But we also do believe that in London and Manchester, and all English cities, and in New York and Boston, and we hope in the continental cities also, the good docs far outweigh the bad, and we see every day as society improves in knowledge that every exertion is made to rescue the lowest of the lower classes from moral, mental, and physical, degradation. More has been done in this way in London in the last five, than in the fifty previous years. But while admitting that there is in all these cities a vast amount o crime, suffering and poverty, the inhabitants of all of them may proudly lift up their heads and thank God that in none of them does there exist a public market in which the " Image of God," man, woman and child, is bought and sold like a dogthat in them human beings are not bred for sale I ke cattle—that there no man is permitted of his own mere motion to flog, maim, fetter, and torture his fellow man, merely because he has a black

Neither can we see how "High Tariffa" can operate in bringing American laborers to the ion in the manufacturing States of the Union has invariably improved under a High Tariff. We will instance the Tariff of '42-when that came into operation, business and labor at the North were in the lowest state of depression Both continued to improve steadily till '46, in which year there was hardly a person in the New States that was not emplayed at good wages.
