the American Farm Journal gives another and safer method. He says: If the rock is buried in the ground, dig around it so as to expose the greater part of it, then build a wood fire around and over it, so as to heat it hot. The explosion caused by the heat usually causes the rock to burst in small pieces; but if it does not, draw the firebricks quickly from the top and dash on a pan of two of cold water. This seldom if ever fails, as the sudden contraction of the outer surface causes it to break. I saw one broken in this way which contained three waggons loads. A few trials will show about the amount of fire that is required.

A SCRAP BOOK.—Every farmer should keep a book in which to paste agricultural scraps. Every one, in reading a paper, will see a number of things which he will wish to remember. He will perhaps see suggestions, the value of which he will desire to test, or hints which he will want to be governed by in future operations. And yet, after reading the paper, he will probably never see it again. In such a case all the valuable articles will be lost. To prevent such a loss every reader should clip from the papers such articles as he desires to preserve and remember; and paste them in a scrap book. Such a book, at the end of a year or two, will be interesting and valuable.

CANADA THISTLES.—At a farmers' institute held recently at Rochester, Mich., destroying Canada thistles was discussed, and all agreed that to keep them down a year, so they could not obtain the use of their leaves in the open air, would destroy them. Put two or three feet of straw over them, or cut them off below the surface and cover them up once a week with salt throughout the season.
