## ANNUAL MEETING.

---

The twelfth Annual Meeting of the Diocesan Church Society, of Prince Edward Island, and fourth since its Incorporation, was held at the Infant School House, on Tuesday evening, the 30th October, 1855, at 7 o'clock; the Rev. C. Lloyd, E. C. in the Chair.

After singing the 100th Psalm, and prayer being offered up, the Chairman opened the meeting with some appropriate observations connected with the operations of the Society and the general interests of the Church, in which he referred to some objections made against the Society, and pointed out the practical benefit it has already been the means of affording to the several Church missions in the Island; after which, he called on the Secretary to read the annual report.

The report having been read, and the Treasurer's account passed, in which it was shewn, that there was an increase of at least £16 above the annual subscriptions of last year, it was moved by Captain Orlebar, and seconded by W. Cundall;

Resolved, That the Report now read be adopted and printed under the direction of the Committee.

Moved, by the Rev. R. Roach, and seconded by H. Haszard, Esq;

Resolved, That this meeting desires to return thanks to Almighty God for the temporal and spiritual blessings he has vouchsafed to this Island, and to the empire at large.

Moved, by his Worship the Mayor and seconded by Chas. Palmer. Esq.

Resolved, That this meeting desires to record its sense of grateful obligation to those valuable Church Societies, S. P. G. F. P., and Col., Ch., and Sch., Soc., which have liberally assisted the people of this Colony in upholding the interests, and maintaining the Scriptural principles of the united Church of England and Ireland.



Moved by Rev. D. Fitz Gerald, and seconded by Rev. R. Roach;

Resolved, That this meeting thankfully acknowledges the valuable assistance and ready co-operation of the Ladies' Branch of this Society.

On motion, the following persons, being members of this Society, were appointed the Executive committee for the ensuing year, W. Cundall, Theo. DesBrisay, Capt. Orlebar, R. Hutchinson, H. Haszard, Chas. Palmer, Thos. Desbrisay, jun., George Owen, Hon. Jos. Hensley, G. W. DeBlois, T. B. Tremain, John Longworth, Thos. Essery, John Gates, John Hobbs, Dr. Kaye, J. Aldous, Jas. Easton, John Holl, John Hudson, Thos. Beers, John Tweedie, Dr. Bell, John Haszard, Wm. Reid, Donald Palmer, Jas. Pidgeon, Wm. Cousins.

It was then moved, that the Rev. C. Lloyd do leave the Chair, and that Mr. Hutchinson be called thereto, on which a vote of thanks was given to the Chairman for his efficient conduct in the Chair.

The Doxology was then sung, and the meeting dismissed with the apostolical benediction.

## REPORT.

The Committee to whom you entrusted the distribution of your funds, and the proper working of the Society for the past year, desire, in making their annual report, to join with you in ascribing praise to Almighty God, for the manifold benefits both temporal and spiritual, which He of his abundant mercy has continued to extend to the inhabitants of this Island; to magnify with you the Name of Him, who, Lord of Heaven and earth and the disposer of all human events, has vouchsafed to bless the arms of our countrymen, and the brave troops allied with them in maintaining the rights and independence of nations, with many and distinguished successes, especially in enabling them to break down the stronghold of the enemy and thereby give the first effectual check to the unjust and ambitious designs of an unprincipled and tyrannical monarch; and to unite with you in prayer, that the God of Battles, who is the "author of Peace and Lover of concord" would cause all those victories which He gives, to issue in the return of a true and lasting peace, which would under His blessing tend to the welfare of mankind and the promotion of his own glory.

Your Committee have the pleasure of reporting, that notwithstanding the high price of provisions and the pressure of the times, the funds of the Society have increased during the past year, especially that portion of them that has been raised in the country districts.

The following returns from the various missions in the Island, while they furnish you with much pleasing intelligence and exhibit the practical working of the Soci-

ety, encourage you to press upon every member of the Church the importance of actively assisting a society which expends its means in building up the Church of your Fathers, extending its borders and bringing the blessings of the Gospel within the reach of all.

CHARLOTTETOWN.—The library has been increased by a liberal donation of 64 volumes from the Bishop of the Diocese, which with some additional works ordered last year, make the present revised catalogue contain 707 volumes, value £160. It contains, through the united and praiseworthy efforts of members of the church a valuable collection of popular, scientific, moral and religious works, well suited to general as well as family reading and only requires the steady support of a reading public to become one of the first general church-Libraries in the provinces.

A subscription list has been opened for the erection of a Parsonage, amounting to £86, including the liberal donation of £50 from Miss Fanning. To this object your Committee have voted the sum of £40, which with £18 4s from the Ladies' Branch makes the sum of £144 4s. already contributed by subscription and otherwise to this desirable purpose.

The Sacramental collections for the poor amount to £89 2s. 10½d, collections after Sermons for Religious, missionary and church objects £54 14s. 1d, which with £84 13s. 9d. expended in the introduction of Gas into St. Paul's, and the Infant School House, £21 collected on Sunday evenings in aid of the Light and £187 3s. pew assessment and rents for the support of the church and the due celebration of divine service, independent of the assistant minister's salary, and annual contributions to missionary and religious objects, make in all the sum of £436 17s. 9d. raised by the members of the congregation.

Your Committee also are pleased to observe, that the sum of £700 (less £10 which is still wanting to complete the Parish half-certificate) has been contributed

by members of the church towards the endowment of King's College, Windsor, and would call the attention of this meeting to the importance of furthering the objects connected with so valuable and necessary an Institution.

Contributions made to the Society for general purposes including Ladie's Branch. £59 10s. 3d.

St. ELEANOR'S.—Your Committee have voted in conjunction with the Ladies' Branch the sum of £65 towards the completion of a Parsonage in this mission, Rev. H. Read thus writes "There is a regular and full attendance on the services of our church and I would hope that there exists in the minds of our congregations the necessity and paramount importance of vital godliness; we have three full services every Sabbath, and are encouraged from the numerous and attentive hearers at Summerside, Barret's Cross, Grand river and the Parish church to hope, that the doctrines of the cross are not preached in vain. There are three Sunday schools which are as regularly attended as we might expect in the country where the population is scattered' and we hope that they will be valuable nurseries to the church, for training the rising generation in the principles of our common christianity. The Parsonage house is rapidly progressing, and we anticipate its completion during the early part of the winter. The church has been neatly painted and presents a very respectable appearance. The parishioners have subscribed upwards of £200 towards the Parsonage, which, with the painting of the church, has called forth increased liberality and if we add the sum raised towards the clergyman's salary we see, I hope, proof that the people of St. Eleanor's have not dealt with a slack hand in giving of their means to the support of the church." Contributions £20 10s. 8½d.

NEW LONDON.—Rev. Mr. Meek encloses a list of subscribers and amount of collection in this mission, and writes thus "The new church is hindered by the har

vest, but it is covered in, and boarded and shingled about half-way up, and I have several times preached in it. I hope to get through with it, and to see it prosper, I am afraid that our collections will fall short, as the building of the stone dyke round the old burial ground, and the collections for the new church, in addition to the minister's salary and the current expenses of the church, forms a pretty heavy demand on a feeble and scattered congregation. I hope the mission is reviving, and though our congregations are affected by circumstances, so as not to be so equal, or so regular as I could wish, yet the old church is frequently insufficient for the number who attend."

A grant of £20 has been made towards the completion of the church at Irishtown, which is under contract to be floored, glazed and externally finished before the winter. Contributions £8 11s. 8d.

GEORGETOWN.—Rev. R. Roach reports that the Parish church has been put in a thorough state of repair, a suitable organ has been purchased from the corporation of St. Paul's Charlottetown, and set up; and it is intended that the church ground be enclosed next spring with a substantial fence; he further states, that there is a steady attachment to the church services, and a commendable liberality towards the support of the resident minister, and that he purposes giving an occasional service at Murray Harbor church, to the repairs of which your committee have given a sum of £5 Contributions, including collections made after sermon, £5 18s. 6½d.

PORTHILL.—The Parsonage has at last been rendered habitable by the voluntary surrender on the part of the minister of £110, being the whole of the local subscription in aid of his salary for two years, Rev. H. Swabey writes "the church is shortly to be painted from funds raised for the purpose at a tea-party during the summer, amounting to £23, and we hope to shingle the roof from

money collected by pew assessments. The Glebe School House, formerly at Porthill, now at New Bideford is undergoing repairs; the people of that locality have liberally subscribed the sum of £22 for that purpose, the church at Lot 11 has received a grant of £30 from the S. P. G. F. P., the outside is now completed, and I trust the inside will be plastered and ready for divine service by the winter. I think it is evident from the above, that as regards *temporals* at all events we have reason to be thankful, for what has been done and is doing; I would humbly hope in a more important sense we may thank God and take courage,"

Contributions £11 1s. 9d $\frac{1}{2}$ .

CRAPAUD.—The Parsonage owing to a grant of £20 last year, in addition to a grant of £75 made by the old Diocesan Society, is now completed, and the Rev. D. Parnter whose able and unremitting labors are duly valued by the people, has removed into it.

Your Committee have given a grant of reward books value £2, to upper Westmorland Sunday School under the charge of Mr. Reid, Catechist to the Col. Ch. and Sch. Soc. The Inspector of Public Schools lately visited this School and expressed himself much pleased with the answers of the children, and hoped the people appreciated the opportunity they had both for themselves and their children.

Contributions, upper Settlement £2 18s. 6d. Springfield £3 14s. 9d. Total £6 13s. 3d.

MILTON.—A beginning has been made in aid of a Fund towards the erection of a Parsonage.

Rev. M. Swabey who has now charge of this mission in connection with Rustico reports that the Sunday School is in a satisfactory condition, and that the people of Rustico have voluntarily subscribed to his salary.

Contributions with collections after Sermon, £10 4s. 10d

CHERRY VALLEY.—Rev. Mr. Stewart reports that a contract for the erection of a new church near the Hillsborough Ferry has been entered into. The frame will be raised and boarded and the roof shingled this autumn; about £200 has been already subscribed and it will take £30 more to finish the outside. Your Committee have voted the sum of £10 to this object. Contributions and collections after sermon, £8 0s. 1d.

Your Committee in taking a review of the operations of the Society for the last few years have the satisfaction of reporting that the members of the D. C. S. in this Island have materially assisted in the erection of Parsonage houses at New London, Porthill, Crapaud and St. Eleanor's, have given grants to the building of new churches, the support of missionaries, and in aid of Sunday Schools all which are among the useful and important objects for which your Society was originally brought into existence and has been of late legally incorporated. In conclusion your Committee trust that as the labors of your Society, and the valuable objects they endeavor to promote, become known, they will draw forth the ready and cheerful liberality of all members of the church in this Island and thereby make your Society more generally useful. The Treasurer will lay before you the receipts and expenditure of the past year which your Committee think will justify them in saying, that the funds of the Society have risen and the prospect appears brighter and may the great Head of the church be with us in our present assembly, accept our efforts for the promotion of his glory and stir us up to greater ones, and to Him be all praise.
