DEER HUNTING IN THE NORTH.

Editor Tells of his Numerous and Varied Experiences While Searching for Game and Recreation in the Wilderness.

Early the next morning the whole party started for the south shore of the lake. The master of the hounds insisted on taking certain positions on the hills, which he had selected as the point of observation. Taking the old "punt" which started for the head of the lake which constituted a paddle of about one and a half miles against a head wind. Locomotion was very slow and when after placing the dome on his stand, and going on to his own position the historian was surprised on scaling the top of a hill nearly half a mile short of his rendezvous, he suddenly encountered Josiah who said in answer to the interrogation, why he was wandering around instead of putting out the dogs replied that he always liked to know that his subjects had obeyed and he concluded to come over and see if they were right before he put out the dogs. Just at nightfall the shore of the lake was reached about a mile below camp and a few hallos brought the machine agent with the ready for a good hearty supper. 
