RULES

ADOPTED BY THE

RELIGIOUS VISITING COMMITTEE

OF THE

" Yome fon Aged and Destitute Semales

AT THEIR FIRST MEETING, 18TH JULY, 1860.

I.—That this Committee shall consist of twelve ladies, called the Visiting Committee of the Home for the Aged, and shall have power to add to their number, should circumstances render it necessary.

II.—That these ladies shall have a general superintendance of the spiritual affairs of the Institution, each taking a week in rotation, for visiting the inmates, either separately in their rooms, or collected, for the purpose of reading, prayer, &c.

III.—That this Committee hold meetings on the same day of meeting of the Executive or General Committee, either before, or after, having one of their number presiding, to report what may be deemed worthy of notice.

IV.—That this Committee shall do all in their power to supply the Institution with religious instruction through books, tracts, &c., approved of and subject to the supervision of all the members. They shall also converse with the inmates on their spiritual concerns, in a wise and tender way.

V.—The visitor for the week shall make it her business to obtain the service of a minister or some person acting in that

capacity, for any old person more than usually indisposed, and entirely confined to the house—such person to be approved of by the Church to which the aged inmate professes to belong. Should the invalid wish to receive the Holy Communion occasionally, and the same be approved of by her minister, the visitor shall attend to the gratification of her wishes.

VI.—Should any of the inmates be deprived by illness of the privileges and benefit of public ordinances, it is considered desirable to obtain the services of theological students from any evangelical denomination, to read or deliver an address as often as practicable on the Lord's Day, or other convenient season—said student must first be named and approved at a meeting of the Committee. The services of an ordained minister in connection with one of the orthodox denominations to be preferred, whenever they can be obtained.

VII.—This Committee shall make it their duty to see that family worship is regularly maintained. They shall visit alternately, entering the day and hour of each visit in a book kept for the purpose in the public room. The visitor for the week shall see that the Sabbath service be supplied.

RULES

TO BE OBSERVED BY THE

ADMISSION COMMITTEE

OF

"THE HOME FOR THE AGED."

I.—Every application must be made in writing, stating the age, religious belief, and temporal circumstances of the applicant.

II.—No person shall be admitted who has not attained the age of 60 years, unless dispensed with by the general committee of the Home.

III.—No person can be admitted unless one or two securities shall guarantee the payment of £10 per annum in quarterly payments in advance.

IV.—If the person admitted shall possess any personal or real estate, or articles of furniture, the same to become the property of the Home, on her decease, or instead thereof a charge of twenty pounds per annum, in addition to the ten pounds mentioned in Rule III, shall be made by the Trustees or Managing Committee, commencing at the date of her admission, and terminating at her decease.

V.—That as it is impossible to accommodate all who apply and only a limited number can be admitted, this institution is more especially designed for those, whose reduced circumstances require this assistance, and are compelled to seek a home in old age.

VI.—No person will be admitted into the "Home" except they hold the scripture doctrines of the Divinity of Christ,

the Deity and personality of the Holy Spirit, the total depravity of man, salvation through the atonement of Christ, the necessity of Divine influence, the obligation resting on all men to repent and believe the gospel, the necessity of practical holiness as the evidence of union to the Saviour, the eternity of future rewards and punishments, and the Divine and perpetual obligations of the Christian Sabbath.

It shall be the duty of the committee of Admission to enquire particularly into the moral character and disposition of all who are to be admitted into the Home, and to require that all inmates attend the religious services in the Home, unless prevented by illness.

VII.—Any person shall have the option of leaving the Home on giving a quarter's notice and the payment of all dues. If any are discontented or unhappy, or refuse to submit to the rules and regulations of the Home, they are at liberty to leave at a month's notice.

VIII.—Whenever any doubts shall arise respecting the individual to be admitted, reference shall be made to the general Committee of the "Home."

REPORT.

THE Committee of Management for the "Home for the Aged," have now to present their eighth Annual Report, though the paucity of facts renders the presentation of a report almost a matter of form.

The Committee have pleasure in stating that the health of the inmates at the Home, during the past year, has been generally good,—indeed better than the average experience of past years. There have been no deaths. The number of inmates now enjoying the benefits of the Home is nineteen, which is nearly as many as present arrangements are capable of accommodating. It is satisfactory to believe, that all the inmates are comfortable, and are well satisfied with the privileges and advantages the Institution confers.

The expenses of the establishment continue about the same as formerly—slightly increased, perhaps, lately by the high prices of provisions, and the additional outlay incurred by roofing the house. The Matron's salary has been advanced from twenty-five to thirty pounds.

The thanks of the Committee are respectfully tendered once more to the subscribers who contribute annually or otherwise, to the support of the Institution; also to Dr. Forrest for medical services; to Rev. Foster Almon for regular ministrations on Wednesdays; to other gentlemen, lay and clerical, on the Sabbath; and to those ladies whose kind benefactions added so much to the enjoyments of the Home at the season of Christmas and New Year; also to

Mrs. C. Murdoch for a treat of strawberries last summer, and to Mr. Murdoch for repairing and whitewashing the fence around the premises.

The thanks of the Committee are due also to Mr. Thomas A. Anderson for his considerate care of the Institution.
