> PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS. Before moving the adoption of the report of the Directors and the State-ments presented to you to-day, I take leave to make a few remarks as to the business of the past year and the posi-tion of the Company generally. The new business of the year in Canada was a trifie over that of last year, but doubtless largely owing to the depres-sion of trade and commerce, which ar-pears to have been even more fait
