As this is impossible, however desirable, we strongly recommend every circuit to make it a consideration of the utmost importance to be fully represented in our annual Conference. We will doubtless leave this place wiser and better men, more encouraged, and better prepared to enter upon the glorious work assigned us by the great head of the church. Our religious services have been seasons of refreshing from the presence of the Lord.

The stationing committee have succeeded in meeting your wishes as circuits far beyond our most sanguine expectations. For this we wish to express our devout thankfulness, trusting that each minister has found his providential field of labor. We recommend them to your prayers and hearty co-operation. Give them your sympathy and support, without which their

usefulness must be greatly curtailed.

Be diligent in your attendance upon all our means of grace, remembering that the path of duty is the only one in which you can expect to be safe.

Remember that one foe within is more dangerous than an hundred without. Do not err in supposing that rank and wealth are essentially necessary in building up the church. Christ did not choose the rich and great to found the church.

Guard against too much change. Never plant your stand-

ard where you do not intend to stand by it forever.

Know your enemies and guard against them, viz: Popery, Ritualism, Intemperance, etc., etc. Above all things cultivate personal piety. Have a place and time for secret prayer. Let no family be without a family altar, around which all may gather morning and evening to worship the God of our fathers. Cultivate toward all men the kindliest feeling, especially those who are attached to any branch of the Christian church, if they give proof of the genuineness of their faith.

Finally, brethren, never think of ceasing to labor until you cease to live. If you ever feel discouraged, go to the word of God, and read the promises recorded there, remembering that

they are all yea and amen to those that believe.

ADDRESS OF THE CANADIAN CONFERENCE TO THE ENGLISH CONFERENCE.

BELOVED FATHERS AND BRETHREN, -
