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## Commencement of the SEASONS.

SPRING Sun enters  $\text{\textcircled{W}}$ , March 21, 3h 36m morning.  
SUMMER Sun enters  $\text{\textcircled{G}}$ , June 22, 9h 53m morning.  
AUTUMN Sun enters  $\text{\textcircled{A}}$ , Sept. 23, 3h 1m evening.  
WINTER Sun enters  $\text{\textcircled{P}}$  Decr. 22, 8h 21m morning.

## ECLIPSES.

There will be this year four Eclipses; two of the Sun, and two of the Moon, as follows:

12th Feb.—The Sun Eclipsed, visible at Quebec; Beginning of the Eclipse 11h. 36m. morn.; Conj. Oh. 13m. eve.; Middle 1h. 2m. eve.; End 2h. 28m. eve.; Digits eclipsed,  $10^{\circ} 32'$  on the Sun's Southern limb.—This Eclipse will be nearly total, throughout the United-States, New-Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and the Islands of Cap Breton and Prince Edward. At Halifax (N. S.) it will be *annular*, that is, the Moon will appear for a few min. surrounded by a ring of light, her apparent disk being smaller than the Sun's.

26th Feb.—The Moon Eclipsed, invisible at Quebec.

7th Aug.—The Sun eclipsed, invisible at Quebec, but visible and central on the Pacific Ocean near the Isle of Otaheite.

23d Aug.—The Moon eclipsed, partly visible at Quebec; Beginning of the eclipse 3h. 55m. morn.; Moon sets before the middle of the eclipse at 5h. 3m. morn. Digits eclipsed  $5^{\circ} 48'$ , on the Moon's Northern limb.

### Of the Changes of the Moon.

Many persons, understanding that the mean time between one new Moon and another is 29 days, 12 hours, 44 minutes and a fraction, imagine that, to find the full or quarters of the Moon, they have only to add a half or fourth part of that time; and when they do not find the changes marked in the Calendar to correspond with this method, they impute it to mistake in the calculation of those changes. It is therefore, necessary to put them in mind, that the great inequality of the Moon's motions renders the above rule extremely inaccurate, so that nineteen times in twenty, it must fail in giving the true conjunction or change.

## ECLIPSES.

12 fév.—Eclipse de soleil, grande et très remarquable : Comm. 11h. 36m. matin ; Conj. 0h. 13m. soir ; Milieu 1h. 2m. soir ; Fin 2h. 28m. soir :—Doigts 6° 32' sur le limbe austral du Soleil.—Cette Eclipse sera presque totale dans toute l'étendue des Etats-Unis, du Nouveau-Brunswick, de la Nouvelle-Ecosse et des îles du Cap Breton, et du Prince Edward. A Halifax, (N. E.) elle sera annulaire, c'est à dire, que la lune, au milieu de l'éclipse, paraîtra environnée d'un anneau de lumière.

26 fév.—Eclipse de lune, invisible à Québec.

7 août.—Eclipse de soleil, invisible à Québec, mais visible et centrale sur l'Océan Pacifique près de l'île d'Oahu.

23 août.—Eclipse de lune, visible en partie à Québec, Comm. à 3h. 55m. matin ; la lune se couchera avant le milieu de l'éclipse à 5h. 3m. matin ; Doigts 6° 48' sur le limbe septentrional de la lune.

This Tide Table shews the time of high water on any day of the moon's age nearly, and the stream continues to run one hour and a half after high water, or, in the seaman's phrase, it flows "Tide and Quarter Tide," and this is to be observed in every part of the River.

**R U L E.** Having found the age of the moon at the top of each month in the Calendar, look in the left column of the table for the day from new to the full moon then in the right column the day from the full to the new moon, and in the middle column you will find the time when it is high water ashore.

by compass, and it can be seen over that point and to the Eastward of it.

Ships approaching the light from the Eastward, as they draw towards Caribou Point must bring it to bear W. by S.; they will then be in a good fair way, and if necessary they can near the land by their Lead.

After passing Caribou Point, and as they draw toward the Light House, they must come no nearer than 12 fathoms water to avoid two ledges of rocks, one of which lays E.S.E from the Light, with only 12 feet water on it; the other lays S. W. from the Light, and E S. E. from the Western extremity of Pointe des Monts, with 16 feet water on it; but these rocks do not lay farther from the shore than half a mile at low water.

The Light House lays with the western extremity of Pointe des Monts N.  $64^{\circ}$ . East and S.  $64^{\circ}$ . West, and distant about one mile; and when ships are to the Westward of the Point; the Light House is in one with the outermost Rocks off the Point; and in the day time it forms a bold distinct Land Mark; and on this line of bearing ships are in the best possible fair way for the general purposes of Navigation, whether bound up or down.

For any particular purposes of Navigation, Ships may safely stand to the Northward, until the Light bears E. by N.; they will then be drawing near the North Land; and when it bears E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. it is time to tack; for when it bears East it will shut in with the High Land and cannot be seen to the Southward of East, and then they will be only one mile from the Land, and if they are off Godbut river, Pointe des Monts will bear from them E. by S. two leagues distant.

When ships are off Saint Nicolas Harbor, and the light bearing E. by N. they are in a good fair way

from the North Land. The S.E. spitt of Manicouagan great Shoal, the Ship and the Light House are then all in one line of bearing.

(1) This further duty is only charged with its amount, if and shall exceed the amount of the previous duties, in which case the excess is payable, 16 Geo. 4, cap. 114, sec. 11, but this is not likely to occur except with every high priced articles, it may therefore be considered as merely nominal.

(2) This further duty will in every case exceed the previous duty, the excess will therefore be charged; the amount payable cannot however shewn by Table, as it will vary in every case according to the value of the article.

(3) Molasses if imported in a vessel not belonging to the U. Kingdom or to Quebec, the duty will be 7d stg, instead of 4d.

(4) This duty is drawn back if the half be shipped for the use of the fisheries in the lower parts of the Province.

(6) Upon such of these goods as are liable to the Provincial duty of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent, that duty is payable under the Provincial law, but its amount is deducted from the payment made under the 6 Geo. 4, cap. 114.

(7) A tonnage duty of 4s sterling, per tun from the ships, and 10 per cent upon the amount of duty on the goods imported is chargeable by order in Council, under certain conditions, which present only apply to the ships of the United States.
