## Parish Notes

The Sanctuary Guild begs to acknowledge with thanks, gifts of flowers from Mrs. Christopher Robinson, Mrs. Goldwin Smith, Mrs. George Harman and Miss Paton. They will be glad to receive similar gifts during the summer months.

It will be a great gratification to the parishioners to hear that Trinity University is about to confer the high distinction of a Doctorate in Divinity upon our Rector. Canon Cayley has well earned some such recognition, as for nearly fifty years he has been associated with the University—graduating in the year 1858 and having been a member of the corporation, for 40 years. As is well known the Rector not only at one time himself acted as Lecturer in Pastoral Theology but also gave his son, now Rector of St. Simon's, Toronto, to be Professor of Divinity. The degree will actually be conferred at a convocation to be held in October. It is interesting to note that just at this time the Rector will have completed the thirtieth year of his incumbency of St. George's Parish.

Bishop Matheson of Winnipeg and the Rev. A. J. Broughall of St. Stephen's, Toronto, and examining Chaplain of the Bishop of Toronto, are also to be similarly honoured.

The Sunday School Excursion has been fixed to take place on Thursday, June 16<sup>th</sup>, and the place visited will be Bond Lake.

The best wishes of the Sunday School will go with Miss Ada Godard, now Mrs. Love—who was married by the Rector on Wednesday, June 1<sup>st</sup>. Everything went as merry as a marriage-bell ought to go.
