He became slowly the finest debater in the House of Commons. The purity of his style gave force to the strength of his argument, and constant labor added to the clearness of his per-ception. He defended the American colonies against Lord North ; he joined in the memorable "coalition," sustained the revolutionists of France, and parted from Burke in tears. He demanded in-cessantly reform for England, and when almost all other men faltered, still upheld the cause of the people. In 1806 Fox became Foreign Secretary. His vices had Iong passed away. His only aim now was to abolish the slave-trade, and to promote a lasting peace. Buthe died soon after. He began life an Alcibiades, and ended it by laboring to become a Washington. 
