



BUT SECLUDED GENIUS. How M. Taine, the Great Historian, Lives and Works.-The Inventor of Scientific

Criticism Not Without a Touch of Poe M Taine, outside his works, is certainly the least known and least accessible of the great men of the time. He has a horror of naving his privacy invaded, and carries his serve so far that he refuses to have a sperb portrait which Bonnat has just complated of him exposed in the Salon. The portrait is a Bonnat of the first style—pale and luminous. The entire man is there; the head somewhat narrow and elongated, crowsed by the well-developed forehead of the thinker; the light eyes behind his glasses; the short beard, slightly tapering, adding to the impression of the length of the head. A half smile, very mild, which, so to speak, is reflected in his eyes, lights up the countenance and takes away what, at first sight, one might be disposed to find there, a something decided, dry and hard; on the whole, the physiognomy suits this powerful genius—more penetrating than sympathetic, strong rather than charming, and which imposes rather than conquers.

Truly Taine is the inventor of that powerful machine called scientific criticism, a criticism immovable, inexorable, which in some way destroys individual liberty, making of man the simple product of precise and defined factors from which he can under no pretext disengage himself, such as race, and luminous. The entire man is there; EVERYBODY KNOWS THEY

and defined factors from which he can under no pretext disengage himself, such as race, epoch, surroundings; which classifies and labels all literary works like specimens in a museum of natural history; which seeks, above all, the law, and forgets, in its deairs



be bring all things into common, this element of difference which is felt, this vibration of soul to soul, this something which escapes and which constitutes genius.

Yet this systematist is at times an exquisite poet, and has in certain pages depicted nature as one who understands and profoundly appreciates her, bringing to his descriptions the warm shades and purple time which class him as the first writer of our time.

Taine's youth was most austere and laborious. Without fortune, he had to work, not only for his own livelihood, but also that of a mother whom he adored and surrounded up to her death with the most touching attention. Now that glory and success have assured him a fortune, the material pre-occupations of his early years have left in his mind a kind of vague disquietude; material questions do not rank as secondary in his mind, and one sees again as secondary in his mind, and one sees again and again the profound philosopher calculating very prosaically the percentage of such and such an investment, concerning himself about the economical crisis, not as a philosopher, but as citizen and shareholder.

holder.

During the early years of hard work Taine acquired that prodigious amount of varied knowledge which has enabled him to speak with authority on so many diverse subjects—literature, art, philosophy, politics, etc. At this time he read all that was possible to read and stored up his treasures. In 1855, Taine then being 25 or 26, appeared the "Philosopher Francais," then successively "La Fontaine," "La Literature Anglaise," "Le Voyage en Italie," "L'Intelligence." Between whiles, his position having improved and the future assured, apparently, he married the daughter of an architect of great talent, M. Dennel, and it may be said that the twenty-four years of that union—of which have been born a son and a daughter—have never been crossed and a daughter-have never been cros

In 1866 an author went to see Taine, Room carrying one of his works, which the mas-ter had willingly consented to look over. He was ushered into the room, and he per-The was ushered into the room, and he perceived Taine seated on the floor in tront of an armchair, on which sat a child of 2 or 3 years. "Pardon me," said Taine, without disturbing himself, "will you excuse me a minute? He will permit nobody else to cut his toe-nails?"

The baby was his nephew, Andre Chevrillon, who is now a man whose "Journey in India" made a great sensation on its appearance last year in the Revue des deux Mondes.

Taine adores children, and has some weak-

nesses. For instance, he loves cats, or rather dotes on them. It is no rare thing to find him sitting before the fire with Puss before an easy chair, where sleeps the lavorite Sultaga, addressing to her the wild-

His wife takes upon aerself the charge of the vineyard, the practical and profitable undertakings of every kind.
