RUSSIA RECALLS HER EMISSARI

Sr. Petersburg, Oct. 6.—The newspapers here publish a telegram from Giurgevo, Roumania, dated last Sunday, which states that the movement in favor of Russia which started in the Bulgarian army under the leadership of the springer at State. in the Bulgarian army under the leadership of the garrison at Shumla is now in full progress. The despatch says the movement has spread rapidly and the adhesion of the garrisons at Rustchuk, Widdin, Pleyna and Shumla appears to be unquestionable. The telegram goes on to say that on Saturday last the Shumla garrison telegraphed to the Bulgarian Minister of War at Sofia that they were convinced that the present policy of anarchy was injuring the rights and interests of the people and country; that they desired a release of the originators of the coup d'etat as demanded by Russis, and that they wished Gon Kaubars' note containing the Car's demands to be considered by the Bulgarian Government in order to avoid a breach between the two sister nations, "Otherwise," the newspaper concludes, "the garrison reserve the right to act on their own indigment." This was signed by Commanders Khozaroff, Dikoff and Landskaloff.


