

In making this assertion, he again ran counter to public opinion in Canada. It is somewhat unfortunate that, during the important crisis thru which the Empire is now passing, the sentiment of this country has not been fairly represented to the Mother Country or to the world.





Normal School in the province shortly, llocated in the northern district. He thought the terms of the county model schools should be lengthened, and commented upon the good standing of Ontario, in an educational way compared with the United States and England. It would, in his opinion, be perhaps advisable to extend the Normal School term, considering that in other countries it was much longer.

Traveling Libraries.

Referring to the traveling library system the speaker expressed the strongest hope for its development, and, in order to assist it, made an offer of \$1 to every \$2 given by school boards towards the establishment of libraries in rural schools. He hoped the system would also embrace art galleries in the near future. Continuing, he dealt with the necessity of extending the system of manual training and technical education, stating that in this city there would be some schools wheremanual training would be commenced this summer, as well as studies in domestic, science, natural science, drawing and music. No fees would be charged. In Berlin they were about to expend \$15,000 on a building for manual training. He urged women in universities to commence the study of domestic science. In conclusion he advocated the consolidation of rural schools, and expressed the opinion that examinations were, perhaps, more limited than at present, absolutely necessary.

Among those occupying seats on he platform were Chancellor Burwash, Maurice Hutton and Principal MacCabe of the Ottawa Normal School.

The president's address will be delivered at the general meeting this evening. Traveling Libraries.


