## GANADIAN STAMPS.

WE notice in the Phil. Record for April there is a review of the catalogue of the collection of postage stamps, envelopes, \&c, in the Muscum of the Imperial Postof Berlin, in which there are suveral observations on some Canalian stamps which are inaccurate. We cannot do better than copy what the Record says about the matter. "On looking at the first issue for Canado, where the museum possess the imperforate 3 pence and 6 pence unused, and the 1 shilling used, we were struck by seeing that the portrait on the 6 pence was stated to be that of Lord Elgin, the pupular Governor-General of Canada from 1846 to 1854, contrary to tradition, which has assigned it to Prince Albert. We have searched for the grounds on which this tradition rests, and can find none ; and certninly to those who remember the Prince, bhe portrait no nore resembles him than that of the King of Siam, which figures on one of Messrs. De La Rue \& Co's latest productions. Nor do we think the uniform is one in which Prince Albert would appear, or the star one which he would wear. When we look at the next issue, the 10 pence of 1857 is said to be the portrait of Selastian Cabot, the discoverer of Canada in 1497, and not that of tise filibustering Breton Jacque Cartier, who sailed up the St. Lawrence as far as Montreal in 153., though, according to history it was not he who planted the Frencia flag first in Lower Canada, as this had been done eleven years previously by Verrazani. Here again the German compiler seems to have reason on his side."

Julging from this extract the Recorl seeminglv endorses the German author. We think, however, after reading the following official extracts from P. O. Dept. Reports etc., that they will not agree with the German riew of the matter.

In the report of the P. M. General for Canada for the year 1851 there is a copy of the following official order :
P. O. Department. (Order No. 4.)
P. O. Department,

Toronto, list April, 1851.
Stamps for preprayment of Postage on Letters.
"Postage Stamps are atout to be issued, one representing the beaver, of the denomination of 3 pence, the second representing the head of Prince Albert, of the denomination of 6 pence, and the thiril representing the head of Her Majesty, of the denomination of 1 shilling; which will shortly be transmitted to the postmasters at important points.

This should settle whose portrait it is, besides, according to Burkos Peerage, Lord Elgin was born in i811, so that at the time of the isshe of these stanps he was 40 years of age, the portrait on the stamps is that of a man of about 22 or 23 . If it does not look like Prince Albert it resembles still less the portraits of Lord Elgin, of which, from his great popularity many exist in Canada.

And now as regards the 10 pence, which the Record says was isuled in 18.57, but was really issued from 1st April 1855, as the P. M. General's report for that year will shew.
"To promote the general convenience in prepaying letters to Great Britain at the new rate, postage stamps of the value of 10 pence currencr equal to 8 pence sterling were procured and issued for sale." As for the portrait on 10 pence, it is identically the same as that of all the existing portraits of Jacques Cartier, and totally unlike those existing of Selaastian Cabot. The style of head dress, and the way the beard is worn is chat of the ,isteenth century instead of the fifteenth. There is a very rare and ohs print of Sebastian Cabot,taken from the original painting, in the possession of Charles Jost Harford Esq., in the Legislative Library in Halifax and anything more dissimilar to the face on the 10 pence stamp of Canada camot well be imagined. It, represents an old man with long forked beard and the round cap or bonnet of his time on the head.

The first North American Government notice of perforating is found in the following, from the Postmaster-General's report for 1857:
"Tc facilitate the prepayment of letters passing from Canada to England by the Canadian Steamers, a new stamp bearing value of 6 pence sterling or $7 \frac{1}{2}$ pence currency, being the Canadian Packet rate has been secured and put in circulation." This stamp was rendered necessary on account of the contract between the Canadian Government and the Allan Line of Steamers in regard to carrying the mails, ard by which contract the postage was reduced.
"A new stamp has also been introduced of the value of $\frac{1}{2}$ penny to serve as the medium for prepaying transient newspapers."
"Moreover the Department bas beer led by the increasing use of postage stamps, to take measures for obtaining the Canadian Postage Stanips on sheets perforated in the dividing line in the manner adopted in England to facilitate the separation of a single stamp from the others on a sheet when required for use."

The paper used in the 1868 issue of Canadian Stamps is found in various thicknesses and kinds. Apparently no care was used in selecting the paper used. A table is annexed of some of the most notable varieties:

May it please Your Excellency,-
We have had under consideration the memorandum of your Excellency of the 19 th inst., accompanied with the letter from the Postmasier General, resiguing his office and his seat in the Council, with the reasons he has assignel therefor.

Knowing from the discussions with Mr. Connell that he has prepared to retain his office and seat in the Council, if an order was made to issue
the stamps procured by him, including tine stamp bearing the likences of the head of the dupartment, we are therefore justified in concluding that the Minute of Council of the 8th inst, in which Your Excellency was advised to approve of, and oreler to be distributed the 1,10 and $10!$ cent Postage Stamps procured by the Postmaster-General, and to order a new; cent Postage Stamp to he struck, hearing the likeness of the Queen, intrad of the 5 cent stamp already procured by the Postmaster-General, is, mitwithstanding the other reasons assigned by him, the real ground of his resignation.

Without entering into the discussion of the powers of the different heals of departments, we observe that we have no desire to limit or circumserihe the legitimate authority of the Postmaster-General, or of the head of any other public department, and in advising your Excellency upon this question, we have not desired nor attempted to do so, as by the Act relating to the Post Oftice the approval of the Governor-in-Council is required to the issue of Postage Suamps.

Your Excellency is 'aware that no such order was made by your Excellency in Council, aithorizing the obtaining or issuing of the stamps. We admit the Postmaster General had the consent of his col!eagres to obtain decimal stamp*, bat they were procured and being distribated lwefore they were submitted to your Excellency in Council for approval, or leffire the impress they hore was known to the Council, and when submittel. it was the opinion of the Council that the 5 cent stamp should bear the likeness of Her Majesty.

We cannot discern how the Revenue of the Post Office Departnent will be affected by the action of the Guvermment, that must depend upun the extent of individual correspondence, and we do not helieve that there will be a single letter less written in consequence of such action.

As Mr. Connell has obtained your Excellency's permission to puldish his letter to your Excellency, we respectfully request Your Excellency will authorize the publication of this reply.

Sir,-In the Royal Gazette of the 23 rd instant, appears a memolanda mithout date, signed by your Excellency's advisers, and addressel to Your Excellency, in which is reviewed a correspondence. which I had the honor to submit to your Excellency on the 19 th inst The subject matter of that correspondence must be discussed at the proper time in another place, but as there are several points urged in the memoranda of your advisers calculated to create a false impression with reference to my reasons for resigning my plece at the Council Board, I am induced to trouble Y.,ur Excellency with this rejoinder.
1.-In the memoranda under notice, it is intimated that the real reason of my resignation was the refusal of my colleagues in the Government to advise your Fxcellency to issue the 5 cent Postage Stamp This statement I must unhesitatingly declare to be incorrect, and if evidence is wanting to prove the contrary I can refer to the Attomey-General, Provincial Secretary, and the Hon. Mr. Wark who were present at a meeting of Council on Tuesiday the 10th April, on which occasion on account of circumstances which then and there took place, I stated tl.at " I could not sit with men who acted as they did."

I am well aware that the Law reads: "The Governor-in-Council may cause stamps with their value thereon to be sold and issued as postage." The Minute of Council made in December last, if not perfected by the Attorney-General, whose duty it was to do so, cannot be regarded as my fault. I have fulfillec my duty, and did what I supposed I was fuliy authorized to do. At all events I have violated no law, and in the memorandum under consideration, it is admitted that $I$ had the consent of my colleagues to obtain the Decimal Stamps.
7.-As to the revenues of the Postal Departmen, at the end of the year when the returns are made up, the public will be able to arrive at a correct judgment.

## May it please your Excellency,-

The Committee of Council have lad under consideration your Excellency's memorandum of the 2nd instant, accompanied with a second letter from the late Postmaster-General, intended as a reply to our communica. tion to your Excellency of the 23rd ult.

We are convinced that in the preparation of both the papars subuitted to your Excellency by Mr. Connell, he has been influenced more by a desire to avoid the discussion of the real ground of his resignation than $t$ o represent accurately the policy and acts of his late colleagues in the Govermment.

In our former memorandum we stated to your Excellency that Mr. Connell had the consent of his colleagues to procure Decimal Postal Stamps; and we again assert that the Council were kept in total ignorance of the design upon the five cent stamps until after they were struck off and put in circulation.

Mr. Connell having published his second letter to your Excellency, we respectfully request your Excellency will authorize the publication of this our reply.

## SOUTH AUSTRALIAN OFFICIAL SURCHARGES.

MANY of our Philatelic friends have no doubt often been puzzled by the letters surcharged on the stamps of South Australia, previous to 1878, since which date they have only been printed $0 . S$, meaning on "Official Service." From semi-official information the following list has been compiled:

This, though not a complete list is nearly so. The values most commonly found with those surcharges are the 1d, 2d, 4d, 6cl, and 11.

Many of the values of the South Australian stamps are also found with ahole punched through them. Those punched stamps were for a long time supposed to have been those that were supplied for convict use, but this was a mistake as they were really for official use. They are now done array with.

## STAMPS OF EASTERN ROUMELIA.

THE constitution under which this Province was governed provided for a separate issuc of stamps. This for a long time the Turkish Government would not do, until they were fairly compelled to. When they did send them they sent a large amount of their own stamps of the 1876 issue of the value of 10 para O.S. with the surcharge of "Roumelie Oriental." These the Roumelian Government would not accept until assured by the Tukish Government that stamps for themselves were being made. A compromise was then made, the Roumelian Government accepting the stamps hut putting another surcharge of R. O. on the stamps.

The next lot sent was the same issue of Turkey surcharged as before, but in larger letters with "Roumelie Oriental." These the Rnumelian Government accepted seemingly without any objection. Later in the year
(1881) another variety of the Turkish stamps and of the surcharge was sent, they being this time the surcharged $\frac{1}{2}$ and 1 piastres of the Turkish 1.76 issue. They were surcharged for use in Roumelia with a long narrow $R$. O. printed somewhat sideway on the stamp. In March the Roumelian Government got their own stamp:, resembling the Turkish 1stif issue except in inscriptions, they being printed in Greek, Turkish, French, and Bulgarian.

The following is a correct list of those stamps, January 1881. Type of the Turkey, September 1876 issue surcharged "Roumelie Oriental" and " R. O." in blue.

1 piastre, yellow.
The next are those that were issued for Roumelia alone, and as mentioned before, are much like the Turkish stamps, but with inscriptions in four different languages.

Afyhanistan-The 1a., 2a., and 1r. come on white laid batonné paper. Austria-The current 10 kr . is printed on pale straw color paper.
Bahmas-There is a 1-2d. blue.
Brazil-We hear of an intended new issue, which will include unpaid letter stamps, envelopes of 100,200 , and 300 reis, newspaper wrappers of 20,40 , and 60 reis, post cards of 40 and $40+40$ reis.

British Basutoland-The I. B. J. informs us that the Cape of Good Hope stamps are surcharged fo: us here.

British Bechuanaland-There have been cinronicled two stamps of high value, $£ l$ and $£ 5$-both purple.

Canada-The 1c red brown, and the 3c. red of 1867 issue are found on water-marked paper. The 15 c . of the current issue is changed in color, reembling very much that in which it was first issued, only more of a buish tinge.

China-We have seen the 1c. green on yellow, and the 5c. bright rellow.

Columbia-There is a 2c. red, of the map series.
Confederate States-The $A . J$. of $P h$. illustrates an envelope "Ralcigh, N. C." in curve with "Paid" below. It comes on white and buff:

Cuba-The P. J. of A. notes the 20 c . lilac grey.
Ecuador-The stamps surcharged "Official" seem to be frands.
Eaypt-Le T. P. says that the lpi. envelope is to be issued in a smaller size, also 2 pi. envelopes, and newspaper bands.

Formosa-What this Chinese Botany Bay wants with special stamps we are unable to say, and we are equally ignorant whether they are for postage purposes; but we have just received some stamps $30 \times 31 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{~mm}$, with a dragon in the upper part, and a horse running to the left in the liwer, all on a horizontally-lined ground, enclosed in a frame, in the upper part of which is Formosa, and in the lower China, with inscriptions in Chinese on the side. In each angle is " 20 ." They are typographed in sheets of 9.5 ( 5 rows of 5 ), and we have them both in red and green. They are manufactured by Messrs. Bradbury Wilkinson \& Co, whose names appear on the foot of the sheets. They are typographed on thin plain white paper, are gummed and perforated $1+\frac{1}{4}$ by a guillotine machine. Probably by next month we may be able to learn more of their history, as aliso whether they are essays or stamps, and whether for postal or revenue purposes. Phil. Record.

Great Britain-The 1 1-2d, of 1886 is surcharged "Govt.-Parcels."
Hungary-Mr. Rechert has shown us a new series of stamp, resembling the current issue. The 1 kr . is black, the others have a groundwork
of vertical colored lines and figure of value in center in black. Skr. nuanct and orange, 12 kr . brown and green, 15 kr . rose and blue, 24 kr . purple aid rose, 30 kr, green end brown, : 0 kr . red and orange, 1 fl . blue and silver, 3 Hl . red and goll. The color mentioned last is that of the lines.

India-The 12 anna, inseribed "India Postage," is printed in brownon vermillion, and the current 2 annas is surcharged
H. S. M.

Martinique - The 20e. has been "surcharged "01"-" 05 "—or " 15 " with "Martinique" above.

Mauritias-The $P h . R$. notes the 2 c. card surcharged " 2 cents." (Hardly necessary.)

Mexico-Several of uur exchanges chronicle the 2c. red, surcharged.

St. Christopher-We have a 2 1-2d. surcharged "ONE" and a pen line through the original value. It was first issued without this line and in smaller type.

Inited States-Two more 10c. envelopes are out, No. 8 on white and amber. Also of the Sept. 1887 issue: 4c. No. 8, white and amber; No. 9. buff and blue; 5c. No. $\overline{5}$, buff and blue; 30 c. No. 3, buff and hlue; No. $\ddagger$ 1-2, manilla and amber manilla; No 8, all six papers; No. 8, white an! amber; No. 9, buff and blue; 90 c. No. 7, white, amber manilla, amber manilla; No. 8, white and amber; No. 8, buff and blue.

Venezuela-The various lithographed stamps not being satisfactory a new supply has been ordered in New York, both "Correos "and "Escuclas."

## NOTES.

We have received from the publisher Mr. C. A. Townsend, Akron, Ohio, a copy of his Am. Stanp Collectors Directory. It is very much superior to the ordinary directories that have been seen before this. We would recommend any of our friends in need of such a work to apply for one as soon as possible, as it is not likely they will be on hand very long.

The Am. Journal of Philately comes out very strong and gool in June on the stamped ervelopes of the U.S. In the stamps of Peru one of the surcharges, that of Huacho, looks to us as if the taxing stamp of some Peruvian Post Office had got on the stamp instead of the envelope. Anr. way what is the connection between the letter $T$ in a circle and Huacho?

The Stamp Collector's Figaro is out somewhat late, but the contents which are very good make up for it.

Tue Toronto Philatelic Journal for June is to hand, with its usual intahments of C. P. A. reports, ribbon advertisements, " Gleanings of the alobe," newspaper notes-patent medicines and gun advertisements.

The Amsterdam Philatelic Society have secured a grand addition to their body in the election of Mr. J. R. Hooper of Ottawa, well and widely known for his thorough and extensice knowlerlge of Philately. We congratulate our I utch compatriots on his acquisition and have no doubt that many of their collections will be enriched by his magnificent stock of duplicates.

Mr. Craig's letter is very much to the point in regard to the poor quality of the Exchange sheets sent in by members.

We have also to thank the publishers of the "Nederelandsch Tydschrift voor Postzegelhimde " for specimen leaves from Koning's Permanent Stamp Album.
