The attention of fishermen claiming fishery bounty is called to the following important Order in Council, just issued: 'Owners or masters of fishing vessels intending to fish and claim bounty, are required before proceeding on a fishing voyage, to procure a license in the usual form from the nearest Collector of Customs or fishery officer. In addition to compliance with existing regulations, this license must be transmitted to the Fisheries Department, together with the claim for bounty on or before the 1st December in each year.' Licenses may be obtained from the Inspector of Fisheries for this Province.
