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# PASTORAL GREETING TO THE MEMBERS AND ADHERENTS OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

MY DEAR BRETHREN,

Having a weekly opportunity of addressing you on the all important spiritual questions which concern you, I need not here dwell on them, further than to say that the past year,—though laden with sorrow to me—was one of the most fruitful of my ministry, judged of by those results which gladden most the heart of a Pastor.

There are other matters, however, which the issuing of the printed annual report of the congregation affords a fitting opportunity of bringing before you. I know I express only the earnest and hearty desire of all the old members and office-bearers of the church, when I say that we rejoice to welcome all the new members and adherents that have lately cast in their lot with us in St. Gabriel's, and we hope that they will find their connection with us every way pleasant and profitable. No effort will be wanting on our part to give such services as will justify their partiality in choosing St. Gabriel's for their ecclesiastical home. And we trust that they in their turn will be ready to speak a good word for our church, and will put forth efforts to increase its strength and add to its working force. See that strangers receive cordial attention when they enter our doors. Let it not be left to the office-bearers alone to be civil to those who may casually come to worship with us.

A departure is made, in accordance with the instructions of the Annual Meeting of 1892, as to the matter of the present report. A detailed financial statement is printed. The envelop plan of weekly offerings makes this new departure necessary: just as those who have the handling of the voluntary contributions towards any public funds feel called upon to print a statement of receipts and disbursements. In most of the vigorous congregations of the church in Canada, in which matters are conducted on the best business principles, this is now done. The Trustees know that many friends have contributed in the open plate collections, to whom they are not able to give credit by name in

this detailed statement. Some too began to give through envelopes only near the end of the year, and therefore there is not much set down opposite their names. But while the forbcarance of all such is craved, the Trustees confidently cherish the hope that whatever may be the personal views and feelings of individuals regarding the plan of weekly offerings through envelopes, a great many of those who have hitherto kept aloof from the system, will fall in with it, seeing that it is the system which is approved by the great bulk of the congregation. While the Trustees will gladly see the open plate collections continue to be as liberal as heretofore, they deem it still more important to have a revenue in sight,—which is the advantage of the envelop system.

The contributions towards the revenue of the congregation being given in detail, it was felt that those made to the Missionary Association and Building Fund and other objects, of which an account is kept, should also be printed, and it was so ordered. By another year, a well devised plan, combining the givings to the several objects, should be adopted, so as to avoid printing the same names over and

over again.

Anew the claims of the congregation and of the church at large are commended to you all. I bespeak your sympathy and co-operation. Especially let us all remember that the church is an agency for making Christ known all over the world, and let us do what in us lies to maintain the Mission cause at home and abroad. We have a great Home Mission work committed to us: and we have been honoured with success in our endeavours to give the gospel to the heathen. This should be an encouragement to us to do better than we have ever done, in our contributions to our Missionary Association.

This being the centennial year of the building of the old St. Gabriel Church, it would be a fitting thing that it should be marked by an effort to reduce the indebtedness on our edifice. And all old subscribers to the Building Fund are asked to provide for the payment of their subscriptions, if possible, before the first of September next, in order that at least \$3000 may be paid at that date. On condition that this is done, I shall undertake to obtain help towards a further liquidation of the debt from friends outside.

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

#### DISTRICT No. II—JOHN A. STUART, Elder.

From Amherst St. included, Eastwards, including Hochelaga, to Maisonneuve Village.

#### DISTRICT NO. III—MATTHEW HODGE, Elder.

From St. Lawrence Street, east to Amherst Street, north to Sherbrooke Street.

#### DISTRICT No. IV-P. M. MACTAVISH, Elder.

From Sherbrooke Street included, northwards to city limits, and from east side of St. Lawrence Street included, eastwards to city limits.

#### DISTRICT NO. V-JAMES ROBERTSON, Elder.

From St. Lawrence Street, to Mance Street, included, and from Dorchester Street, northwards to city limits.

#### DISTRICT No. VI-THOMAS GRAHAM, Elder,

From St. Lawrence Street to Bleury Street, both included, and from Craig Street to Dorchester Street, included.

#### DISTRICT No. VII-WILLIAM DARLING, Elder.

From Mance Street, excluded, to University Street, and from Craig and St. Antoine Streets, northwards to city limits.

#### DISTRICT NO. VIII—ROBERT STEWART, Elder.

From St. Antoine Street, north to city limits, and from University Street, excluded, westwards to city limits.

#### DISTRICT No. IX-J. M. FARQUHAR, Elder.

From Dalhousie Square, westwards, to city limits, and from Craig and St. Antoine Streets, southwards to the River.

# ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

January 11th and 18th, 1893.

The Annual Meeting of the St. Gabriel Church in accordance with the Constitution and By-Laws, was held in the Lecture Room of the Church on Wednesday evening, January 11th, 1893.

Rev. Dr. Campbell occupied the chair, and Mr. J. M. Farquhar was appointed Secretary. On motion duly made and seconded, the meeting was adjourned until Wednesday, 18th inst. at 8 p.m.

The adjourned Annual Meeting was held in the Lecture Room of the Church on Wednesday 18th January, 1893, at 8 p.m.

The Rev. Dr. Campbell was called to the chair and Robert Stewart, Jr. requested to act as Secretary.

After devotional exercises by the Chairman, the minutes of the last Annual Meeting were read and adopted.

The report of the Trustees along with the Financial Statement of the Treasurer were then read, when it was moved by Mr. J. A. Stuart, seconded by Mr. F. A. McRae and carried

"That the Reports and Financial Statements as now read, be adopted, and that the same be printed and distributed among the members and adherents of the congregation."

Moved by Mr. Robert Stewart, Jr. seconded by Mr. M. Hodge, and unanimously carried

"That as a congregation we are laid under new obligations to the Great King and Head of the Church for the many tokens of His favour with which He has visited us during the year 1892."


The following motions were also put to the meeting and carried unanimously:—

"That the faithful and acceptable services of the Ladies Aid Society, in providing timely help to those in need, and by visiting the sick, and also in other congregational duties, are entitled to the best esteem of the congregation, and that the thanks of this meeting are hereby tendered to the Ladies' Aid Society and Lady Visitors."

Moved by Mr. Dease, seconded by Mr. F. A. McRae,

"That the congregation continue to view with much approbation the untiring zeal of the members of the Choir in leading the services of Praise in the Church, and that the thanks of this meeting be hereby tendered to Mr. J. R. Bain and the other members of the Choir for their very efficient services during the past year."



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Moved by Mr. M. Hodge, seconded by Mr. Andrew McAllister,

"That the congregation appreciates the ardous nature of the services of the Treasurer and the Secretary of the Trustees, and this meeting now thanks the Treasurer, Mr. A. Watt, and the Secretary, Mr. Wm. Reed, for the valuable and indispensable work they have performed in their respective offices."

Moved by Mr. A. Watt, seconded by Mr. Wm. Reed,

"That in accordance with Article III of the Bye-Laws, this meeting does now nominate and elect Messrs. James Robertson, Wm. Arnott, Andrew McAllister and Robert McCulloch, to be members of the Board of Trustees of this Church, to fill the vacancies occuring at this time, and that the election of Mr. Thomas Sonne, to replace Mr. Foulis, resigned, be confirmed."

Moved by Mr. Robt. Stewart, Jr. and seconded by Mr. John Hood,

"That the careful and systematic instruction of the children and youth in Bible knowledge, and in attachment to the Church of Christ, is one of the most important departments of church work, and this meeting now expresses its deep interest in our large and very efficient Sabbath School, and while thanking the Superintendent and Staff of Teachers, this meeting hereby also requests the Board of Trustees to make financial provision for the proper maintenance of the Sabbath School during the year just commenced."

Moved by Mr. Thos. H. Blair, seconded by Mr. Arch McAllister,

"That the congregation record their continued satisfaction with the management of the Purchase and Interest Fund Committee, and convey their thanks to the Convener, Mr. Arch. McNaughton, for the zealous interest he has always manifested in the property of the church, and that the same Committee be re appointed for another year with authority to canvass for, and take up subscriptions upon such terms as may be most convenient for contributors."

Moved by Mr. Wm. Reed, seconded by Mr. Arch. Watt,

"That Messrs. Thos. H. Blair and J. R. Eakin, be appointed Auditors for the coming year."

After a vote of thanks had been passed to the Rev. Dr. Campbell, for his services while in the chair, refreshments were served by the Ladies of the congregation.

# ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

For the year ending 31st December, 1892.

As required by the regulations, the Trustees beg to lay before the Congregation at this time a report of the management of the finances of the Church, with the Treasurer's Statement in detail, of receipts and disbursements, for the year just ended.

The Treasurer's Statement to be presented shows the amount received as revenue proper for the year to be \$3073.59 under the following heads:

Weekly Offerings,			\$2421.26
Ordinary Collections,		-	504.32
Pew Rents, old system,		-	148.00

The arrears for the year on Weekly Offerings amounted to \$197.50, and on Pew Rents about \$50.00, most of which can probably be depended upon,—of the arrears accumulated previous to that, estimated at about \$175.00, very little will be realized.

Following the plan adopted in recent yearly reports of giving the returns of previous years, the contributions of 1892 are now added to the list, which thus affords a ready means of comparison and test of the contributing power of the Church, with a review of the merits of the voluntary system.

A thoughtful examination of the following table of the revenues of the five complete years since the present occupation should prove interesting:—

It is to be regretted that some substantial increase over previous years has not appeared at this time, which would have warranted the Trustees reporting that some progress was being made in the direction of brineess on the point, not ma

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of bringing up the revenue to the point estimated as absolutely necessary to the maintenance of ordinances. Why the slight increase on the Weekly Offerings involved in bringing up the revenue to that point, decided upon and frequently alluded to in former reports, has not made its appearance, seems a mystery.

No church can afford to stand still, and yet the closeness of the amounts of the yearly contributions is becoming monotonous, and is to say the least very remarkable.

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It is scarcely the province of the Trustees to preach duty, being placed in charge of the temporal affairs of the church to administer the same in the interest of the whole congregation of which they form a part, but these figures may read us a lesson to the effect that possibly we are not doing our whole duty.

In this connection it is painful to think that among those enjoying all the privileges which a connection with the church bestows, as members or adherents, there are some whose names do not appear on the books as contributors.

With respect to the Ordinary or Plate Collections, they are far below what the average attendance at the services would lead us to expect if everybody gave something. It is evident that there is some warrant for the assertion frequently made, that there are many in the congregations of to day who do not consider that they are under any obligation to place the smallest coin upon the collection plate. In managing the affairs of the Church, the Board looks to the congregation for counsel and support which they respectfully submit they have a right to expect, it being a clear duty on the part of the people to lay aside their indifference and cheerfully afford the same.

The Treasurer reports that names are beginning to come in as a result of an earnest canvass now being carried on, and the courteous receptions met with from all visited, entitles us to expect an improvement in this respect during the ensuing year.

The management would like to see the Gallery filling up a little better. It is feared that very few know how well the sitting accommodation in that part of the church is laid out; an occasional trial of the sittings on the part of the people would convince them of this, and though they might have no wish to change, themselves, they would be able to speak of the place or recommend it to friends joining the church. Members of the Board are now regularly appointed to attend there at both services,—the same as in the body of the church—in order to assist strangers in selecting pews or sittings.

During the past year the congregation has experienced many sore trials and bereavements and the Board has lost two of its useful members.

The Trustees may here be permitted to record the great loss to them caused by the death of the late Chief William Patton, so long identified with the work of St. Gabriel Church, whose valuable services on the Board will always be gratefully remembered. Does the memory of the unselfish lives that have gone from among us teach us nothing? Is the benefit of their example to be lost to the church?

May their successors bear in mind that 1892,—the year now reported upon,—marks the Centenary of the building of the historic Church on the Champ de Mars, where they so lately worshipped, and that in the enlarged field of labour to which they have been called, they will worthily carry on the work and maintain the reputation of old St. Gabriel's.

Medal for the best examination in the Shorter Catechism, had been awarded to Martha J. Stuart. Susan Stuart and Agnes McRae, who recited more than 90 per cent accurately, had received Bibles from Messrs. James Robertson and J. M. Farquhar.

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Mr. McNaughton's prizes for attendance and attention to lessons had been awarded to Florence Walker, Madeline Haviland, Robert McDougall and James Penny.
