High Cairns, one of the Lord Justices of Appeal, will be his successor. London, Feb. 26.—A great meeting of the friends of the United States was held tonight at St. James Hall. John Bright was president. A number of prominent members of the Liberal party were pre-ent on the platform. In the course of the speech, arousing the sympathy of the au-dience to their conduct in the war of Re-bellion. Rev. Newman Hall Followed with an address in which he presented with alify the American side of the Afa-bams controversy, and pursued his views with an eloquence which carried the vast assemblage entirely with him. The meeting was very enthusiastic and broke up with repeated cheers for America. New York, Feb. 27.—The Heroid's Lon don special says the resignation of Earl Derby and the accession of Disraeli to the Premiership, with the Cabinet changes likely to ensue, engage the attention of the Clubs, the extra parliamentary poli-tical circles, and the people, to an extent scarcely equalled in the history of any of the previous official crisis of the com-try. The Queen's request to Disraeli to form a Cabinet, and his acceptance, are regarded as an acknowledgment that the aristocracy and Conservative party gene-rally failed to present a man of sufficient influence, or perhaps talent, for the post, and hence the entrusting of the Great Seal to the Chancellor of the Exchequer is viewed as a great step in the march to-wards popular government.
