

GOVERNMENT IN PERFECTION.

There has been a great deal of speculation in the American newspowers, on the cause of the sudden dissolution of the late Jackson cabinet. No c. respiracy had been discovered to burn the capitol or to biow up the union, in which the President and his official helpers could take different sides—no new expedition had been planned or projected against the Indian tribes, in which the conscience or humanity of ministers could dead them to dissent from their chief—and neither the alcoholiton nor the increase of the tariff duties on foreign manufactures had been brought forward as a boos of contention.
