STRIKES AND THE PUBLIC.

The necessity for legislation upon the sub-ject of railroad strikes is clearly pointed out in an article in the current number of Har-per's Weekly. It shows that the law pro-vides for the safety of persons and the transportation of property, and requires of the railroad company a proper performance of its contract with the public. Any interruption of traffic is a just cause of public complaint and demand for redress. But the railroad company in this sense includes the operating force, without which the service cannot be performed. This view was held by the State Board of Mediation and Arbitration in 1837, which declared:


