rodger having been put against that of Mr. Ball, was carried by a large majority.

Dr. Cochrane then moved in amendment to Mr. Rogers amendment, seconded by Mr. R. Hamilton, in the following terms.

"That the Synod sustain the protest and appeal of Mr. Watson in so far as the Synod finds that the appellant had cause for feeling aggrieved at the action of the Presbytery in granting Mr. Henderson the certificate of good standing witnout intimating to or holding conference with the session of St. Paul's church. The Synod, however, believes that the Presbytery in so doing did not intend to reflect upon the action of St. Paul's session, but were actuated by the best of motives, believing that the interests of all concerned would be better conserved than by further discipline, the more especially as Mr. Henderson had appeared before the committee of Presbytery, confessed his faults, expressed contrition therefor, and his determination by God's grace to walk more carefully. Therefore, in view of all the facts brought before them, the Synod feels that the case should now end, and all parties seek the things that make for peace."

This was carried against the amendment of Mr. Roger. Dr. Cochrane's amendment was then put against the main motion of Dr. McMullen, when 21 voted for the amendment and 23 for the motion. The yeas and nays being called for, the motion was carried, yeas 24, nays 18.

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Parties were then recalled to the bar, and the judgement of Synod intimated to them. Mr. Watson and Dr. Laidlaw acquiesced. Mr. Mc-Cuaig dissented; and Mr. Henderson declined to acquiesce in the finding.

OVERTURE FROM CHATHAM PRESBYTERY.

Minutes of the Chatham Presbytery were read, requesting the Synod to transmit the following overture to the General Assembly which on motion was unanimously agreed to.

"To the venerable, the General Assembly, from the Presbytery of Chatham, anent the reception of ministers from other churches.

Whereas, some Presbyterians hold their last regular meeting in March, before General Assembly meets, and whereas, applications for the reception of ministers from other churches, frequently come to hand, so near the meeting of Assembly that it is impossible for some Presbyteries to consider such applications. The Presbytery of Chatham hereby memorialises the General Assembly, asking them to enact that no application be received that has not been made prior to the first of March in each year.

DELEGATES TO DOMINION ALLIANCE.

It was agreed to appoint four delegates to the next meeting of the

Dominion Alliance and on motions duly made and seconded, the following were appointed : Messrs. W. J. Dey, E. Cockburn, M. A., R. H. Abraham, and Senator Vidal.

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REPORT OF THE AUDITORS.

Mr. R. H. Abraham, convener of the Committee, to audit the Treasurers books, reported them as correct, but that there were arrears to the amount of \$250. The report was received and the thanks of the Synod tendered Mr. George Rutherford, the Treasurer, tor his long continued and faithful services.

JESUIT ESTATE ACT.

Dr. Laing on behalf of the committee in charge of this matter, reported that there had been nothing further done during the past year.

VOTE OF THANKS.

On motion of Dr. Cochrane, the cordial thanks of the Synod were given to the minister and office-bearers of the First Presbyterian church, for the use of their building and the arrangements made for the work of the Synod, and to the railways for reduced rates.

The business being finished, the Moderator declared the Synod adjourned to meet/in Knox church, Stratford, on the third Monday of April A. D., 1892, at half past 7 o'clock p. m., and the sederunt was closed with the benediction.

OFFICERS OF THE Synod of Hamilton and London, 1891-92.
