FORM OF A BEQUEST TO THE SOCIETY.

I give and bequeath to "The Newfoundland and British North America Society for Educating the Poor," instituted in London in the year 1823, the sum of Pounds sterling, to be raised and paid, for the purposes of the said Institution, out of such part only of my personal estate as shall not consist of chattels real, or money secured on mortgage of Lands or Tenements, or in any other manner affecting Lands or Tenements ; for which Legacy the Receipt of the Treasurer for the time being of the said Institution shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors.

* * Requests for charitable or benevolent purposes, of lands or tenements, or of money to be laid out in the purchase thereof, or charged on, or otherwise affecting lands or tenements, or of money secured on mortgage of lands or tenements, are void ; but money, stock, or other personality, not falling under any of the above descriptions, may be so bequeathed.

LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

I. This Society shall be designated **THE NEWFOUNDLAND AND BRITISH NORTH AMERICA SOCIETY FOR EDUCATING THE POOR.**

II. The Schools shall be managed by Masters and Mistresses of the United Church of England and Ireland, or of the Established Church of Scotland, and conducted, as nearly as circumstances may permit, on Dr. Bell's System.

III. This Society shall consist of a Patron, Vice-Patrons, President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, a Secretary or Secretaries, and also of Governors, and Life and Annual Members, and such other Officers as may be deemed necessary for conducting its affairs.

IV. Each Subscriber of one Guinea annually, or upwards, shall be a Member.

V. Each Subscriber of Ten Guineas, or upwards, at one time, shall be a Member for Life.

VI. Each Subscriber of Five Pounds annually, or of Twenty Guineas at one time, shall be a Governor, and entitled to attend and vote at all Meetings of the Committee.

VII. An Executor paying a bequest of Fifty Pounds, or upwards, shall be a Member for Life.

VIII. The business of the Society shall be conducted, and all its Officers appointed, by a Committee of not less than twelve; of whom Nine, who shall have attended the greatest number of times during the year, shall be eligible for the ensuing year.

IX. The Patron, Vice-Patrons, President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Secretaries, shall be considered *ex officio* Members of the Committee; the ordinary Meetings of the Committee shall be held once every month.

X. Three Members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum; and in case of equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

XI. Five Auditors, three of them not being Members of the Committee, shall be appointed by the Committee annually, for the purpose of auditing the accounts of the Society, of whom three shall be a quorum.

XII. A General Meeting of the Members of the Society shall be held in London annually, on the Second Wednesday in May, when the proceedings of the foregoing year shall be reported, and the Accounts presented, and a Committee chosen.

XIII. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time, at the requisition of the General Committee, or any nine Members, by letter addressed to the Secretary.

XIV. Ten days' notice of all General Meetings shall be given in at least three Newspapers. Those Members of the Society who reside within the limits of the Threepenny Post shall be summoned by letter to attend; and when such General Meetings are Special, the object of them shall be mentioned in the summons.

XV. At all General Meetings, and at those of the Committee, the Patron, or, in his absence, the Vice-Patron, or, should he be absent, the President, or, in his absence, the Vice-President first upon the list, who may be present, or in the absence of all the Vice-Presidents, the Treasurer, and, in his absence, such Member as shall be voted for that purpose, shall preside at the Meeting.

XVI. None of the Laws of the Society shall be repealed or altered, nor any new Law established, but at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special General Meeting called for that purpose.

RULES FOR AN AUXILIARY SOCIETY.

1. That the object and constitution of the Newfoundland and British North America Society for educating the Poor, having the cordial approbation of this Meeting, a Society be now formed, to be called "The Auxiliary Newfoundland and British North America School Society of _____," for the purpose of co-operating with that Institution.

2. That all persons subscribing One Guinea per annum, or upwards, or Five Guineas or upwards at one time, shall be Members of this Society.

3. That the business of this Society shall be conducted by a President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, Secretaries, and a Committee, consisting of not less than _____ Members; and that three Members of this Committee constitute a quorum. That the Committee shall meet once every quarter, or oftener, on some day to be fixed by themselves.

4. That the Committee divide this town and neighbourhood into districts, and appoint two or more of their members for each district, who may associate with themselves any Subscribers, for the purpose of soliciting subscriptions and donations from the inhabitants thereof; and that they establish proper agents and correspondents in different parts within the limits of the Auxiliary Society.

5. That this Auxiliary shall furnish the Parent Society, on or before the first week in March in each year, with an abstract of its cash account, &c.

6. That a General Meeting of the Subscribers be held on such day as shall be fixed on by the Committee in each year, when the accounts (as audited by the Committee) shall be presented, the proceedings of the past year reported, and a Committee chosen for the ensuing year.

RULES FOR AN ASSOCIATION.

1. That we form ourselves into an Association in connexion with the Newfoundland and British North America Society for educating the Poor, for the purpose of contributing towards its object, and that this Association be denominated "The Association."

2. That all persons subscribing the sum of Five Shillings or upwards per annum, or making a donation of One Guinea or upwards at one time, or collecting to the amount of Two Pounds or upwards, shall be Members of this Association.

3. That the business of this Association shall be conducted by a Committee to be chosen annually, consisting of a Treasurer, Secretaries, and not less than _____ other Members, and under the patronage of such other Honorary Members as the Society and Committee shall select and obtain.

4. That the Committee meet once a quarter, or oftener, if necessary, on a day to be fixed by themselves, and that three Members be empowered to act.

5. That for the purpose of soliciting and collecting donations and subscriptions, the Committee divide this neighbourhood into districts, and appoint one or more collectors from among themselves to each district; and that these contributions be paid to the Treasurer at the Committee Meetings.

6. That this Association shall furnish the Committee of the Auxiliary Society, on or before the last day of February in each year, with an abstract of its cash account, &c.

7. That a General Meeting of the Subscribers be held on such day as shall be fixed on by the Committee in each year, when the accounts (as audited by the Committee) shall be presented, the proceedings of the year reported, and a Committee chosen for the ensuing year.

RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY,

That whilst this Meeting is deeply impressed with the duty and necessity of giving scriptural education to the Poor of Newfoundland, they desire to record their earnest hope and prayer that it may please Almighty God to qualify and send forth at this important crisis a sufficient number of devoted Clergymen as Missionaries, to preach the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ throughout the length and breadth of that destitute Colony; and thus, through the Divine blessing, confirm and bring to good effect the labours of this Society.

On the Motion of P. White, Esq. V.P., seconded by Rev. J. Haslegrave, A.B., Secretary to the Society,

RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY,

4. That the Committee be empowered to change the time for holding the Anniversary Meeting of this Society to such day as shall be judged most convenient.

On the Motion of Thomas Lewin, Esq., seconded by the Rev. J. Poulden, M.A., Rector of Fyllon, Gloucestershire,

RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY,

5. That the cordial thanks of this Meeting be tendered to the Auxiliary Societies and Associations; to the different Ladies' Associations, for their increased exertions; to the several Clergy and other friends who have benefitted the Society during the past year; and particularly to the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Chester, for his able and appropriate discourse preached before the Members of the Society last evening.

On the Motion of the Rev. Peter Roe, M.A., of Kilkenny, seconded by the Rev. A. Brandram, M.A., Secretary to the British and Foreign Bible Society,

Among the peculiar causes for grateful satisfaction, your Committee are bound to acknowledge the kindness of His Most Gracious Majesty the King, in taking the Society under his special patronage.

Your Committee also have much pleasure in being able to report, that the Society continues to enjoy the countenance and assistance of the Governor and other high official characters in the island.

Since the last Anniversary, the Hon. the Chief Justice and the Colonial Secretary have both visited this country, and

have borne most decided testimony to the general character and utility of the Schools. Mr. WILLOUGHBY also, your Superintendent, has been in England, and from him your Committee have gained important intelligence, both as to the progress which religious education through the instrumentality of your Schools is making, and the increasing and urgent necessity which exists for extending the operations of your Society throughout the island. The fact alluded to in your last Report of the suspension of the Schools in connexion with the venerable Society for Propagating the Gospel, in consequence of its altered circumstances, the withdrawal of many of its stipendiary missionaries, and the ceasing to employ its catechists or lay readers, is such, that your Committee feel, if ever there was a time for pleading on behalf of the rising generation in Newfoundland, that they may have a wholesome and religious education, it is now. And your Committee earnestly hope that, as the wants of the island and the character of your Society become more known, larger means may be placed at their disposal to enable them to extend the blessing of scriptural knowledge amongst the people.

With heartfelt gratitude to Almighty God, your Committee are thankful to state that, almost without an exception, your Teachers have been enabled to labour in the enjoyment of health, and in the spirit of harmony and peace.

Your Committee will now give a summary of your Society's operations. There are at present 39 principal and branch Schools, as will be seen by referring to the general statement, which will be found in the Appendix. Some few of the branch Schools, from local circumstances, are occasionally closed.

The total number which has been admitted into the daily

schools is 6138, Sunday schools 4069, adult schools 1187 ; and there were on the books at the last return 2510.

The communications which your Committee have received respecting the schools, both daily, Sunday, and adult, are very encouraging, as the following extracts from the journals and reports of your Teachers will testify :—

The Teacher at the ' Central Union School' writes :

" In October last His Excellency the Governor and family, attended by the Colonial Secretary, visited our Schools, and expressed himself pleased. Since which, also, Captain HOPE, of His Majesty's ship *Racer*, paid us a visit: he remained nearly two hours, expressed himself gratified, presented us with twelve choice books from his library, bought several articles made by the girls, ordered one hundred and fifty scarlet comforters for his crew, and promised to do what he could to recommend the Society."

Another Teacher writes :

" The Society's schools in this district are all (with one exception) in operation, although, during part of the winter, three of the branch schools were unavoidably suspended. In the course of the past year, several of our elder scholars, boys and girls, both in the principal and branch schools, have left them to labour with their friends, or to go out to service, yet there is a considerable increase in our numbers, and there have been admitted 70 new scholars. The total number under our tuition is now 364. The sums of £11..12s..6d. for instruction, and £11..7s. of free subscriptions, have been contributed during the past year.

"In the Sunday school the number of scholars in attendance is double that of the last year. It is an encouraging fact connected with the Sunday school, that seven young women sit at the head of the classes, as Teachers, who were themselves taught in the school.

"It is our aim to make all our schools Sunday as well as day schools, as it is one of the best restraints on the young, teaching them to improve, and preventing them from mis-spending, the hallowed hours of the Lord's day.

"In the course of the year, there have been circulated 36 copies of the word of God, viz. 17 Bibles and 19 Testaments. On an interesting occasion, when eighteen scholars were advanced to the Testament class, each one purchased a New Testament to use as their own."

"A School at King's Cove," writes another, "formerly established by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, having in common with the other schools of that Society been discontinued, has been resumed since November as a branch school in connexion with this station, at an expense to the Society of £20 currency per annum; the people in the place engaging to assist as far as they can in the support of the Teacher, who, in addition to his other duties, reads the service in the church on Sundays."

From another:—

"Notwithstanding the manifold difficulties which, as Christian Teachers, they have had to contend with, yet, through the mercies of a gracious Redeemer, they have been in many instances encouraged by witnessing some fruits of their labour. They have observed a growing regard to the

word of God, both among their daily and more especially among their elder Sunday scholars; and an earnest desire for the perusal of those books which are of a more spiritual and experimental kind. One of the scholars, a little boy seven years old, died very happily last fall. He was frequently found repeating, with much feeling, portions of hymns and verses of sacred Scripture which he had learned at school*.

* The following extract from one of the Teacher's journals will serve to illustrate the character of the instruction which it is the object of your Society to impart:—

"The 5th chapter of Acts came in the course of this day's reading at school, from which I urged the necessity of thinking well before we spoke; as, although now lying was not punished with instant death, as in the case of Ananias and Sapphira, yet the day was approaching when every liar would be sentenced to everlasting woe. My remarks, it appears, made an impression on two scholars, as I this evening overheard the following conversation between them. 'Is it not a wonder, John,' says Samuel, 'that God don't kill lying people now, as he did those two we read about this morning?' 'It is, Samuel; but recollect the master said that God now reserves his punishment to the judgment day.' 'Do you think, John, God will punish Ananias and Sapphira in the next world, as they were so severely punished in this?' 'O yes, I think he will; for don't you recollect our little hymn, "Every liar must have his portion in the lake that burns with brimstone and with fire?" 'Do you know, John, I have been thinking all the day about the lie I told last night. I took a lump of butter from the plate, and when mother came in I told her the cat had stolen it.' 'Well, do you know, Samuel, what the master said brought to my mind several stories that I had told: I will tell you one. Some time ago mother made me wear a pair of brother's shoes, which being small, hurt my toes so much, that one day I thought I would open the sole of one, and say that my foot caught a nail and tore it. I did so, and thus got a larger pair.' *The conversation ended by their coming to the resolution of committing to memory a part of this chapter, in order more effectually to impress their minds.*"

“The attendance, though, perhaps, not so great as in some years past, has been more steady; and the Teachers feel themselves fully justified in saying, that the benefits of the Institution are becoming more highly appreciated. The progress of the scholars in reading, writing, and arithmetic, &c. has met with the approbation of parents and visitors, and has generally been satisfactory to the Teachers themselves. The numbers now on the books are, in the daily school 115, and in the Sunday school 125. Some copies of the Holy Scriptures have been sold and distributed with many of the publications of the Religious Tract Society.”

The Loan Libraries, in connexion with the various schools continue to be extensively useful.

“The Loan Library Books,” writes one, “have been much sought after by children and adults; many of the latter having requested permission to take them to the seal and cod fisheries, which has always been granted as far as our stock of books would allow, which we regret to state is very insufficient to supply our numerous readers.”

The Committee would take this opportunity to remark, while with lively gratitude they acknowledge the liberal donations of books which have been made by several kind friends during the year, that it will be rendering an essential benefit to the Society to place at their disposal any works of a moral and religious kind, to be deposited in the Loan Libraries in the island.

Another increasingly interesting employment of your Teachers is, that of distributing Tracts to those going out on their sealing voyage. The importance of this branch of their labours may be estimated by the fact that, during the year 1834, there arrived at Newfoundland from sundry ports 848

ships, and that about 374 ships were employed in the seal fishery, which latter carried upwards of 8000 men : many of those where your Teachers are resident are visited by them, and Tracts left with the respective captains.

One of your Teachers writes, from a station where there are no other means of instruction, either on the Sabbath or any other time, than those afforded by your school,—

“ I was called upon this morning by several men, to know whether I would read prayers for them ; among whom was a master of one of the vessels now in the harbour preparing for the seal fishery, who said all his men should attend. The flag was hoisted for prayers, and, to my surprise (knowing it to be such a busy time with them), our school-room was filled in a few minutes.

“ Few more promising opportunities can be presented than those we enjoy of distributing tracts among seamen. The time which often hangs so heavily upon their hands when at sea, bound in the ice, debarred from catching seals, and the dangers they are then exposed to by towering icebergs, are numerous calls upon them to be prepared to meet their God ; and render it an object of no ordinary importance to furnish them with the means of filling up with profit the passing hour.”

Another writes,

“ I went in company with — on board the ship —, from Derry (Ireland), bound to Philadelphia, with 229 emigrants, nearly all Protestants. The captain received us very kindly, informed us that they had been well supplied with religious tracts, and that most of them possessed a Bible and a Book of Common Prayer. They were then going on shore to public worship. We gave the captain a fresh supply of tracts, and he purchased a New Testament.”

“ The master of a sealing schooner, having just returned from the ice, called to give back the tracts I had put on board his vessel. He said there was not more than half the number I gave him, as his crew had *smuggled* some ; and unless he had kept a sharp look out, the whole would have been taken, for they were as anxious for the books as for a *bowl of hot coffee in stormy weather*. His crew had been in the habit of assembling together on the Saturday evening, to select a reader for the following day ; when they passed it as a law, that if any man cursed, swore, or made game, he should be clapped into the fore-castle the whole night.”

Your Committee will conclude these extracts with a few which may painfully illustrate the necessity for extending the operations of your Society.

“ On the south side of Harbor Grace, a well disposed and respectable young man opened a Sunday school during the past winter on his own account, and was supplied by Mr. Kingwell with suitable books. This person is constantly engaged in the fishery during the summer, so that the place is now totally destitute of the means of instruction. There are in this district five or six places where small branch schools might be opened if the Society had funds, but are at present entirely destitute ; and where many are unable to read for themselves the word of God, and where most of the people are Protestants.”

Another Teacher writes,—

“ Your Teachers cannot close their report, without lamenting their inability to meet the wants of a most destitute spot,

about ten miles distant from this place, where the inhabitants have for the last few years been rapidly increasing, but who remain without any School or Teacher of any description whatever. The only opportunities they have for assembling together are afforded by the visits of the Missionary, not more than four times in a year. During part of the years 1829 and 1830, the Teachers succeeded in providing a school in which sixty scholars were being instructed, but now deplore that they are unable, from the state of the Society's funds, to continue it; and the inhabitants remain without any means whatever.

"The population originally were chiefly Protestants, but, alas! now a fraction only is left. It is true a church stands here, and a poor fisherman does his best to read the service to his neighbours, but few, very few attend; but when a Missionary pays them a visit, the place is comparatively crowded."

"During the spring and autumn, various visiters from destitute settlements come to beg and buy Bibles, Testaments, Prayer Books, and Tracts, for circulation, and strongly express their want of schools; but, alas! the want of Teachers! the want of funds! the want of funds!!"

This statement has received abundant confirmation by the Venerable the Archdeacon of Newfoundland, whose journal, recently published, exhibits many painful facts of the lamentable destitution, both moral and religious, of many localities in the island.

In page 49 of his journal, the Archdeacon speaks of an individual living at Sound Island, who in the absence, as it would appear, of any other means of a religious kind, reads to his neighbours the prayers and other religious works which have been kindly furnished him by a clergyman in England.

"Here," observes the Archdeacon, "as at very many other

places, I was painfully oppressed by receiving applications of the most earnest kind for schools, where, before the applications, I could see they were most needed; yet, alas! I felt that I could hold out to the Christian parents, who were most anxious to secure Christian instruction for their dear children, no promise whatever,—no immediate hope of aid."

Your Committee would here remark that many such applications are lying before them, but which, from the state of the Society's finances, they have not yet been able to meet.

One kind friend to your Society, affected by the Archdeacon's painful account of the state of the Bay of Islands, where no means of moral or religious instruction whatever exist, has addressed a Letter to the Secretary to inquire whether a school could not be established and conducted there, and offering herself to contribute largely to its support; but even this liberal proposal, enforced by the necessities of the place, your Committee deeply regret to say they could not at present accept, without the certainty of a permanent increase to your Society's income. They hope, however, that many more such friends may be raised up to respond to the earnest appeal, and to supply the pressing demands of their poor fellow subjects in Newfoundland.

The condition of the people in the place alluded to, and in other remote settlements in the island, is truly deplorable. The Archdeacon mentions aged persons very anxious to be admitted into the church by baptism, for the first time in their lives having the opportunity afforded them by his visit; mothers with their infant children receiving baptism together; and some affecting instances are given of individuals, whose voluntary exertions are the only means of preserving any knowledge of religion, or regard for the Sabbath as a day of Divine institution, by communicating, as well as they are

able, that instruction to their neighbours which they themselves had acquired in some Sunday school in their native land of privilege*.

Such painful testimony, borne by so competent an eye-witness, your Committee trust will call forth such assistance as may enable them in some measure to extend yet further the blessings of a scriptural education.

In some settlements a stated ministry, from the paucity of the inhabitants, could not be hoped for, but, at least, there might be a school with a pious master. Your Committee, therefore, earnestly press on their friends the necessity of increased exertion, to enable them to render this act of simple justice and Christian benevolence.

Your Committee, in conclusion, regret to state, that the inadequacy of their means has hitherto prevented their commencing operations in the British Provinces of North America: they have not, however, abandoned their hope or intention of doing so, as soon as the funds of the Society will allow; they would therefore use this additional argument, to call upon their fellow Christians to join with them, without delay, in this work of faith and labour of love.

HOME PROCEEDINGS.

Your Committee have to deplore the removal by death of one of the earliest and best friends of the Society, the late Mrs. Codner, to whom, under God, the Society owes much

for the interest and support which it has obtained. On receiving the painful intelligence of her death, your Committee immediately adopted the following resolution :—

“That this Committee desire to express their sincere condolence with Mr. Codner under his afflictive bereavement, and to record their sense of the great worth of the late Mrs. C., and of the lively interest she always manifested on behalf of the Society.”

It will be gratifying to learn, that the Society had a special place in the sympathy and prayers of its late friend to the very last, which she proved by bequeathing the handsome legacy of £500 for its use. Her memory is indeed blessed, and will be long cherished with fond delight by all who knew her.

Since the last Anniversary the Secretary has visited the different Associations in the country : some that had become inefficient have again been called into action, and most have expressed deeper interest in your Society, and larger remittances have been received. At Leamington a new and promising Auxiliary has been established through the exertions of Mr. Codner. A Ladies' Association has been formed at Brighton, which has undertaken to bear the chief part of the expense of one master; nor can your Committee omit to notice with gratitude the considerable increase to their funds from the formation and active exertions of a Ladies' Association at Barnstaple, and the continued and efficient help of the Ladies' Associations generally.

To their friends at Bristol, Hull, Manchester, and other places, the thanks of the Committee are due for the increased support which they have rendered this year to the Society. The result of this visitation of the different Associations during the past year has been to add considerably to the income of the Society.

The remittances last year from donations, subscriptions, and the various Associations, if we except £120 received from Newfoundland for books, were only £1251..18s..5d. This year they have amounted to £1769..19s..9d., besides £100 specially for the debt of 1835, leaving a clear increase of £518..1s..4d. Your Committee, however, cannot report so favourably of the receipts in Newfoundland for the past year, the contributions amounting only to £324..13s..10d., reduced to sterling money, being £152..8s..5d. less than the sum raised the preceding year. This may be accounted for principally by the refusal of the local legislature to sanction the customary annual grant; which, under the sanction of the late Lord Liverpool, had been paid to the Society from its first establishment in the Colony.

But, notwithstanding the increase to the Society's funds at home, its income still falls short of the average annual expenditure. Your Committee regret to report, that the balance due to the Treasurer, on closing the accounts on the 31st March, amounted to £980..10s..7d.

Your Committee, however, have the satisfaction to observe, that, in consequence of Mr. Codner's promptitude in paying the legacy of his lamented Wife, free of duty, the actual deficiency does not now exceed £200.

While your Committee are thankful for the increased support rendered to the Society during the past year, they feel their thanks are eminently due to their old and valued friend, the Rev. H. BUND, for accompanying your Secretary, and preaching at Bristol, Brighton, and other places; and also to the Rev. H. STOWELL, who pleaded for the Society at York; and to those kind clerical friends who have given their pulpits, and in other ways forwarded the interests of your Society.

Allusion has been made to the Loan Libraries in connexion

with your Schools: the Committee rejoice to say, that their appeal made at the last meeting, and by public advertisements, has been most liberally responded to. Among the many kind friends who forwarded books, your Committee cannot forget to notice the valuable grant by the Rev. C. BRADLEY, of Clapham, of several volumes of his Sermons, and also of twenty volumes of his Parochial Discourses, by the Rev. J. HALL, of Bristol.

The Religious Tract Society also, in addition to ten complete sets of their library at half the original cost, have made a grant of Tracts and Children's Books, to the amount of £40 during the past year, which your Committee desire gratefully to acknowledge, as well as a grant from the Sunday School Society; and also 100 volumes (in sheets) of the Youths' Magazine, from the committee for conducting that periodical.

Your Committee have the satisfaction to state, that, at length, there has been formed in St. John's an Auxiliary to the British and Foreign Bible Society; and they take this opportunity to express their warmest thanks to that valuable institution for the assistance which it has rendered to your Society, having made at different times grants of several thousand copies of the word of God, and thus enabled your Teachers to follow up their instruction by widely circulating that blessed book, which is able to make wise unto salvation, through faith which is in Christ Jesus our Lord, it being the chief end of their labours to commend that blessed volume to the affections of the poor islanders.

During the past year your Committee have elected another Teacher, at a salary of £50 per annum, with a view to his undertaking the charge of a School which had been built by the inhabitants, but not yet supplied by a master. They were induced to this on the strong recommendation of your Super-

intendent, by being assured that a portion of the salary would be raised by the inhabitants themselves, and the remainder was kindly promised by some of their female friends undertaking to obtain the sum required.

In conclusion, your Committee feel that a review of the whole of the Society's proceedings must call forth fresh thankfulness, and ought to produce redoubled exertions. Much has been done, but much, very much remains to be done. Let but the necessities of the Island be considered; let but the appalling fact be weighed, that, instead of the means of scriptural instruction keeping pace with the increasing wants of the Island, they are fearfully diminished, and your Committee feel your Society must receive the support which its importance and character demands. And your Committee rejoice to believe, that Christians in general are more than ever alive in their sympathy and benevolence to the moral and spiritual wants of our home and colonial population. The exercise of Christian charity is a duty as imperative as it is delightful; the exercise of that charity in a scriptural way ought to be the study and the aim of every follower of Christ. That proximate duties are primary duties, is a truth that never can be too strongly inculcated. "Beginning at Jerusalem," was alike His command, who said, "Go ye into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature."

Your Committee therefore, while they rejoice in efforts that stop not short of the wide universe, would press on their friends the importance of the gradation of Christian charity, believing that the impulse given by Christian benevolence will extend from the centre of its immediate operations, through all its intermediate steps, to the wide circumference embraced by the whole family of man.

Your Committee would again commend the Society to the

sympathy, prayers, and assistance of its friends; but, above all to the blessing of Him for whose glory it was established, to whose praise they trust it has in many instances redounded, and who in the love which He manifested to our fallen race, especially remembered with peculiar tenderness the young:—
“Suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not, for of such is the kingdom of heaven.”
