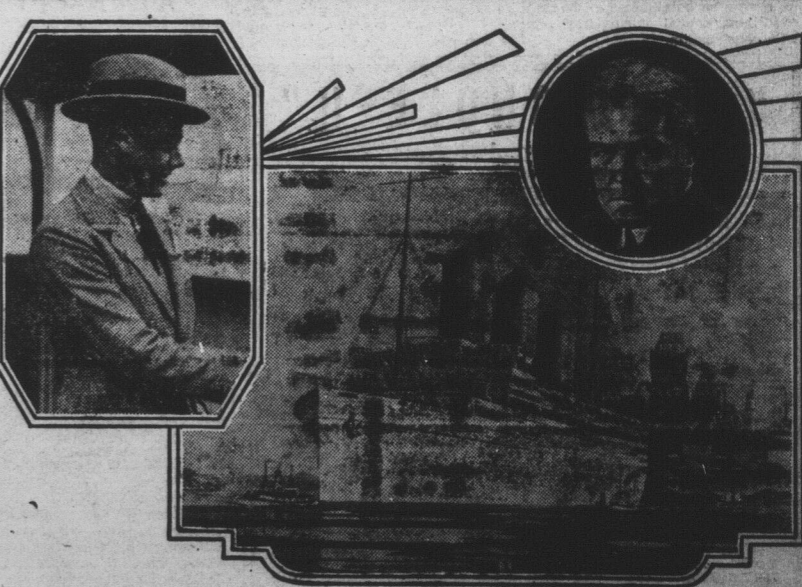

V. O. N. IN EDMUNDSTON

Red Cross Nursing Service to be taken over by the Victorian order of nurses.

In June of this year at the request of the local Red Cross Society a representative of the Victorian Order of Nurses for Canada attended here with a view to making arrangements for taking over the nursing service maintained by the Red Cross Society.

A meeting was held at the Town Hall and was attended by the Mayor

Dr. Laporte, Rev. N. Franchetti, representatives from various organizations including the I. O. O. F., Red Cross, Catholic Women's League and others, and also several business and professional men. At that time it was decided that it would be advisable to have the nursing service taken over by the Victorian Order and a branch of that order was appointed; President Frank E. Four formed and the following officers: Treasurer, T. J. Scott, Secretary, F. Dodd Tweedie. These officers having authority to appoint persons to the Board of Management. Several organizations will be represented on the Board.

Arrangements are now being made to send the nurse, who is at present engaged by the Red Cross Society in public health nursing given by clerk, to Montreal to take a course the Victorian Order and to have her return to continue her services as a V. O. N.

It is felt that it will be more satisfactory to have the service handled through the Victorian Order because their nurses are specially trained in public health work; a nurse is always available through the National Office; the nurse is supervised by a representative from the National Office who makes periodical visits of inspection and will come at any time if required by the nurse or the Local Association without expense to the Local Association as all the service given by the National Office is financed by Government Grants endowments and donations.
