BILL.

An Act to limit the sum to be allowed for the expenses of Noting and Protesting Bills and Notes in certain cases, under the Act to regulate the damages on Protested Bills of Exchange, in Upper Canada.

WHEREAS the expenses now attending the Protesting of Bills, Drafts or Orders drawn by persons in Upper Canada on persons in this Province, or of Promissory Notes made or negotiated in Upper Canada, have, in many cases, been found to be oppressive: Be it therefore enacted, &c. Preamble.

That the sum to be allowed under the fifth section of the Act passed in the twelfth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and intituled, "*An Act to regulate the rates of damages on protested Bills of Exchange in Upper Canada,*" for the expenses of noting and protesting any such Bill, Draft, Order or Promissory Note as is mentioned in the fourth section of the said Act, shall in no case exceed two shillings and six pence currency, in addition to the postages actually paid. Sum to be allowed for noting and protesting, under 12 V. c. 76, s. 5, not to exceed 2s. 6d. and postage.
