AND POPULATION.

Q. How large is the British Empire?
A. About 12 million square miles, or one-fifth of the earth's surface. Britain thus leads the world in area, Russia coming second with 8 million square miles; United States third, with 3,623,000.
Q. How many inhabitants are to be found within the Empire?
A. Nearly 400 million, or one-fifth of the entire human race. China has the same number, Russia 130 millions, United States, 84 millions.

One out of every five of the world's inhabitants owes allegiance, directly or indirectly, to King Edward.
Q. Who compose the 400 million inhabitants of the Empire?
A. 54 millions of white people, 344 millions of colored—viz., copper, yellow and black.
Q. Where are the 400 millions found?







the power which makes the world go round has always neutralized some of the artificial distinctions of society. Away from the competitive struggle, individuality has a chance. We would not undervalue the inherent advantages which Nature gives to women, and we believe them as great, though no greater, than those she assigns to men; but, until the artificial restrictions on our development are removed, we cannot but feel that we are handicapped in the race of life. If you doubt it, just ask the first man you meet how he would like to change his sex.

A DARING HOLDUP

Sleeping Car on Southern Rail way Held Up by Bandits and CHAS. McCONNELL, 577 to 579 Main Street Passengers Robbed.

Mexico City, Mexico, May 20.—News just received here states that the occupants of two sleeping cars attached to: train which left this city Saturday for Vera Cruz were held up by two negroes and at the point of a pistol relieved of their money and valuables amounting to about \$1,000. 
