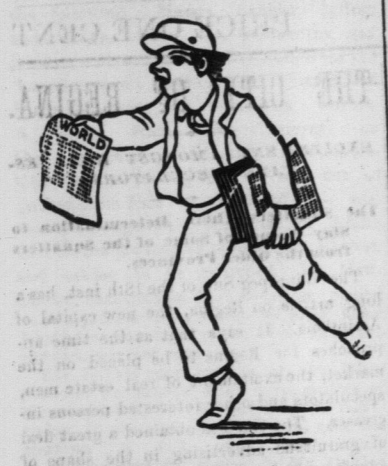

ABOUT COLONIZATION. Sir: My last letter to you appeared with several misprints. One of its sentences, which was reproduced in a reversal of its intended meaning, I beg leave to set right by going at some length into its subject—settlement and immigration.

An outflow of population goes on ordinarily from this province into the United States. The "boom" of federal clapnet had aggravated that drain so very seriously that a small counter current from the United States, to the contrary notwithstanding, the increase of population in this province during the ten years ending in 1891 is almost all the result of fact and of the special fact that notwithstanding the inflow of 253,000 immigrants the population of several of our counties shows for the ten years ended with the last census a startling falling off we are face to face with the question whether we shall consent that Ontario enter on retrogression or, to prevent that, infuse new energy into our agencies of settlement and immigration.
