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an address. He could not agree that the conditions of the country is satisfactory. The census shows that our population has not increased as it should, and the exodus shows that we are not prosperous as a people. Canada, properly governed, will be prosperous, but it is not now. The United States has the displacement of population, but only from one section to another, while Canada has the total loss of her natural increase. The government, instead of housing of property, should insist on her condition, and seek more extensive markets for our surplus products. Canada cannot hope for preferential treatment and a more extended market in England and should seek markets elsewhere. Great Britain opens her doors to all the world, but it is the country to do so, though the idea of free-trade is being carried into effect by reciprocity between countries with protective policies. Germany has a protective policy and so has the United States, but both are offering reciprocity to other countries. This is the present policy of the opposition, which favors unrestricted reciprocity if it can be obtained, but also favors a degree of reciprocity obtainable. It has been denied that Canada can afford unrestricted reciprocity, but the speech by General Foster in New York showed that Canada's inability to negotiate a treaty directly is the only difficulty.

The opposition demanded this power for Canada. He was glad to learn that the United States had invited the Canadian ministers to discuss reciprocity, which showed good will. The result of the minister's recent visit had not been, he admitted, without good effect. A settlement of the disputed questions referred to in the address would be advantageous. He was surprised, however, at seeing no mention in the speech of the commission upon prohibition. The bill regarding the distribution of seats is the most important promise. He hoped it would be fair, and not be devoted to 'having the girls, as in all previous cases.' He concluded by referring most respectfully to the death of the Duke of Clarence.

Sir John Thompson, after congratulating the mover and seconder of the address, said he must insist that the property of the country is a thing to be proud of, and he declared that 'residence and family continue to be described on the liberal banner the youth of the country will never support the party. High hopes are entertained by the government for an increased market in Great Britain, even without preferential treatment, and they will not entertain any thought of obtaining a treaty with the United States at the cost of discrimination against the rest of the world. This was the insupportable difficulty pointed out by General Foster. Mr. Laurier's admission that the United States had invited the ministers to a discussion, shown a friendly feeling, proved that this government had not yet acted as to cause resentment by the government of the United States. Attention had been called to the omission of any mention of prohibition, but the commission is to be appointed forthwith, and would have been already but for the necessity of obtaining the consent of certain persons to their appointment as members thereof. The commons will be called upon hereafter to express its confidence for the death of the Duke of Clarence.

The draft was presented and passed all its stages forthwith.

OTTAWA, March 11.—Mr. Delisle (liberal) wishes to know if the government was informed that Judges Haby, Davidson, Jette, Mathies, Pagnon had set aside their judicial duties to undertake political enterprises, and what course the government intends to take.

Sir John Thompson said that as the judges named had been engaged in a work of great public importance and their judicial functions had been performed by assistant judges, the government did not consider any action necessary.

Hon. Mr. Mills, seconded by Hon. Mr. Laurier, moved that the original list of voters sent by the London revising officer to the clerk of the crown in chancery, and the printed list sent back by the latter, should be laid upon the table.

Mr. Mills declared that the names struck off the former list by the revising officer appeared upon the printed list, and he wished the motion accepted without notice as one of privilege and urgency.

Sir John Thompson said the matter was not one of privilege nor of urgency, and due notice should be given.

Mr. Kirkpatrick pointed out that the motion was improper in form, and after further desultory discussion, during which Mr. Mills indicated that a fight would occur later on over the London election, the motion was withdrawn and notice of it given for Thursday.

Returns submitted by Hon. Mr. Tupper show that the total expenditure for fishery boats in 1890 and 1891 to be \$158,411.01, of which \$41,230.16 was to vessels, and \$116,920.85 to boats. The number of vessels receiving bounty was 731 of 23,296 tons, and the number of boats 17,198. The number of boat fishermen was 33,245.

The house adjourned till Thursday, Wednesday being a statutory holiday.


