## CONSTITUTION

## NAME

I.

The name of the Club shall be the "Union Name. Club of British Columbia."

## PROPERTY

## II.

The legal title and ownership of all the prop- Legal Title. erty, effects and assets of the Club shall vest in the Trustees, in trust in the first place for securing the amount for the time being due and outstanding on Debentures and subject thereto in trust for the benefit and enjoyment of members as long as they shall be members. Debentures may be issued to an amount not exceeding Debentures.
$\$ 200,000.00$ at any one time in sums of $\$ 100.00$ each, or any multiple thereof, bearing interest at not exceeding 5 per cent. per annum (which interest shall be available for the payment of the monthly subscription of any member, whether a debenture holder or not) secured upon the land, buildings, furniture and other assets, but not so as to render any member personally liable.

Note: At a meeting held on the 2nd day of May, 1914, a resolution was passed by over two-thirds of the majority of the members present authorizing the Committee to borrow upon the security of the property of the Club a sum or sums not exceeding $\$ 50,000.00$, to be secured by debentures, at such rate of interest, not exceeding $5 \%$ per annum, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee shall think fit. The said issue of debentures of $\$ 50,000.00$ to be for $\$ 50.00$ each or any multiple thereof, and to be a second charge next to the said debenture issue of $\$ 200,000.00$.

## GENERAL MEETINGS

## IV.

General meetings of the Club may be annual, Meetings. special, or extraordinary, or ballot meetings.
V.

An annual general meeting shall be held on Annual the second Thursday in May in every year:
(a) To receive the report of the Committee for the past year of the position, funds, property and progress of the Club, and the annual accounts and balance sheet, and an estimate of the receipts and disbursements of the current year;
(b) To elect a President, Vice-President, Committee, and Auditor;
(c) Generally to take into consideration the position and prospects of the Club;
(d) To consider and resolve on any special matter of which due notice has been given.

## VI.

An extraordinary or a special general meet- Special ing may be called at any time by any three General Meetings. Committeemen, or by one-fifth of the members, to consider any special matter. Three weeks'
notice at least shall be given of any special general meeting, and of the special matters proposed to be considered thereat, or at any annual general meeting; also the names of the persons convoking the special general meeting of bringing forward the special matter. No special matter shall be brought forward or discussed at any meeting unless such notice shall have been given.

## VII.

Forty to Form a Quorum.

At all meetings of the Club the chair shall be taken by the President, or in his absence, by the Vice-President, or in their absence by the senior Committeeman present, or failing him, then by such member as may be chosen by the meeting. Forty members shall be a quorum at an annual, extraordinary or special meetings. If, at the expiration of thirty minutes from the hour of meeting there shall not be a quorum present, the meeting shall, ipso facto, stand adjourned until that day week at the same time and place. No business shall be taken at an adjourned meeting except the unfinished business at the meeting from which the adjournment has taken place. If at the adjourned meeting a quorum be not present at the expiration of thirty minutes, the meeting shall, ipso facto, stand adjourned sine die.

any Rule or By-Law, shall be decided by a majority of votes cast. Every member shall have one vote. At general meetings all voting shall be open except the election of President, Vice-President and Committemen. The Chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his own vote. The President, Vice-President and Committee shall be elected in the following manner: The names of members to serve as President, Vice-President and Committee shall be proposed and seconded, and no member shall be eligible unless his name shall have been posted on the Notice Board for at least seven days prior to the date of election, and should more than one member be placed in nomination for the office of President or Vice-President, the election in case of opposition shall be determined by members writing the name of the candidate they vote for on slips of paper; the papers shall be collected, and the vote counted by two scrutineers appointed by the Chairman.

In the event of an excessive number being in nomination for the Committee, the election shall be similarly determined. The member having the highest number of votes shall be President for the ensuing year. The same procedure shall be adopted in the election of Vice-President and Committee, and should there be a plurality of candidates, the eight members having the highest number of votes shall be the Committee to serve for the ensuing year.

The Chairman shail announce the results of the election as regards the successful candidates.

If, as regards any Law or By-Law, notice under Rule 6 has been given, the same may be altered, or a new law made, by the majority of two-thirds of the votes cast at a general meeting. But the winding-up of the Club shall only be deemed duly resolved upon when a resolution to that effect shall have been adopted at a general meeting by two-thirds majority at another general meeting to be convened for that purpose not less than two weeks nor more than five weeks after the first adoption.

## Government.

All the government and administration of the affairs of the Club shall be vested in the President, Vice-President, and eight members of the Club. The first Committeemen shall be: Mr. Justice Gray, and Messrs. C. W. R. Thompson, W. C. Ward, Dr. Matthews, Messrs. C. E. Pooley, C. T. Dupont, Sir M. B. Begbie, Messrs. M. W. T. Drake, Leopold Lowenberg and H. E. Croasdaile.

## XI.

The Committee shall meet on the second Committee Thursday in each month, if necessary, or oftener Thursday. ${ }^{\text {meet second }}$ if they shall think fit, and at such place and hour as they shall think proper, and adjourn at pleasure. Four shall form a quorum for the Four to form transaction of business, except as in Section 35. A bare majority shall decide on any question. The person in the chair shall have the casting Chairman's vote, in case of equality of votes, in addition to ${ }^{\text {casting vote. }}$ his own vote as Committeeman. Any Com- Absence of mitteeman who shall be absent from the regular Committee meetings for a period of three consecutive months shall, ipso facto, cease to be a member of the Committee, except with leave of the Committee.

## XII.

Any Committeeman or other officer (except Removal of a Trustee), who shall nevertheless hold office Committeeuntil his successor is appointed, may be removed from office by resolution duly passed at a special general meeting duly convened.

## POWERS OF GENERAL COMMITTEE

 XIII.Committee to All officers, employees and servants of the engage officers, Club shall be appointed, varied and discharged
etc. by the Committee, who shall fix their duties and remuneration (if any). The Committee shall also fill all casual vacancies (in the interval between annual general meetings) among the Committeemen themselves. The President shall be permanent Chairman, and the Vice-President shall be permanent Vice-Chairman of the Club.

> XIV.

The Committee shall have power moreover:
(a) To appoint among themselves subCommittees or Standing Committees for general or special purposes, as they may deem expedient.
(b) To alter present and make additional By-Laws for the regulation of the affairs and conduct of the Club, and of the enjoyment of the benefits thereof not being inconsistent with this Constitution.
(c) To appoint, remove and replace a Treasurer, Secretary or Auditor.
(d) To suspend members as hereinafter mentioned.

(e) To issue debentures and take other To issue steps for carrying out Section II., as debentures for hereinbefore set forth. But no money purposes. shall be raised by debentures except for strictly capital purposes, and not at all for revenue, and not without the sanction of a special general meeting, nor shall any money raised by debentures be applied for such purposes as ought to be defrayed by regular revenue; with power also from time to time to pay off the same debentures, or any of them, as they may see occasion, and to authorize all expenditures concerning the Club. Any debenture so paid off may be reissued from time to time.
(f) To raise or borrow from time to time such sums as may be necessary to carry on the Club's undertaking by way of notes or overdraft.
(g) To make such further provision for honorary and privileged subscribers and visitors as they shall think fit.
(h) To administer generally all the inter- To arrange nal affairs of the Club, and by house tariffs and rules (not inconsistent herewith or modes of with any By-Law) to fix the tariff of prices and charges, arrange modes of payment and checks, and make rules for the billiard room and card room, and other parts of the Club premises.

## OFFICIAL NOTICES

XV.

Secretary's receipt to be binding.

The receipt signed by the Secretary shall be a sufficient discharge for all moneys due to the Club therein expressed to be received; and in case of members' subscriptions shall alone, without further signature or adoption of these or any other rules, entitle a member holding such receipt to all the benefits and advantages of membership, so far as the same depends on the

Members payment of subscription acknowledg. ment of submission to By-Laws, etc. payment therein referred to. And such payment by such member shall be a distinct acknowledgment on his part that he is bound by all the rules and by-laws, house rules and regulations of the Club, for the time being in force. But no person shall be absolved from obedience to any such rule or regulation by reason of not having received or signed the same.
XVI.

All notices to be served on the Club by members shall be deemed duly served if handed to, or left at the office of the Secretary before 4 p.m. on the day of the notice. The Secretary shall sign or countersign all notices posted on the Club notice board. All notices to be served on any member having his address in Victoria or Esquimalt town or districts shall be duly served 24 hours after the posting of the same, duly addressed and prepaid, at the Victoria Post Office. ## MEMBERSHIP

## XVII.

The Club shall consist of resident, non- Classification resident, special privileged and absent members, of Members. and those on the privileged list, and honorary and temporary subscribers, and such other subdivisions as may be decided upon at a general meeting, but for a period of ten years from March, 1919, no person of German birth, who has not been naturalized as a British subject, prior to the 1st August, 1914, shall be eligible for membership.

No person shall have the privilege of introducing any person designated as above as a guest or visitor, or of bringing any such person on the premises of the Club.

## XVIII.

The Committee may place such persons as Privileged they think proper, not more than three in Members. number at any time, upon a privileged list without bailot, entrance fee or monthly subscription.

## XIX.

Members.

Resident Member.

Non-resident Member.

All persons who have already paid their entrance fee, and three months' subscription, and all persons who shall be hereinafter duly elected under the Constitution, and shall pay their entrance fee and quarterly subscription for the time being, shall be members of the Club. All members shall be bound by and may be required at any time to sign a copy of the Constitution, Rules and By-Laws of the Club.

## XX.

A resident member shall be one who, in the opinion of the Committee, shall reside or have a place of business within twenty-five miles from the Club.
XXI.

A non-resident member shall be one who does not, in the opinion of the Committee, reside or have a place of business within twenty-five miles of the Club.

## XXII.

Any member who notifies the Secretary in writing that he intends to remain absent from the Province during one year, shall be deemed an absent member, and shall pay a subscription of five dollars per annum in lieu of his ordinary subscription; but in the event of such member returning at any time within the year to British Columbia, he shall notify the Secretary and pay

If any absent member shall be in arrears in the payment of his subscription for two years, the Committee may suspend him without posting, and if thought advisable cancel his membership, and may at any time, if he has always thereafter continued absent from the Province, and if adequate and sufficient reason is shown for such non-payment, reinstate him by unanimous vote of the Committee, upon payment of his arrears.

## XXIII.

Any member who shall remain twenty-five Members to miles distant from the Clubhouse during the pay reduced whole of any quarter, and notifies the Secretary thereof, shall pay the subscription of a nonresident member for that quarter. But residence for fifteen consecutive days in any quarter shall be deemed residence for the whole quarter, and entail the liability of a resident member for that quarter's full subscription.

## XXIV.

Officials of any chartered bank, duly elected, shall be charged an entrance fee of $\$ 30.00$ and a Bank
Officials. subscription fee of $\$ 10.00$ per month, and the difference between such subscription and that of ordinary members to be credited towards their entrance fee until the same shall have reached the full amount of ordinary members, at which time the subscriptions of such bank officials shall become the same as ordinary members.

## XXV.

> Mode of ballot.

All candidates for election as members shall be of the age of 21 years, and shall be admitted to membership of the Club by ballot, but (except as provided in the last preceding section hereof) they must have been residents of the Province of British Columbia for six months prior to being proposed for membership; provided, however, that the Committee may, in special cases, by a unanimous vote, waive that residential qualification. No such balloting, however, shall take place at general meetings, but only at ballot meetings (at which no business will be transacted except the election of new members), and the said ballot meetings shall usually be held on the first Tuesday of each month. Every candidate must be nominated by one member and be seconded by another member. The full name, address, description and calling of the candidate must be given, and the same, with the names of his proposer and seconder, must be posted on the Club notice board for at least two weeks before the date of the ballot. The ballot box shall be left open from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m., and shall during those hours be in charge of the Secretary or two of the ordinary members of the Club.

At 6 p.m. the ballot box shall be opened and the ballots counted in the presence of three members, one at least of whom shall be a Committeeman. If three Committeemen are in

If only one Committeeman be in the Club at 6 p.m., then he shall request such two members as he may think fit to assist in counting the ballots in the presence of the Secretary. If there be no Committeeman in the Club at 6 p.m., or if there be less than two other members then present, the ballot box shall remain unopened in the custody of the Secretary till the following day, when the same shall be opened at 1 p.m., in the presence of three members, one being a Committeeman, and the result declared in the same manner. If there are not three members present (one being a Committeeman) on the following day, then the whole of that ballot shall be void as if it had never taken place.

If any candidate has less than 40 votes in all, the ballot shall (but as to such candidate only) be null. One black ball in ten shall exclude. The result, election or non-election, shall be immediately declared. but no other particulars, except in case of a deficiency of the total number of votes.

No unsuccessful candidate shall be again proposed until a lapse of three calendar months, unless such candidate was not elected on account of a deficiency of the tofal number of votes, in which case he may be again proposed for election at the next ballot. A candidate twice unsuccessful shall not be proposed for a third time
until twelve months from the last occasion. The minutix of the mode of balloting shall be at the discretion of the Committee.

## XXVI.

Re-election of ex-Member.

The Committee may, in their discretion, by unanimous vote, submit for re-election by ballot,
without entrance fee, the name of any exmember who, while in good standing, for adequate and sufficient reasons, may have resigned from membership, or of any ex-member who may have been suspended under Section XXXII., provided that the name of such exmember shall be submitted for ballot under all the conditions named in Section XXV. of the Constitution, except as regards the form of nomination, which shall be as follows:

## XXVII.

The Committee may place on a temporary Honorary list of honorary subscribers any officer of the subscribers. Navy of any recognized state, or of the Royal Canadian Navy of the Hydrographic Survey Department of the Canadian Naval Service whilst on duty on this station, upon payment in advance of $\$ 5.00$ per quarter, payable on 1st January, 1st April, 1st July and 1st October, and any officer of the Regular Army of any recognized state, or the permanent corps of Canada, whilst on duty on this station, upon payment in advance of $\$ 10.00$ per quarter, payable on 1st January, 1st April, 1st July and 1st October.

Dockyard and naval officers so placed upon the list of honorary subscribers will, while employed upon permanent shore duty, be required to pay the same subscriptions as any army officer. Honorary subscribers may be continued on the list from year to year.

## XXVIII.

The Committee shall have power of admit- Temporary ting by ballot any person not being a resident subscribers. within one hundred miles of the Clubhouse, who has been duly proposed and seconded by two members of the Club, and whose name shall

have been placed on the blackboard for at least three days previous to his election, as a temporary subscriber for a period of a month, and for such further period as the Committee may see fit, at the rate of $\$ 5.00$ per month, for the first month, and $\$ 10.00$ for each subsequent month, payable in advance.

No person shall be eligible to be elected as a temporary subscriber under this section for a longer period than five calendar months.

## XXIX.

Privileges.
Every privileged member and temporary subscriber and visitor shall be entitled during the period he continues as such, to all the privileges and advantages of the Club, except voting, holding office, or introducing strangers. Every honorary member shall be entitled during the period he continues as such to all the privileges and advantages of the Club, except voting and holding office; and they shall be subject also to such restrictions, if any, as the Committee may for the time being impose, and shall be subject to all and the same penalties as are for the time being imposed upon members either by by-laws or otherwise.

The quarterly subscription shall be $\$ 16.00$ for resident members and $\$ 5.00$ for non-resident members.

The subscriptions of members shall be paid quarterly in advance, and those of honorary subscribers as provided by Section XXVIII.

Every entrance fee and every subscription shall be deemed a debt due by the members or subscribers to the Club, and may be sued for by the Committee or Secretary.
XXX. A.

Any person residing beyond one hundred Special miles from Victoria shall be eligible for election Privileged as a Special Privileged Member, and shall not be liable to pay any entrance fee. The annual sum payable by such Special Privileged Member shall be $\$ 40.00$, payable in advance, on the 1 st day of January in each year, and upon election such Special Privileged Member shall pay the full proportion of that sum from the first day of the then current quarter to the end of the year. Special Privileged Members coming to reside within one hundred miles of Victoria shall cease to be Special Privileged Members at the end of the then current year. If a Special Privileged Member should desire to become an ordinary member, or withdraws from the Club, and afterwards desires to resume membership, he shall be subject to re-election,

Special Privileged Members shall enjoy all the rights of ordinary members, except voting, holding office or introducing strangers.
XXXI.

Rebate of subscription.

Members claiming rebate on their subscription on account of contemplated absence from the Province for one year, or becoming nonresidents for one quarter or longer, shall not be entitled to the same unless their ordinary subscriptions have been paid in advance.

before the 15 th day of the month immediately following the month in which the same was given, and in default of such payment the right to post under this section shall be enforceable with the aforesaid consequences, without the requirement that there be any further or other default; and provided also, that the Committee may, at their discretion, order a member or subscriber to be posted forthwith who issues a cheque to the Club which, upon presentation, is not duly honored.

When any member or subscriber becomes liable to be posted for any sum whatever, it shall be the duty of the Committee to post him for all moneys then owing by him to the Club.
XXXIII.

Any member whilst posted as being indebted Defaulters to the Club shall not be entitled to propose or cannot introsecond, or to continue as the proposer or or incur seconder, of any candidate, nor to introduce any further stranger, under Sections XXVIII. and XXXIV., nor to incur any further liability to the Club other than subscriptions.

## VISITORS AND GUESTS

XXXIV.

Any member may introduce without any Condition of ballot or payment, any stranger as visitor, not visitors.
being a resident of the Province, for any number of days not exceeding twenty-one in the year, or one who is a member of the Vancouver Club for not exceeding fourteen days in the year, and any other stranger as visitor if resident more than one hundred miles from Victoria, for any number of days not exceeding fourteen in the year, and any other stranger as visitor if resident more than thirty miles from Victoria for any number of days not exceeding seven in the year. A register of the number of days for which a visitor is introduced shall be kept by the Secretary of the Club, and the introduced member shall be notified accordingly. He may also invite any non-member to luncheon or dinner, or both, on two days in each week, such days to be declared by the Committee, and known as Guest Days, the guest to have the privileges of the use of the Club premises. But he may invite any norr-member to luncheon or dinner, or both, in the Private Dining Room or Ladies' Dining Room, or to tea in the Ladies' Drawing Room on any day of the week, subject to the House Rules of the Club. All expenses incurred by the guest to be defrayed by the introducer. The Committee shall have power to make any day a Special Guest Day, when they think desirable, in addition to the regular Guest Days. Guests' names, with the introducers, to be inserted in a book to be kept for that purpose; provided, however, that no person shall be entitled to any of

In case the conduct of any member, either Expulsion of in or out of the Clubhouse, shall be prejudicial Members. to the reputation of the Club or objectionable to the members, the Committee shall summon such member to appear before them to explain his conduct, and if he neglects to appear before the Committee, or having appeared, shall not satisfy the Committee, the Committee are are empowered to recommend such member to resign; provided, that no such recommendation shall be sent to any member unless the same shall have been agreed to by two-thirds of the members of the whole Committee, at a meeting of the Committee summoned for that purpose. And if such member does not resign within the space of one calendar month from the notification of such recommendation of the Committee, it shall be the duty of the Committee to expel him; provided also, that if the Committee present at such meeting are unanimously of opinion that the offence of such member is of so grave a character as in the interests of the Club, to warrant his immediate expulsion, the Committee, at such meetings, are hereby empowered to expel him from the Club. All expulsions, either under this Seection or Section XXXII. shall be final, unless twenty members of the Club shall, within

twenty-one days, demand an extraordinary general meeting to take the conduct of the offending member into consideration, and immediately on the close of such meeting a ballot for the restoration of the expelled member shall take place and be kept open for two hours. An auditor shall be annually appointed by the Committee, but shall not be a member of the Committee, and his duties and remuneration shall be settled by the Committee, and approved by the annual meeting in direct and explicit terms.

## BY-LAWS

1. The Club shall be open every day for club hours. the reception of members at 8 a.m., and shall be closed and lights extinguished at 12 p.m. except on Sundays, when the hour for closing shall be 11:30 p.m. But the Committee shall have the power to relax this rule on special occasions on such terms as they deem fit. It shall be the duty of the servants in attendance to announce the hour of 11 p.m. on Sundays and 11:30 p.m. on all other days, in each room then occupied by members, and all such members shall be required to leave the Club before the time fixed for putting out the lights under a penalty of $\$ 10.00$ per member. This rule shall apply to members sleeping in the house so far as the public rooms are concerned. The servants on duty at the time of closing the Club must, on pain of instant dismissal, report to the Secretary the names of members remaining in the Club after such time.
2. Canvassing for or against candidates for election on the Club premises is prohibited.

7. Any member breaking or injuring any article shall replace or pay the cost thereof to the Club.
8. No member shall, under any pretext, remove from the Club premises any book, paper or other article belonging to the Club, except in accordance with the House Rules which the Committee are hereby authorized to make for such purpose if they shall think fit.
9. No one but a member, subscriber or visitor within Sections XVIII, XXVII, XXVIII and XXXIV, shall, on any pretext, be admitted into the Clubrooms or supplied with any refreshments, or allowed to use or enjoy any of the privileges of the Club.
