RULES AND REGULATIONS.
Extract from the By-Laws of the Association :-
The menbers of the Agricultural Societies of the several Townships within the County or United Counties, wherein the Annual Exhibition may be held, and the members of the Society of the said County or United Counies, shall be also members of the Association for that ycar, and have badges accordingly; provided the Agricultural Societics of the said Townships, or the Society of the said County cr United Counties shall devote their whole funds for the year, including the Government Grant, in aid of the Association; and that the office-bearers of the Societies of other Townships in other Countieg, and the offlce-bearers of the Societies of such Counties as shall have made donations or shall have contributed towards the Provincial Show, (in the case of Townships not less than $£ 10$, and in the case of Counties not less than $£ 25$,) for that year, shall also be furnished with badges of membership, and shall have free entry into the grounds of the Exhibition.
18t. The payment of 58 . and upwards constitutes a person a member of the Agricultural Association or Uppra Canada for one year; and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for lifc, when given for that specific object, and not as a contribution to the local funds.
2. No one but a member will be allowed to compete for prizes except in Classes $\mathrm{R}_{3}, \mathrm{U}$, and W .
3. All Stock and Articles intended for Exhibition, mugt be entered in the Secretary's Books at Toronto, before 8 o'clock on Tuesiay Evening, the $215 t$ of September; if by letter the poatage mast be paid, and
the person entering must remit bss being the amount of subscription constituting in nember.

4th. Balgens from the Treasurer's Office will be furnished Members, which will mbinit tham and thelr Ladies and children muder it yeurs ot age in carriages, free to every department of the Fixhilition, durimy the Show. Llfe Sembers admitted with their tamilies free.
5 th. Tickets for almlssion to those who are not members 73 d , each time of adinission. Carriages including drivers 2 s . od.; passengers to phy $7 \frac{1}{2} d$, each. Horsenen, not members, to pay 19. 3u, each almizsion.

6th. Fvery article exhibited for competition, must be tho growth, produce, or nianufiteture of Upper Canada, except Class W. Live Stock for brecding must be the property of persons residing in Upier Canada. All premiums for articles entered in competition are to be awarded to the producers only.

7 th. Diseretionary premiums will be awarded for such artieles as may be considered wordly by the Judges, although not enmmerated in the list, and the Committee will deternine the amount of premium.

8th. In the absence of competition in any of the Classes, or if the Stock or Articles Exhibited be of inferior quality, the Julges will exereise their diseretion as to the value of the premiums they award.
9th. The Judges, Competitors and Offiecrs of the Association only will be permitted to enter the show Grounds, until two o'clock, P. M., of Wednesday the 2 2nd September, at which hour members will be admited. Non members will be admitted on Thursday morning at 8 o'clock.

10th. No Articles or Stock exhibited will be allowed to be removed from the grounds till the awards are made, or without the permission of the President, under thepenalty of losing the Premiums. An Auctioneer will be on the spot after the premiums are announced, and every facility afforded for the transaction of business.

11th. Delegates, Judges and members of the Press are requested to report theinselves at the Secretary's Office immediately on their arrival.

12th. The Judges to meet at the Secretary's Onfiee on the Grounds, on Wednesdety mornine, to lireakfast, at $80^{\circ}$ clock precisely, to make arrangements for entering immediately upon their duties.

13th. It being essential to the satisfactory working of the Exhibition that all articles be entered and forWarded in reasonable time; all such as arrive on Wednesday morning and not previously entered, will be charged an entrance fee of 5 s. each. All entries will positively close on Weduesday morning at $90^{\prime}$ clock. Articles arriving afterwards will be admitted into the Show Grounds; but they will be entitled to compete only for Discretionary premiuns.

14th. Arrangements will be made for Agricultural Leetures or discussions during the evenings of Wednesday and Thursday of the Show week.

15th. Every effort will be made for enabling the Treasurer to commence paying the Premiums as early as possibie.

The Local Committe will moke arrangements with Steambuat and Railway proprietors for the transit of visitors and articles for the Show, at reduced rates; also with the Hotels and Boarding house keepers for accommodating visitors at their ordinary fixed charges.

The main object of each report slonld be to afford any intelligent stranger that might read it, a concise, yet an adequately truthfitl view of the Agricallural condition and Industrial pursiuts of the County. While all cunecessary particnlars are to be avoided in the preparation of these Reports, completeness should as much as possible, be constantly kept in view.

The reports must be sent in to the Secretary of the Board of Agriculture, accompanied by a sealed note containing the name and address of the writer, on or before the 1st of April, 1853 ; and no report will be received atter that date. Such reports as obtain premiams will become the preperty of the Board.
