### General Intelligence.

#### England and Egypt.

The Possible Results of the War in the Sudan—Danger to the Gladstone and the horizontal extremity of the Suez Canal and India Probable.

From an Exchange. In no one article can justice be done to the great Egyptian question. Not only do the great events of the past week require special notice, but there are many problems connected with the whole question which are of the most vital importance, and the whole history leading up to the present result is as interesting as a good romance. At present this war seems as if much importance to England as to Egypt.

#### RUSSIA AND EGYPT.

In order to understand the whole question involved a little study of the history of the Sudan is necessary. Although Sudan is mostly separated from Egypt by the great desert it is really as vitally related to it as Scotland is to England or as some of the Western Territories are to the United States. Sudan was annexed to Egypt by Mehemet Ali Pasha, grandfather of Ismail Pasha, and the discordant Arab tribes were made to submit to law by strict rules. Much of the Sudan is a rich country capable of producing cotton in abundance.

Sixty years ago All Mehemet gained control of a portion of Sudan easily because of a lack of unity among the tribes there. He and his successors have since that time been carrying on a steady and successful war against the slave trade which was a magnificent business to them. The Khedive of Egypt upheld this traffic for many years, and the fact that the great slave trading tribes themselves became a menace to Egypt. Under the influence of the British Anti-Slavery Society Ismail Pasha was induced to suppress the slave trade. Among the slave dealers Zehbeh Rasama had become a king of kings. At last, by strategy, Ismail Pasha obtained control of him. Zehbeh is now in Cairo, Egypt. At this time it was only the appointment of Chinese Gordon to the governorship of the Sudan which saved the Egyptian government from ruin. The Egyptian soldiers were ordered then to bayonet the wretched slaves, and moreover Gordon found the Government of the Egyptians in Sudan atrocious, only excelled in that direction by that of the slave traders. Especially under the influence of Sir Samuel Baker and Gordon much has been done to suppress the slave trade, but at the same time the Egyptian Government has been so faithless and cruel that the people have never been submissive to their rule.

#### ENGLAND AND EGYPT.

Readers should know that England has been interested in Egypt for different reasons. First, England tried to suppress the Sudan slave trade, then England was interested in large amounts was sent to Egypt and then it is necessary to have the success and good will of Egypt in order to control the Suez Canal which is England's gateway to her own India, and besides it was supposed to be necessary for England to have influence and authority in the East. The Egyptian Government there. Every reader remembers the war in 1882 when Arabi rebelled against the Khedive of Egypt. The British Government bombarded Alexandria in behalf of the Egyptian government and the rebellion was suppressed.

#### EL MAHDI.

Really this man is only a derisive named Mahomet Achmet, who has taken advantage of the confusion in the management in Sudan to gather round him a number of fanatics to oppose Egypt. It is generally believed that this pretended Mahdi hopes to make the Mohammedan church believe in his former prophet of Mahomet. Both "Chinese" Gordon and Sir Samuel Baker, however, think that his success in the Sudan has not been by religious means, but because the Sudan people are tired of Egyptian misrule and are glad to support any supposed deliverer. The "Mahdi" has used both the religious and political reasons as means of success.

#### THE GLADSTONE MINISTRY.

But all this question seriously affects politics in England. Gladstone is the man who has been the most radical of leaders, but represents the party that is opposed to the Tory wing in politics. The Tories or English have been the cause of the disasters in Egypt. The historical fact is, the Egyptian situation was left to the Tories and the result was a field. The Conservatives and even Sir Samuel Baker want England to directly annex Egypt. The latter person wants England to build a railroad from Suakin to Khartoum. They blame Gladstone for not doing enough. A whole garrison has been massacred in Suakin, and the Egyptian forces under English officers defeated.

In the House of Lords a motion, by the Marquis of Salisbury, condemning the Government for its vacillating policy passed by a large majority. In the House of Commons Mr. Gladstone defended himself and stated that 4000 men had been ordered to Suakin. General Gordon, he said, had a plan of his for extricating the garrison and restoring the country to its former condition. He said that General Gordon's plan would be to withdraw troops on the English coast, and that the British military occupation of Egypt entailed the necessity of seeing British troops withdrawn from the Sudan. In conclusion, he asked the House to accord the Government the acquittal to which it was entitled.

This is in substance the English-Egyptian question. The principal point is whether the late disaster will be the cause of the overthrow of the Gladstone government in England. The Gladstone policy is simply to try to withdraw troops on the English coast, and that the British military occupation of Egypt entailed the necessity of seeing British troops withdrawn from the Sudan. #### THE WESTERN FLOODS.

John T. Perry writes to the Boston Traveller as follows: Were an eastern deluge to begin at Portland, Me., and end at Washington, D. C., with an average breadth of 10 or 12 miles, and an occasional outpouring to a distance of fifty miles or more, our citizens could form an approximate, but by no means exaggerated, conception of the present overflow at the villages and houses standing upon both sides of the Ohio, and the two feet of water in the Kanawha, the Big Sandy, Muskingum, Scioto, Hocking, Great and Little Miami, Wash and other tributaries of the Ohio are alike submerged. Hundreds of houses have floated away, while others are covered to near the ridge poles. Hydrants have been carried off, and the machinery of foundries and mines will be well ruined. From Pittsburg Pa., to Cairo, Ill., and from the Gulf of Mexico within a mile or two of the normal banks, and the distance is about 300 miles.

The forests on the Alleghany and Monongahela rivers, which united at Pittsburg to form the Ohio, and the woods on other streams originating in hills or in mountains, have been cut off. The heavy snows upon these suddenly melted this year, at last, and poured down into the river channels. These channels, hardened by an sudden frost, acquired all the conducting power of the drain pipes, and the descending tide lost nothing of its volume as it moved along, but gained in momentum from the contributions of the lower streams. To produce a flood of the first dimensions a combination of heavy snow fall, a sudden thaw, and an equally sudden freeze was needed. ### Central Asia—and of the world.

The importance of Merv to Russia, from a strategic and political point of view, in its forward march to India, may be gathered from this idea of a map: Imagine a capital L mounted on top of a capital V. 
