FARMERS AFTER LAUSIER

Deputation From Chateaugay and Huntingdon Pitch Into the Premier.

THEY ARE GREATLY DISAPPOINTED.

Expected the Debt and Expenditure to Be Decreased, According to Pre-Election Promises.

Montreal, Jan. 3.—(Special.)—Sir Wilfrid Laurier received the first formal evidence to-day of the great dissatisfaction which prevails amongst the Premier's English-speaking supporters in the Province of Quebec. At 2 p.m. Sir Wilfrid received a deputation of Chateaugay and Huntingdon farmers, who presented the Premier a petition regarding their position. They told the leader of the Government that they expected the debt to be diminished, as well as the expenditure, and instead both had been largely increased. In fact, a tone of great disappointment prevailed throughout the whole address. "We pray," concluded the deputation, "that no further addition be made to the debt of the Dominion, and that money needed for extraordinary expenses be found by reducing the public establishment to a standard in keeping with the means of the laboring classes, of which the farmers form the most important part." The memorial contained over 1000 names, and the deputation was headed by Editor Sellar of the Huntingdon Gleaner. The Premier promised he would give the matter the attention which it deserved.

Laurier and Beaujeu. The name of C. A. Beaujeu, M. P. for Berthier, was omitted in the invitations sent out for the Monument National demonstration. This, of course, was a mistake, and the name of Mr. Tarté, M. P. for Berthier, was substituted. Mr. Beaujeu, however, was not at all displeased and replied that he wanted nothing from the Government.

Robidoux to Retire. It is understood that the Marchand Government will not again present their education bill, and that in order to save appearances, Hon. J. E. Robidoux, who introduced the measure, will retire to the bench.

Notes. Lord Strathcona is getting better and will probably be able to leave for England the first of next week. Mrs. John Molson of this city died to-day at Atlantic City.

CALLED TO PLYMOUTH CHURCH.

Rev. Dr. Newell-Dwight Hills of Chicago, to Succeed Dr. Lyman Abbott.

Chicago, Jan. 3.—News was received here late last night that Rev. Dr. Newell-Dwight Hills, pastor of the Central Church in this city, is to be called to the pastorate of the famous Plymouth Church of Brooklyn, as the successor of Dr. Lyman Abbott. Dr. Hills, like his predecessors of Plymouth and Central Churches, is a writer. The four books he has published are "The Kingdom of Immortality," "How the Inner Light Filled," "A Man's Value to Society," and "The Investment of Influence."

THE JENNISSON SCHEME.

Port Arthur Electors Vote to Have Water Works and a Big Canal to Kakabeka Falls.

Port Arthur, Jan. 3.—(Special.)—The Jennisson bill, which is to enable the council to execute the contract to pay Jennisson and his associates \$10,000 per annum for 40 years for 150 electrical horse power and \$20,000,000 for water, was carried by 175 majority. Jennisson proposes to spend \$1,000,000 to start. This canal will develop 20,000 horse power, and have a head of water at Port Arthur of 200 feet for power, light, water and heat purposes.

WILL HOLD HER COLONIES.

King Charles of Portugal Apparently Will Not Sell Delagoa Bay.

Lisbon, Jan. 3.—King Charles opened the two legislative chambers yesterday, and in the course of his speech from the throne, His Majesty said he greatly sympathized with the King's African proposals, and made a reference to the colonies which apparently disposes of the rumors of the sale of Delagoa Bay. It is not sufficient to preserve our colonial domains in their complete integrity as the sacred heritage of the nation, but must be developed as the solid basis of our economic regeneration.

Mr. Carmichael Don't Want It.

Hamilton, N.S., Jan. 3.—J. W. Carmichael of New Glasgow has decided, on account of his advanced years, to decline to accept the seat in the Senate rendered vacant by the death of Sir John MacFarlane, and which was offered to him by the Dominion Government. Mr. Carmichael is in his 80th year.

BURNS, SHEPPARD AND LAMB

This is the Good and the Probable Ticket for Board of Control for 1899.

THE PEOPLE HAVE ENDORSED IT.

Work Which the New Council Has Right Ahead of It is Disentanglement - The Official Vote.

For Board of Control 1899: Ald. Burns, Sheppard and Lamb. The World commends those gentlemen to Council for various reasons. In the first place, they are all three old and experienced aldermen. In the second place, they have all received overwhelming endorsements from their wards. Votes are the best commentaries on public service. A seat on the Board of Control seems to either make or break an alderman. It has broken Ald. Leslie and it severely cracked Ald. Hubbard. On the other hand, the fact that Ald. Burns headed the poll in Ward 4, with over 2570 votes, second only in volume to the unopposed 3200 vote of Ald. Sheppard in No. 8, shows that the people are pleased with his course as a controller. He should be vice-chairman for 1899.

Ald. Sheppard's enormous vote and his brilliant record as chairman of Fire and Light last year should render a canvass unnecessary to give him a seat on the executive board this year. His narrowly escaped reelection last year.

Finally, there is Mr. Lamb. Daniel said last year he wanted the board abolished. His enemies will say the best way to accomplish this is to get him on it again. He stood a good second in No. 2. In this year, when big questions like sewage disposal will be up, his long experience in the city works matters will stand in good stead. He has also started in with Leacock's, and as he will probably change his mind with reference to accepting a seat, he would make a worthy complement.

About the New Market.

So soon as the courtly function of inauguration with its appointment of committees and chairmen, is over, the Council have plenty of immediate business to attend to. They must look to that the \$150,000 given them by the people for market improvement is spent wisely and well. They should call for tenders on the Deacon-Symons specifications, with details added, if necessary. If it is found that the tenders of the bidders over and above the \$150,000, they can get new specifications and specifications.

Must See Hardy and Tarté.

Then they should look after the city bills for the coming session of the Legislature. The assessment act section is now pending, if the Assessment Commissioner is to be enabled to assess the Bell Telephone and other companies now assessed by wards instead of as going concerns. By this means they will avoid the difficulties of levy, and the city this year lost over \$1,000,000 assessment.

Council has long labored under an exaggerated notion of the architect's power and jurisdiction. The committee has been unable to act concisely and judiciously. Squabbling is going on from individual aldermen has simply wasted attention. It takes a combined effort of the aldermen and anti-party extra. There is a disposition to leave this to Ald. Elected Denison, Spence, J. J. Graham and Mr. Tarté. It is the business of the whole Council to stand by them.

Must Interpret the Agreement.

The Council of 1898 should also get a decision defining authority under the street railway agreement. At present the City Engineer is supposed to be the arbitrator between the city and the company, but Mr. Keating denies him and Council when he service and no corresponding to be of service until they must obey.
