





Evidence Found in Rivers.

(New York Evening Post.)

Fishes belong to the class of creatures that have variable body temperatures of their environment. In extreme cold they assume a rigid condition, in which all the vital functions are suspended, while life still rémains present during several months of each year some of the great rivers of Siberia are frozen solid to the bottom but many of the fishes imprisoned in the ice retain their vitalty and resume their active life when the ice melts in the spring.

The Jacquet River branch of the N. B. Women's Institute, which was organized on May 18th 1917, is growing stronger and more active as time rolls on. During the first years of its existence, whilst the war was going on, the members devoted their time and funds solely to help the soldiers at the front, often times in connection woth the local Branch of the Red Cross. But now that the trying days of the war are ended, more community work is being done, work to promote the social welfare of the parish.
