### CARNIVAL ON THE STR.

Continued Rioting by Brooklyn Mob.

TROOPS FIRE ON THE STRIKERS

Comparative Peace Reigned All Day. Through the strikers' cut wires. At night the mobs grew more turbulent and bayonets had to be used. Cannon fired at the Car Barns—A Woman Killed by a Green Motorcar.

Brooklyn, N.Y., Jan. 21.—Violence and possibly bloodshed constituted the record of the eighth day of the Electric Street Railway operators' strike. Three militiamen are in hospitals with broken heads, two having suffered from the hands of riotous men and women, while the third was the victim of his own carelessness, having fallen out of a second story window. A score or more policemen are suffering from bullet wounds and contusions of the head or body, disabling them for the time being.

To what extent the rioters have suffered cannot be conjectured. At the various times, one of which was filled with policemen with drawn revolvers. The last two cars of the seven made a final attempt to make the run down town about 6 o'clock, but after going three blocks and meeting with the same reception as the others, they were turned back into the station, and all attempts to run cars for the night were abandoned. Serious trouble is looked for this morning.

230 Out of 1000 Cars Run. President Lewis of the Brooklyn Electric Company states that after a run of about 145 cars were running, an increase of 35 over the number running yesterday. When asked as to the protection afforded by the militia and police, he said that he was satisfied with the protection given by both.

In all, about 250 cars were moved today. The number in operation before the strike was 1000. In the 230 cars are included cars which did not start until 4 p.m., and which stopped at 6 o'clock.

On 28 of the tied-up lines no attempt was made to run cars during any part of the day.

Killed by a Green Motorcar. At 2:30 p.m., Mrs. Josephine Ziegler, 69 years of age, was run over by a green motorcar at Broadway and Broadway-street. She sustained a fracture of the hip and internal injuries. She is in a serious condition. The motorcar was arrested and locked up, but the driver was totally incapable of controlling the car.

To Kill the Pacific Cable. American Seamen Working for a U.S. Cable and on the Line of the Pacific. Washington, Jan. 21.—Recent events in the Hawaiian Islands have led to the advance of the modification of the Hawaiian treaty, so that the Canadian Government, or a company under its auspices, can obtain a lease of the Hawaiian Islands for the purpose of laying a cable from Seattle to Honolulu.

Three Ties on the Strikers. A car started from the Ridgewood station of the Brooklyn Electric Street Railway at 5 o'clock was assailed with volleys of stones and bricks from a mob of rioters, who were shouting and carrying on the announced intention of the street car companies to attempt to run cars on the line of the strike.
