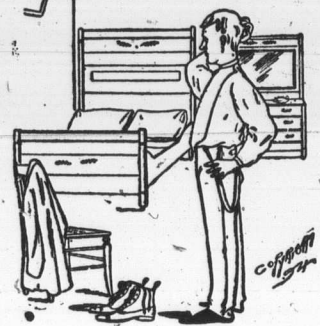

Sudden Death of Wm. Hickey. The people of Athens and vicinity were given a shock on Monday evening by the sudden death of Wm. Hickey, an old and respected resident of Athens, who died suddenly at Charleston Lake. Mr. Hickey had, in anticipation of a visit home of several children, made arrangements to spend a few days in the village on the tip of the lake, and after the family were driven to the lake, followed by Mr. Hickey with another rig in which was stored the provisions, etc. Just as Smith was engaged to take the family to the cottage which he had, and as they required the boat, to row across alone, a distance of about half a mile. He started and in a few minutes after a young man in a sail boat noticed the rig drifting toward the shore, apparently unoccupied. Ardie Paré, son of Wm. Parish, happened along with another boat and the two went to see what was the matter, and to their horror they found Mr. Hickey lying on his back in the boat with his hand over his face. The alarm was at once given and Dr. C. M. B. Cornell was summoned from his cottage, but he found on examination that the vital spark had fled, and gave appoplexy or heart failure as the cause of death.

Mr. Hickey was born near Perth, Lanark County, and was in his 66th year. He has resided in this vicinity for many years and was a blacksmith by trade, being especially skillful in the manufacture of butchers' knives and other edge tools. A few years ago he was afflicted with a tumor, which he had to remove, and he escaped to which he added several patented improvements of his own. His shop was burned last fall at the time of the Slack fire on Elgin st., and since that time he has been unable to follow his profession.

Mr. Hickey leaves, besides his wife, a family of three sons, James, the oldest residing near Boston, Mass., and Geo. and Elmo, living at present in Texas, and two daughters, Mrs. Moore of Michigan and Mrs. Week of Michigan. The funeral was held this (Wednesday) forenoon at 10:30 at the Methodist church.
