KINGSTON, October 18th, 1887.

The Twenty-Fifth Session of the Incorporated Synod the Diocese of Ontario opened this day.

DIVINE SERVICE.

Morning Prayer was said at 8 а.м. in St. George's Cath dral by the Clerical Secretary.

At 10:00 A.M. the Holy Communion was celebrated by Lord Bishop, assisted by the Archdeacon of Ottawa w read the Epistle, the Archdeacon of Kingston as Gospel and the Rev. R. L. Stephenson, M.A., Rector of Perth, whom the Sermon was preached from Isaiah liv. 11, 12,

"O thou afflicted, tossed with tempest, and not comforted, behold, I lay thy stones with fair colours, and lay thy foundations with sapphires.

"And I will make thy windows of agates, and thy gates of carbuncles all thy borders of pleasant stones.

"And all thy children shall be taught of the LORD; and great shall be peace of thy children."

The collection at the Offertory was in aid of the Miss Fund, and amounted to \$19.35.

CREDENTIALS OF LAY REPRESENTATIVES.

At 11:30 A.M., a Committee consisting of Mr. Shan Registrar of the Diocese, and Mr. T. C. Wilson, of Paul's Church, Kingston, were in attendance at the Sy Hall to receive and examine the certificates of the Representatives.

BUSINESS MEETING.

At 11:45 A.M. the Lord Bishop took the chair, and opening prayers were said by the Rev. E. P. Crawford

BISHOP'S 'ADDRESS.

The Lord Bishop here delivered an address to the Syn as follows:-

My Dear Brethren,-

It is with gratitude to Almighty God that I meet you at the Two Fifth Session of the Synod of this Diocese. My lengthened stay in Eng was caused by my inability to discharge my duties through ill health, by God's mercy I have returned to my Diocese in renewed health and vigo

I believe that the Diocese has not suffered by my absence, as all n sary official duties have been performed through the great kindness Lord Bishop of Toronto, and especially of the Lord Bishop of Niagara.

Since last addressing you three Ordinations have been held—one by myf. Aug. 23rd., 1886, at which William Webster Burton, of St. Augustine's llege, Canterbury, was ordained Deacon. The second ordination was did at Napanee by the Lord Bishop of Toronto, Dec. 21st, 1886, at which essrs. Robert Atkinson, of St. Augustine's College, Canterbury, and David ekins, of the Gloucester Theological College, were ordained Deacons, and eRevd. Messrs Burton, Gorman, Young, Snowdon and Baylee were promed to the Priesthood. A third ordination was held by the Lord Bishop Niagara, in his Cathedral, Hamilton, on 29th June, 1887, when George S. derson, of Trinity College, Toronto, and James Robinson, of St. Auguste's College, were ordained Deacons, for work in this Diocese.

The total number of those confirmed was twelve hundred and one, of who eleven hundred and seventy received their First Communion.

The Bishop of Niagara consecrated the following Churches:—St. Mary Green's Creek; St. Peter's, North Augusta; and the Churches at Plevna at Beachburg. His Lordship also consecrated the burial ground of St. Jame Church, Perth, and on the 9th October I consecrated the Church of St. St. phen, Munster.

On the 16th February last I made an application to the Council of the Colonial Bishoprics Fund for a grant in aid of the proposed new Diocese Ottawa, and the Council, with the Archbishop of Canterbury in the chamade a grant of £1,000 conditionally on a sum of £9,000 being raised from the sources before the 31st December, 1893. The Society for Promoti Christian Knowledge also made a grant of £1,000 on similar conditions.

This Society is entitled to our warmest gratitude, not only for this free proof of munificence, but also for the great aid it has rendered to the Dioce in the building of our Churches and the supplying of Service Books to the when they have been built. Let me express the hope that the Committee the Division of the Diocese may be stirred to exertion by these handsome be conditional grants from our brethren in England, and organize some mach ery for a thorough canvass in order to the completion of the Endowme Fund for the new Diocese. The addition of the District of Nipissing to the Diocese by the House of Bishops at the last Provincial Synod makes the cessity for a sub-division of the Diocese more imperative than ever, and shall be glad to co-operate with the Committee in their work, so far as I consistently with the performance of my other duties.

REPORT ON DECEASED MEMBERS OF SYNOD.

The Standing Committee appointed to report in reference to members of nod who have died since the last meeting beg to report as follows: There edied since the last meeting of Synod the Reverend H. E. Plees, B A., Messrs Cephas Mills, John B. McGuin and Amos S. Bristol, M.D.

he Reverend Mr. Plees was made a deacon by the Lord Bishop of Toto, 30th July, 1848, and ordained priest by the same Bishop on the 17th ember, 1850. He was appointed to the Mission of Mountain in 1848, or of Kemptville in 1851, and Carrying Place in 1856 where he rened until 1870, when he was appointed incumbent of All Saint's rch, Kingston. He left Kingston in January, 1872, to become curate of St. a's Church, Bath, and in 1876 he was appointed to St. George's, Fitzroy tour, remaining there until 1879 when he was appointed to St. Paul's, frew. This was his last cure, as owing to ill health he was obliged to m his charge at that place in 1884. Upon the resignation of the Rev. Bousfield as librarian of the Diocese in June, 1886, Mr. Plees was apted to succeed him. He died suddenly at his residence in Kingston, of tdisease, on 14th February, 1887.

Ir Cephas Mills was a lay delegate from the Parish of Matilda. Of him recorded that although prevented by his business engagements from often ding the Synod he was a zealous churchman in his own parish, and a al subscriber to the Mission and other funds of the Diocese. Mr. Mills lilled at the terrible railway accident which occurred in February last hite River in the United States.

t. John Bell McGuin, for many years a lay delegate from Napanee, died #27th May, 1887. He was very regular in his attendance at Synod, and or nine years a member of the Missicn Board. He is said to have been in promoting the building of the new church in Napanee and to have agreat interest in everything connected with the welfare of that parish. Dr. Bristol, who died at Napanee on the 7th March, 1887, it is said tom 1865, without interruption, he was a delegate to the Synod. For years he was a member of the Executive Committee of the Diocese. enerable Archdeacon Jones, writing of him, says that to Dr. Bristol reat measure is due the building of the excellent parsonage.

Paul's, and All Saints', in the City of Kingston, and St. John's in the Township of Kingston, and of such other Church or Churches of the Church England in Canada as shall from time to time be established and set apa by the authority of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese of Ontario either in the City of Kingston or in the Township of Kingston, and designated by him as separate Parochial charge entitled to share in such surplus. Provided the if any two of the Churches mentioned or referred to shall by the Bishop any time be united and placed under one Incumbent, such Incumbent shabe entitled to only one share in the said surplus.

2. That if any of the Churches mentioned or referred to in the first section of this Canon falls vacant, its share of the said surplus accruing during the vacancy shall be first applied towards providing, with the sanction of the Bishop, for Divine Service in the Church during the vacancy, and then making good any loss of capital, and the remainder, if any, shall be divided equally among the incumbents of the other separate Churches in the City at Township of Kingston.

3. That the property, real and personal, of the said Rectory shall, af the next avoidance thereof, be managed by a committee known as the Kin ston Rectory Committee, consisting of the Rector and the Incumbents of the Churches entitled to share in the surplus, with the Chancellor, the Treasur of the Synod, the Clerical and Lay Secretaries, and such Lay Delegate of the Churches mentioned or referred to in the first section of this Canonot being interested directly or indirectly as a tenant, occupant, or intending purchaser of any of the said lands, as shall be annually chosen by his cool legates within one week after the Easter Vestry Meeting.

4. The Rector shall be the Chairman, and during his absence or a vacar in the Rectory such member of the Committee as they shall choose. To Committee shall meet whenever called by the Rector or any three members of the Committee. Five members of the Committee to form a quorum. To Committee shall have power to appoint all such officers as it shall deem a cessary for the efficient management of its affairs, and to make such rules a regulations as may be requisite to carry out the provisions of this Canon.

6. The Committee shall elect a Secretary, who shall be a Corresponding Secretary in connection with the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society and whose duties shall be:

(a.) To aid and promote in the Diocese and in each congregation the wor of the Board of Management and the aims of the said Society.

(b.) To place in the hands of the Bishop, or his commissary, a list of the congregations who may have failed in any year to send in within twenty-eigodays a response to the Ascensiontide and Epiphany Appeals.

(c) To act as the Bishop's Secretary in communication with the clergym of such congregations, and to carry out any directions which the Bishop m give him with the view of securing that the Society shall have a hearing gularly in each congregation at Ascensiontide and Epiphany, and that ea congregation shall have the opportunity of contributing whatever they m be able or disposed to give, however small, to Domestic and Foreign Mission

RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS OF ONTARIO.

On motion of the Rev. the Provost of Trinity College, seconded by Mr. A. LCampbell, the following Report was adopted by the Synod of the Diose of Toronto. 16th June, 1887;

The Committee on Religious Instruction in Public Schools beg to report at they have held several meetings during the year, and have had under the careful consideration the various objections taken to the Book of Scriptal Selections. The whole Book has been thoroughly examined for this prose.

Your Committee is of opinion that the only safe principle upon which such dections can be made is that of retaining, in all cases, the selected passages tact and unmutilated from the Holy Scriptures. And further, that the sich were removed after the Book left the hands of the Revising Committee) is much to be regretted.

They find that especially in the case of the selections from the poetical and uphetical books a large number of omissions have been made, such as all not have been possible had the attention of the Revising Committee acalled to them by the Scriptural references.

Having regard to these considerations, and to the fact that the Book has led to commend itself to a large portion of the people, your Committee is opinion, that for the reading of the Bible itself in the Public and High hools enjoined by the regulations of the Education Department, an author-diagram of readings, selected by a joint committee appointed by the rious religious bodies of Ontario, should be issued by the Government.

The Synod also resolved, on motion to that effect:

That the Committee be re-appointed for another year; and that a copy of Report be sent to the Hon. the Attorney-General, the Hon. the Minister Education, the Bishops of the other Dioceses in this Province, and to the ads of the several Religious Bodies in Ontario.

Reports of Provisional Committees, &c.

I.—REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE DIVISION OF THE DIOCESE,

Adopted: see p. 515.

To the Synod of Ontario :

The Committee on the Division of the Diocese beg leave to report, that it yould holding the meetings of the Committee and keeping the subject before the mind of the Church, very little has been done since the last Synod.

The Committee felt that little could be done towards raising an endowned in this country, until the result of the Bishop's appeal to the great Societ of the Mother Church had been made known.

They are pleased to learn that his Lordship has been successful in obtaing, from the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and the Council the Colonial Bishoprics Fund, conditional grants, amounting to £2,000 st ling, and they are now hopeful that the work of completing the Endowne will be prosecuted with greater vigor and a brighter prospect of success.

3.—Report of the Board of Domestic and Foreign Missions.

Again it is the pleasing duty of the Board of Domestic and Foreign Mi sions to report to the Synod a decided increase in the amount collecte during the past year. The cash contributions for Domestic and Foreign Missions from this Diocese for the year ending April 30th, 1886, were \$2,984 69; the amount for the year ending 30th April, 1887, was \$3,929,73. To the Branches of the Woman's Auxiliary credit must be given for \$510.75 of the last mentioned sum; beside this they have sent to various missions clothin and goods to the amount of \$699.57.

We trust and pray that the day will not be far distant when in every paris a healthy and vigorous Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary will be found.

Some people seem to think that aid given to Foreign Missions is more taken from their own parochial wants; but surely experience has shown the "the liberal soul shall be made fat," that he that withholdeth tendeth poverty. During the past year the following parishes forgot the claims Foreign and Domestic Missions and the directions of the Provincial Synd on the subject:-Amherst Island, Christ Church (Belleville), Clara, Com ermere, Eganville, Franktown, Griffith, Lansdowne Front, Loughboroug Mountain, Moulinette, North Augusta, Hillier, Madoc, Marysburgh, Nor Hastings, Fitzroy Harbor, Plantagenet, Richmond, Shannonville, Smith Falls, and Trenton.

Again this year the Deanery of Carleton heads the list of the contribution followed closely by Frontenac. Carleton, Frontenac, Grenville and Dunda Hastings and Prince Edward, and Lanark and Renfrew show a decided i crease on last year; while Leeds exhibits a slight, and Stormont, and Lenn and Addington a decided, decrease.

Of the parishes St. George's, Ottawa, stands first; then St. George's, King ton; and third St. James', Kingston. Ottawa City gave in all \$1,363.76 at Kingston, \$1,111.09; the rest of the Diocese, \$1,454.72.

4.-REPORT OF THE MISSION BOARD.

The Mission Board begs leave to submit to the Synod a report of its meets during the year ending April 30th, 1887.

The meetings of the Board were regularly held and very fully attended by members, which must be taken as a healthful sign of unflagging interest the work assigned them.

The Board has to congratulate the Synod upon the increasing and prosperscondition of the Mission Fund at the close of the 25th year of the expect of the Diocese, at which auspicious epoch it is able to report the mission its formation, \$11,924. While it desires to express its that the churchmen of the Diocese are taking that interest in its Mission work which it so imperatively demands.

The inclemency of the past winter, which was one of the severest known many years, caused great anxiety, owing to the difficulty experienced by edeputations in holding the Missionary Meetings, and the Board feels that thanks of the Synod are due to the deputations for their earnestness in ing the hardships that had to be endured, while it also wishes to mark carefully the after work of collecting must have been done to bring about that has been achieved. For first time for many years the Board has on hand a considerable surplus providing for the claims made upon the fund. The Board regard this state are doing heartily the duty imposed on them, of providing the ministrated the Gospel to their brethren in the needy and remote districts of our tese, and they earnestly trust that the spirit thus roused and awakened not be allowed to languish or sleep."

he Board is happy to be able to state that its work for the year has been most satisfactory character. Forty Missions were assisted from its s. The formation of new missions still goes on steadily as in past years.

the Missions of North Gower and Bear Brook having become too extensive tworked by one clergyman, two new Missions have been formed out of out stations, namely, Manotick and Navan. The Missions of North ar and Manotick deserve special mention as they have both become self-ming, thus showing a noble example of independence which might well that do not many other Missions, if the members of the Church would be in accordance with their means.

Odessa has also been made the centre of a new mission, and a grant of \$300 per annum has been voted to give this neglected field a start on its necessaries.

In consequence of the unhappy condition of the parish of Hillier a clergy man has been placed at Wellington, and a grant made of \$200, until othe arrangements take place. It is quite probable, however, that this place wi become the centre of a new Mission, which a reconstruction of the Mission in that section of the Diocese may necessitate.

Grants were made to the following Missions and stations for special wordone in them: Calabogie, \$200; Shannonville, \$150; Roslin, \$125; Queen boro, \$125; Madoc, \$100.

The Board regrets that some Missions have remained vacant so long, owin to the difficulty in securing suitable clergymen for them, and the deman which the revived life in the Church at home and abroad is creating. Y it believes that it has been beneficial in other respects, because it has taug the people that clergymen cannot be had for the mere asking, and that the are not kept in stock for their benefit, whether they support them adequate or not. In almost every instance the prolonged vacancy has made the wa more felt, and drawn out a very marked increase in the subscription list, a for which the Rural Deans, whose special work this is, deserve the thanks the Diocese.

The Board would also, while on this subject, draw the attention of the Bishop and the Synod to the fact of the inadequacy of the supply of men from the Canadian Colleges to meet the requirements for the ministry in this at other Dioceses, and whether some means cannot be devised by which the colleges may be made more efficient in remedying this great and pressivant. If it were not for the assistance given us, in this respect, by St. Aug tine's, Canterbury, and other English Theological Colleges, our Diocese would have been very short-handed in clergy; and to these institutions we are und a deep obligation. A remedy can be found, and the Board would respect fully urge upon the Bishops of the Church the necessity of taking count together upon this vital question, in order that the colleges of the Church may better fulfil their purpose in providing our Dioceses with well-train educated men for the ministry.

In closing the first quarter of a century of what may be termed only for dation laying in this Diocese, the Board, while conscious of many shocomings, feels that God has blessed its work, and it ventures to believe the under His continued blessing the future of the Diocese, built up on foundation, during the next quarter of a century will be attended with steprogress in the unity of the faith and the advancement of all that will redo to the glory of God and the stability of Catholic truth and order.

Mr. Shannon.

The total Church population of 82 parishes and missions making returns 39,721. Had all made them, it is possible this might have been increased 5,000 making in all about 45,000.

The census return for the year 1881, for that portion of the Province of ntario comprising the Diocese of Ontario, is 79,242 Church people. The unties of Frontenac, Lennox and Addington, and the City of Kingston, low by the census an aggregate Church population of 13,537, whilst the rem made to your Committee only exhibits 6,600.

The City of Ottawa stands in marked contrast to the rest of the Diocese in is particular, the Church population returned by the four parishes in at city even exceeding by 300 the census figures.

lt is gratifying to observe that a steady increase is exhibited in church iding. The 82 parishes and missions possess no less that 160 Churches the aggregate value of \$568,430 insured for \$195,200.

Your Committee have to complain that the financial statements were very complete. In many cases they were omitted altogether; in others the teipts were omitted and the disbursements given or vice versa, and in only tee instances in the whole Diocese did the receipts as given correspond th the expenditure.

The total amount shown under the head of receipts is \$12,436.20 from pew ats, and \$60,129.05 from all other souroes except endowments or in all 2565.25. The amount paid for the support of the clergy was \$43,909.48, other parochial objects \$44,302.42 and for extra parochial object, \$14,-

he the returns both this year as well as last are incomplete, the advantage acomparative statement is precluded. Your Committee, however, are ased to be able to state that the result of the records presented to them w increased activity and zeal both on the part of the clergy as evidenced their labors and by the laity in their contributions.

lour Committee, although much discouraged by the lethargy and want of mpathy with their labours generally manifested towards them, are still in that either they or their successors will in the near future be able to wa complete return for the Diocese.

13-REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR.

To the Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Ontario :

The Registrar begs to report that since the date of his last report he habeen unable to materially reduce the list of clergymen whose record is still incomplete, and hopes that those who have neglected to supply him with the desired information may do so shortly.

That during the same period the names of ten persons have been added to the list of the clergy, while five have left the Diocese, showing an increas of five clergymen.

That during the absence of His Lordship the Bishop in England a General Ordination was held in the Church of St. Mary Magdalene, Napanee, or December 21, 1886, by the Lord Bishop of Toronto, acting under commission for the Lord Bishop of Ontario, when Messrs. Robert Atkinson and Davi Jenkins were made Deacons, and the Revs. William W. Burton, James Frederick Gorman, Chas. Jas. Young, B.A., Johnston McLelland Snowdon, B.A. and Crone O'Dell Baylee were ordained priests. Also at an ordination held in the City of Hamilton by the Lord Bishop of Niagara, June 29th, 1887, Messrs. George S. Anderson and James Robinson were made Deacons of Letters Dimissory from the Lord Bishop of Ontario.

During the months of October and November, 1886, and February an June of the present year, His Lordship the Bishop of Niagara administere the sacred rite of Confirmation in this Diocese, when 819 persons were confirmed: 321 males, and 498 females; four churches and one burial groun were also consecrated by His Lordship.
