APPOINTMENTS TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CANADIAN INSTITUTE FOR INTERNATIONAL PEACE AND SECURITY

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Barbara McDougall, today announced the appointment of three Directors to the 17-member Board of Directors of the Canadian Institute for International Peace and Security (CIIPS). The appointments are for a term ending August 14, 1994.

The new Directors are:

Ms. Mardele Harland, senior consultant with Partnership Africa Canada and past president of the Canadian Council for International Co-operation, Regina, Saskatchewan;

Ms. Janine Krieber, researcher on terrorism and lowintensity conflict and doctoral candidate at the Parisian Institute of Political Studies, Outremont, Quebec; and

Dr. Danford Middlemiss, Associate Professor in the Department of Political Science at Dalhousie University and Director of the University's Centre for Foreign Policy Studies, Lower Sackville, Nova Scotia.

The appointments were made following consultations with the Leader of the Official Opposition and the Leader of the New Democratic Party in accordance with the CIIPS Act (Bill C-32).

The Canadian Institute for International Peace and Security was formally established on August 15, 1984, with the support of all parties. It reports annually to Parliament. The purpose of the Institute is to increase knowledge and understanding of issues related to international peace and security from a Canadian perspective, with particular emphasis on arms control, disarmament, defence and conflict resolution.
