DRUGLESS MEN MAY PROTEST BOARD'S ORDER

Are Ordered Quarantined If They Attend Communicable Disease Cases.

CASTLE CARTER

Only Way To Stop Dr. Macfie Saving Life in Epidemic, He Says.

Local drugless healers of all kinds have been aroused by the latest order of the Provincial Board of Health by which they will be quarantined if they treat cases of communicable disease.

Chiropractors and osteopaths interviewed by The Advertiser all declared that the order was arbitrary and that the precautions taken by drugless healers when treating communicable diseases were identical with and quite as thorough as those employed by the medical profession.

Dr. A. W. Macfie, one of the best known local chiropractors, said that the order would make little difference to him personally. He did not seek a practice of diseases of that character.

Dr. H. V. C. Dettmer, an osteopath and president of the Drugless Physicians' Association of Canada, expressed the opinion that the order would cause little trouble as the drugless healers as a rule do not treat cases of communicable disease.

Instructions to quarantine osteopaths, chiropractors and other drugless healers who have been in attendance on cases of communicable disease, were received Saturday from the Provincial Board of Health by Dr. W. C. Downham, local medical officer of health.

Members of the London Typographical Union journeyed to Springbank with their wives and families at 2:30 p.m. Saturday to hold the annual picnic.

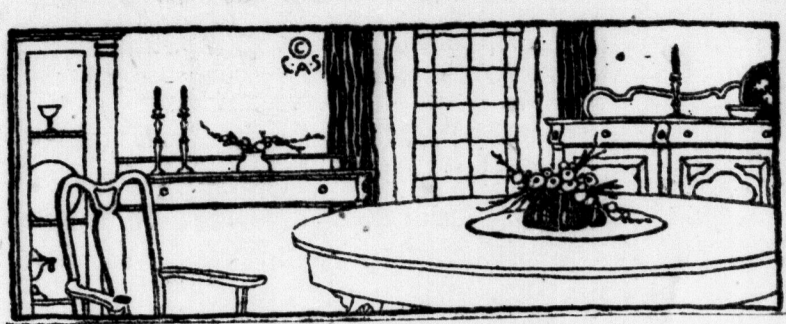
The program of races, which was an unusually large one, was just starting when the storm came and a grand scramble was made for any place of shelter obtainable.

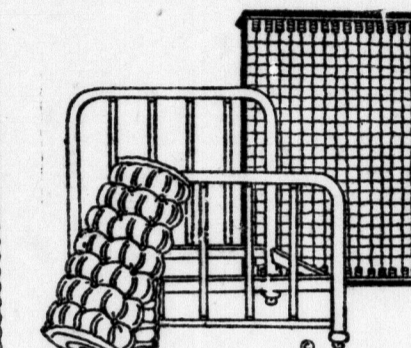

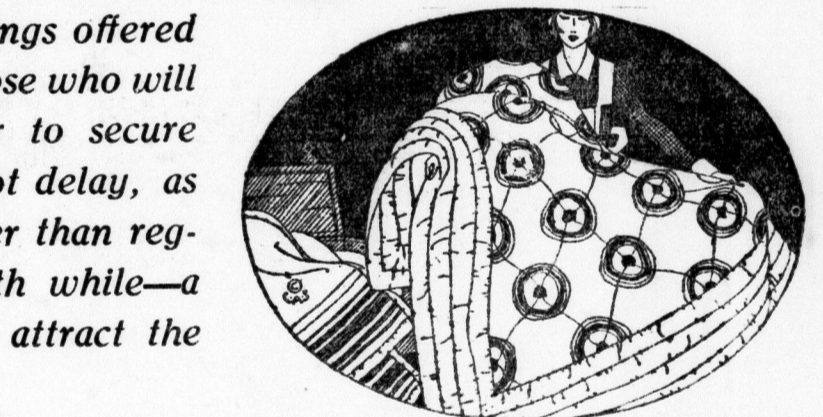

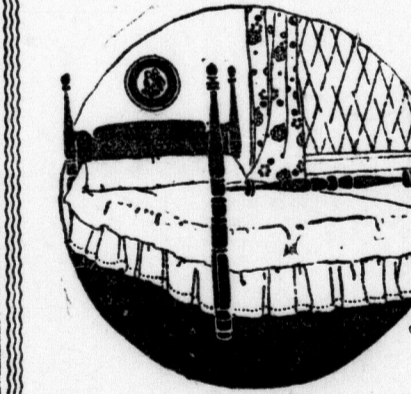

**TALKS ON HEALTH**  
BY WILLIAM BRADY, M. D., Noted Physician and Author.

**Compensation.**  
George is a very obese railroad engineer, now about 40. Fifteen years ago he had his third or fourth attack of quincy, which should never be, for any one who has quincy once or more is almost bound to die. George was a conservative chap; he believed in saving everything, except health. The quincy was so bad that he refused to permit lancing of the abscess, but stoically suffered several days waiting for the doctor to break through the membrane covering when there became a multiple arthritis (joint inflammation) with high fever, chills, and general articular rheumatism, multiple infectious arthritis as we variously call it. (George was cured with a maiden aunt who boasted much lore of herbs and such.)

Well, after a long and torturing by the doctor, aunt and wife, George consented, feebly, to try his luck at the hospital. First he had a severe attack of pneumonia, which was acute inflammation of the heart lining (endocarditis). This was unusually severe, though painless, and George was for exploring the attic or picking pears off the trees, and was very nervous. Finally, the endocarditis began to subside and then George pulled his regular stunt—got a beautiful double pneumonia. Aunt thought he must have been exposed to the cold on the way to the hospital or perhaps he had got his feet wet early in the spring. We doctors, in our starchy, heartless way, were delighted with the case, which presented so many curious and instructive aspects. We had, of course, a culture from the tonsil, another from the sputum, and others from the blood, and our good friend, the pneumococcus, proved the whole thing in every culture. George's troubles were not over when the pneumonia began to clear up. He completed his performance by staining an acute pericarditis (which is inflammation of the sac in which the heart lies) with a large effusion of serum or water and great embarrassment of the heart action, but with ultimate recovery. Many months later a group of doctors examined George, who was walking about as usual, very positive in my bad prognosis. George was given a sort of pension by his employer and he went on to conduct a little garden truck patch.

## TARIFF POLICY OF LIBERALS IS ONE FOR PRODUCER AND CONSUMER

Liberal Leader Warns Wellington Citizens To Guard Against Reactionary Forces Now Preparing To Withstand Sweep of Progressive Elements — Thousands Greet Chieftain On First Visit Since Taking Leadership.

GUELPH, Aug. 22.—Despite sultry weather and indications on all sides of a rapidly approaching storm, some 2,500 people gathered at the exhibition grounds on Saturday afternoon to hear Hon. William Lyon Mackenzie King, leader of the Liberal party. Although the majority of those present were from the city, the audience included representative men from all parts of Wellington County, many of whom had come several miles, and but for the fact that the farmers are taking advantage of every moment to get their harvest in, the crowd would have assumed much larger proportions.

But Mr. King's reception on the occasion of his first visit here since his elevation to the leadership of the Liberal party was a notable one, and his able address was listened to with great attention. In a clear and concise manner he explained the difference between the autocratic government which clings to power at Ottawa without consulting the wishes of the people, and the forces of Liberalism, which are fighting the battles of the people and endeavoring to advance a policy of progressiveness which will take Canada successfully through the period of reconstruction.

He said he was not here to show the difference between the party in power and those who were opposing them, but to show the difference between a reactionary group and a progressive group. All big questions facing Canada would have to be met by two groups, who thought differently, those who wanted changes made and those who wished to retain the old order. He urged a larger representation of both Farmers and Labor in the House. "But," said he, "let them go as representatives of the people of Canada, and not in the interests of any group; in this way we will build up a great Canada."

He frequently applauded. Mr. King spoke for over an hour, being frequently applauded. He contrasted the democratic methods whereby the Labor party, the F. O. and Liberals had framed their platforms and chosen their leaders, with the autocratic methods used by the present Government. He pointed out that the real struggle today was between the democratic forces on one hand and autocracy on the other. In this connection he said: "Standing on that great political gathering the National Liberal Convention, we are perhaps in a better position than at any other time in the history of this country to judge of its chance, not only as an outstanding agent in the history of the world, but also as one of those nations which serve to reveal the inherent in Liberalism, as well as method and method inherent in Liberalism, as contrasted with the autocracy of its opposing force, which is designated ' Toryism,' as of old, or disguised under the name of Unionism, or that of its latest hybrid variety, the so-called National Liberal and Conservative party."

Continuing, Mr. King stated that the unfortunate result of Parliament today is that the force which in reality is Tory, is keeping itself united, though hidden, under the guise of an ever-changing name, whereas the forces that are real Liberal forces, instead of being united in one broad forward movement, which could sweep Toryism off its feet for another generation, are being weakened through the maintenance of futile divisions, some of them old, some of them new, but each special emphasis for itself at the expense of the good which all have in common.

Mr. King dealt at length with the Grand Trunk Railway legislation, and said that the Government stated in the plainest terms that it would permit no alteration whatever in the wording of the terms of the agreement, except such as it was ready to concede. He said that the G. T. R. and their families' pension rights of which many of them had been deprived since the strike of April, 1911. He showed how arbitrary the Government had been in refusing to permit any provision to be added to the contract which would secure these rights to the employees. They were ready enough to concede the company's shareholders in England, but were unwilling to be equally considerate of the rights of Canadian workmen.

Mr. King concluded his speech by

present Government at Ottawa's to be kicked off just as soon as possible, and if they stood together this could be accomplished at an early date.

Present Address.

Just before Mr. King spoke, Chairman Auld read an address to him in which he was congratulated on his appointment to the leadership of the Liberal party, and assuring him of the confidence and support of the Liberals of South Wellington.

Previous to the meeting in the exhibition grounds, Mr. King was the guest at a luncheon held in the Y. M. C. A., which was attended by a number of Liberal prominent throughout the county. Mr. Fraser Auld, president of the South Wellington Liberal Association, presided at the open-air meeting.

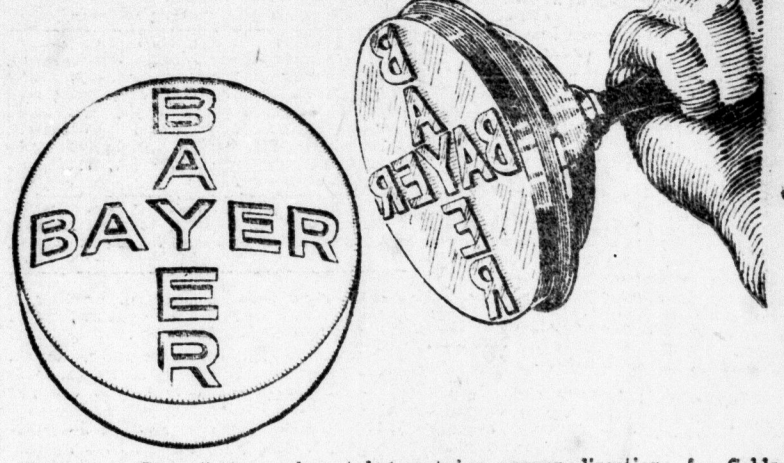

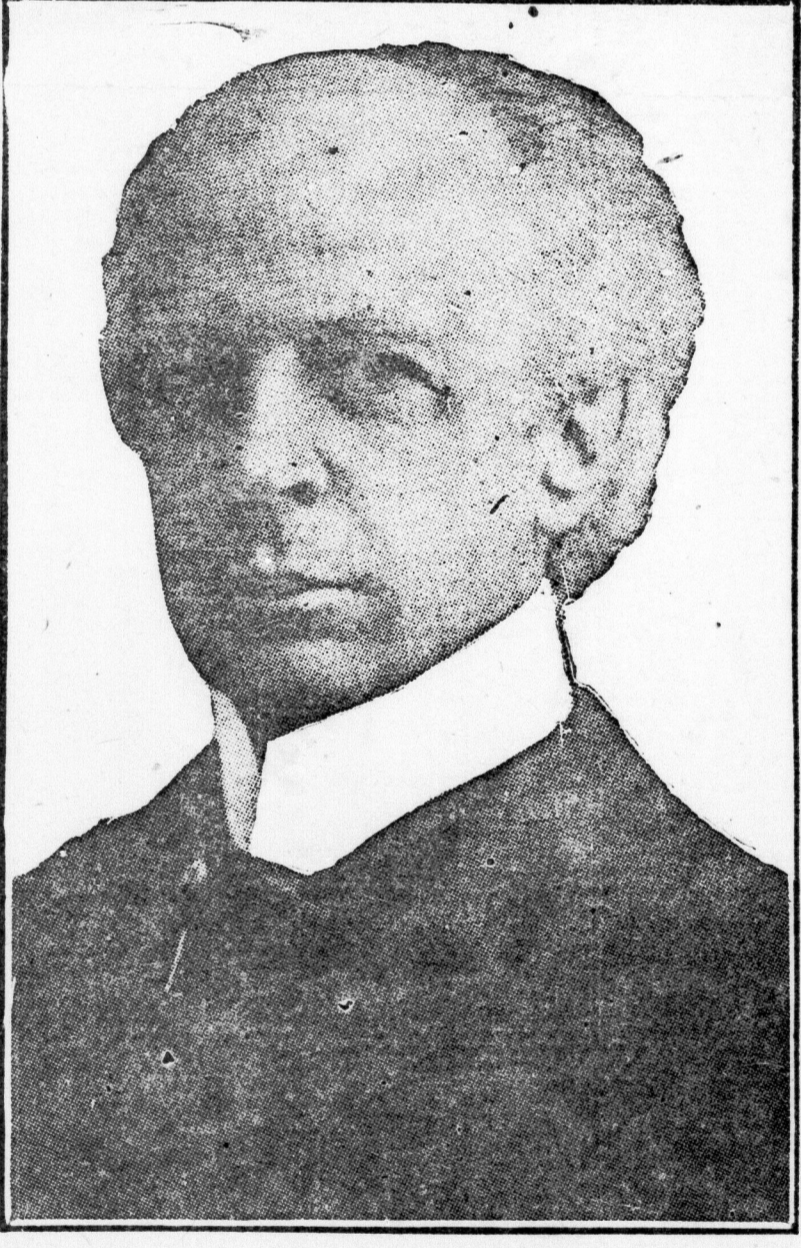

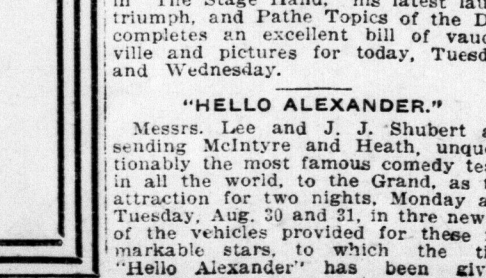
